From the Pastor's Office

5th Sunday of Lent

The story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead is the great knockout punch. As we ascend to Calvary, we have passed through various milestones along the way. We have visited with people like the Blind Man, the Woman at the Well. All of their encounters with Jesus were life changing events in their lives. Today is the knockout punch. The story is told in a very dramatic way. Jesus holds back. He is in no hurry to get to Lazarus. For the miracle to have the great effect, everyone must know for certain that Lazarus is dead. From a distance Jesus must have known that Martha and Mary were crying out for Him. By now they must have thought that Jesus didn't really care for them at all. If He really cared, He would have been there immediately. They sent Him word. Jesus

knew that Lazarus was dying. He never came. In order to get to Martha and Mary, Jesus had to walk through a forest of hostile stares and resentments. Over there the Pharisees stand delighted to witness His failure. Let's see Him get out of this one. The whole scene is actually set up by Jesus. He knew what He was walking into. He doesn't get a pass by being the Messiah in this situation. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." That message is for the rest of us. Even when all seems lost, we must never give up. Whatever you ask of God, God will give you. I am not sure how true that is because I have to test it. Anyway, the great scene is presented to us. I always see this scene as like something from a movie. I can hear the Director telling everyone, "places

everyone." They all stand in their place. Jesus stands before the tomb of Lazarus and there is complete silence. Then the words boom out across the valley, "Lazarus, come forth." Time stands still and we all hold our breath. Then the miracle of Lazarus appears in front of us. That is not possible. We all knew that he was dead. Are you telling me that now he is alive? I don't believe it. If I didn't see it with my own eyes, I wouldn't have believed it. All of this is lovely for the people of Bethany, but now it is time for the Pharisees to arrest Jesus. We have seen enough. He has walked all through the land doing his miracles upsetting people and we will have no more of it. Chapter closed.

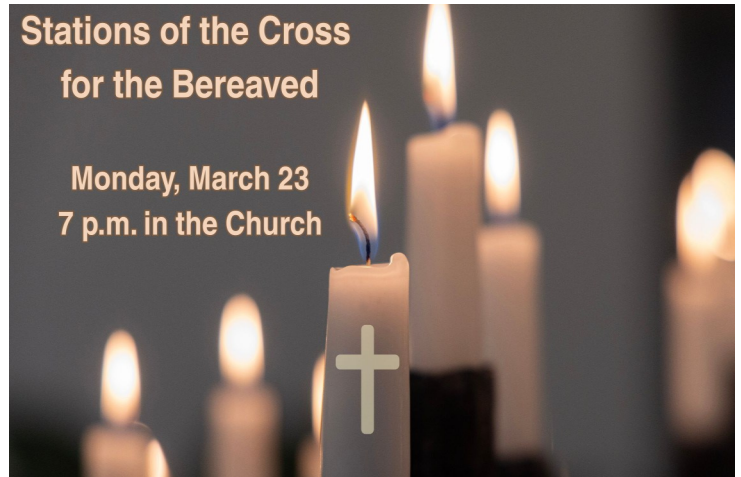

The Way of the Cross for the Bereaved - Monday, March 23

Curley, The Way of the Cross for the Bereaved presents the story of Jesus' passion and death as a source of consolation and hope in times of grief following the loss of a loved one. Join us for this special journey with the Stations at 7 p.m. in the church on Monday, March 23.

Stations of the Cross

Join us on Friday nights of Lent at 7 p.m. for Stations of the Cross. Mass follows immediately after the Stations for those who wish to remain. We also have Stations of the Cross outside on the grounds for you to walk and pray in private prayer.

Fasting and Abstinence During Lent

On the Fridays of Lent, it is the obligation of practicing Catholics from age 14 onward to abstain from eating meat. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of both fasting and abstinence. On days of fasting, Catholics between the ages of 18 - 59 are permitted to eat one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. On days of fasting, refrain from eating between the permitted meals.

Blessing of the Easter Foods: Honoring the Eastern European custom, we will bless baskets of Easter Foods in the Day Chapel at 9:30 a.m. on Holy Saturday, April 4.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY was established by Pope Saint John Paul II in the year 2000. The feast, which falls on the Second Sunday of Easter, recognizes the abundant mercy offered to us through Jesus. John Paul II understood the Resurrection as the "miracle of mercy" which "radically changed humanity's destiny." At St. Catherine of Siena, we will celebrate on Sunday, April 12, at 2:30 p.m. in the Church with adoration, scripture, silent prayer, benediction and the singing of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy – all in just over an hour! All are welcome.

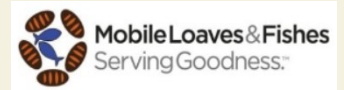
CRS Rice Bowl - Embracing God's Love, United in Generosity

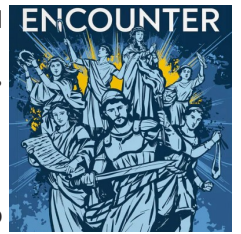

Total Consecration Rosary and Mass - March 25

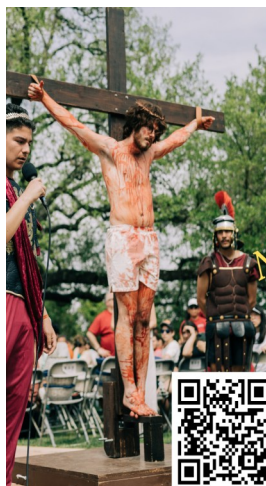
In Fatima, Our Lady said, "My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."
