

From the Pastor's Office

1st Sunday of Advent

Because we are creatures of habit, at this time of the year, like every other time of the year we comment, "Is it Advent already? Where did the year go? It seems like it was only vesterday we were celebrating Christmas." At the turn of the Liturgical year it all comes as a shock. We get to glimpse that we live in a kind of a daze. Whether we like it or not it is here. Because we are creatures of habit we will revert back to our usual patterns. Once again the stress levels begin. We start thinking about rooting out the Christmas trees and the decorations. The Mall will be packed from now on. Must buy some Christmas cards. Must buy some presents. We kind of hate the season coming into Christmas, but we kind of love it as well. Every year we tell ourselves that this time we will properly prepare for the coming of Jesus. 
forget we will be asking people to come and help us. Every year you promised and every

Happy New Liturgical Year!

Today is the first Sunday of Advent, a day on which we focus on God's message of hope. As followers of Jesus, we imitate Him. Jesus was always hopeful and spread the gift of hope to others. Our hope is in God and in the coming of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

As we come to the end of the Jubilee Year of 2025, the theme for which Pope Francis gave us as "Pilgrims of Hope," we are offering the following opportunities to celebrate a hope-filled Advent at St. Catherine's:







Since 2002, 2,371 cities have joined the campaign.
