

From the Pastor's Office

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Liturgy

Ordinary Time

As we spend a few weeks in Ordinary Time, until Ash Wednesday when the Lenten season begins, we'll look at some of the "ordinary" areas of our church. One of these "ordinary" areas is the narthex. When you enter St. Catherine's Church from outside, you are standing in the narthex. If you need landmarks, the information tables and announcement monitors bookend our narthex on the east and west, with the Baptismal Font and the Paschal Candle (when it isn't placed at the altar for use in liturgy) in the middle. In the early Church, the narthex was an area for those who were not yet admitted into the Catholic Church. Now we use it as a gathering space prior to and after Mass, and as an overflow area when the pews are filled during Mass or when your child becomes so filled with the Holy Spirit that their energy can't be contained by just sitting.



"The boys both know kids who have special needs, they committed to making an effort to talk with them and help them out. We have committed to using bento boxes for school lunches and not use single serving plastics."


50 Years Connecting Catholic Social Thought and Public Life: Lessons from John Carr's Leadership - January 21, 2026

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Greetings in our Lord, Jesus Christ!

On January 24-25, I have asked our parish priests to participate in our sixth annual *Called by Name Sunday*. God has always known each one of us by name and has given us a particular call to follow. *Called by Name Sunday* is, first, about listening and, then, responding to God's call.

Next Sunday's readings center on the theme of vocation. I have asked our priests to share their own vocation story during the homily. As you listen to the Word of God proclaimed at Mass and reflect upon the priest's vocation story, please consider the following:

1. If you are discerning your life's vocation, be open to God's call to the priesthood or consecrated life. God's calling is a beautiful gift – be courageous and open to his call! Jesus came that we might have life and have it to the full – do not be afraid! If God is calling you to the priesthood or consecrated life, be open to the invitation; you will not be disappointed.
2. Please think of men and women you know and believe might have a calling to the priesthood or consecrated life. While God is the one who calls, he often uses our voices. Please help us reach out to these individuals and come next weekend prepared to share their name(s) and contact information so that a letter of encouragement can be sent to them.

Brothers and sisters, with God's blessing and your help, we can make *Called by Name Sunday* a great success. May all of us listen to God's call and follow where he leads. Be assured of my prayers for you as we continue to strengthen a culture of vocations in our diocese.
