

From the Pastor's Office

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we come to the end of the Church's year, the readings at Mass take on an ominous tone. They talk about the end of the world. Last June, I referred to the fact that there is a mysterious comet coming towards the earth. Parishioners laughed at me for mentioning it. Now that this baby is coming closer to us, scientists are paying attention. Why didn't anyone listen to me??? There are suggestions that maybe this is not a comet at all, but an alien spaceship. I confess I am a little bit concerned. I don't want to live out the script of "Independence Day." I don't want the aliens to attack the earth. When some

of these out-of-life experiences come to visit it is only natural we all feel a little bit vulnerable. The disciples asked Jesus questions after He made them all scared. "All that you see here – the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." My natural instinct is to feel scared. We are not masters of the universe as we pretend to think. The world evolves and shifts and moves and we are on board ship trying not to get seasick. I remember during the days of Covid. Will we ever forget? I came into the office when the whole world was locked down and maybe a couple of staff came to join me. How do we move forward when the world feels scared? It occurred to me. I

decided that the best thing to do, since I am the captain of the ship, was to steer my ship on a course and slowly but surely



move forward, one day at a time Sweet Jesus. That carried us through the danger and eventually we came out on the other side. The world is full of danger. The aliens are coming to get us. Now is the time to steer our ship and move forward. Now we must lean on Jesus and let Him guide us on. In His company we feel safe.






