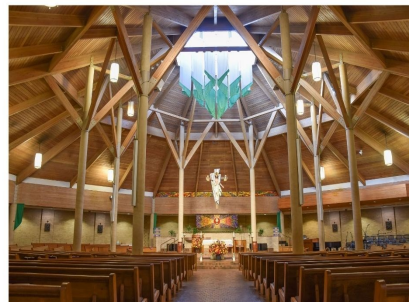

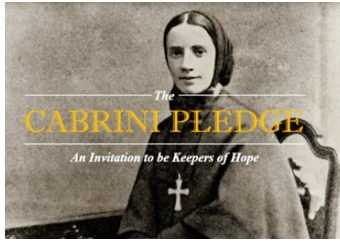

The Cabrini Pledge

Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini, an immigrant from Italy, was the first American citizen to be canonized a saint. She faced discrimination but faithfully served with tireless zeal her fellow immigrants and those on the margins of society. The Cabrini Pledge witnesses to the God-given dignity of every person, and those who take the pledge commit to



finding a way forward that is rooted in mercy, justice, and the common good. To sign this pledge, go to usccb.org/CabriniPledge.

I PLEDGE:

To affirm, in word and deed, the inherent dignity of every person, regardless of immigration status or country of origin, seeing each as a child of God before all else.

To engage with Scripture and the Church's social teaching, reflecting on the role of migration in salvation history, the history of the United States, and the history of my own family.

To listen and learn about the circumstances facing migrants and refugees, including those in my community, with an open heart and mind.

To seek opportunities for encounter, so as to grow in deeper understanding and communion that leads to an authentic solidarity with those in need.

To consider what it means to be a good neighbor and how I am called to reflect the love and hope of Christ to others.

To encourage civic dialogue that places the human person and the sanctity of families at the center of policymaking, especially toward the end of meaningful immigration reform.

To join with Pope Leo in praying for all migrants and refugees as fellow travelers on the journey to our true homeland.

Spiritual Adoption - First Month

Your spiritually adopted baby has been quite active during this first month of growing. Already your baby is 10,000 times bigger than at conception. Your baby has developed the foundations of her brain, spinal cord and nervous system by the 20th day. Her heart began to beat 18-21 days after conception. Her heart is pumping blood through her own circulatory system and her blood type can be different from her mother's. Your baby is just ¼ of an inch long.

Liturgy

This Sunday's Readings - 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle A

Jesus tells us to forgive one another from the heart.

First Reading: *Sirach 27:30—28:9*

Those who seek God's mercy must be merciful toward others.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 103:1-4,9-12*

A song of praise to God who is kind and merciful.

Second Reading: *Romans 14:7-9*

We belong to the Lord.

Gospel Reading: *Matthew 18:21-35*

Jesus teaches that we must forgive one another as God has forgiven us.

Sunday's Gospel reading directly follows last week's Gospel in which Jesus taught the disciples how to handle disputes and conflict within the Christian community. In today's reading Peter asks Jesus how many times one ought to extend forgiveness to another. Peter proposes a reasonable number of times, perhaps seven. Jesus replies by extending Peter's proposal by an enormous amount; not just seven times should one forgive, but 77 times. The parable of the unforgiving servant is Jesus' elaboration of his initial reply to Peter. Through the parable we come to understand the depths of God's mercy toward us and the results of our acceptance of God's forgiveness.

In honor of St. Francis of Assisi, the Blessing of the Animals will take place on Saturday, October 3 at 9:30 a.m. in the Courtyard. St. Francis wrote, "All praise to you, O Lord, for all these brother and sister creatures!" He knew that the bond between person and pet is like no other. Bring your cats, dogs and other pets for a short prayer service and special pet blessing. Please arrive early!

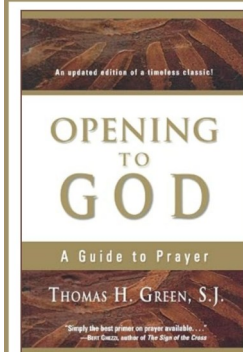


St. Catherine's Children's Choir

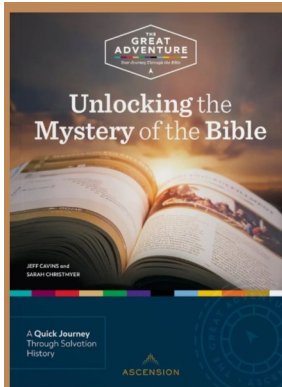

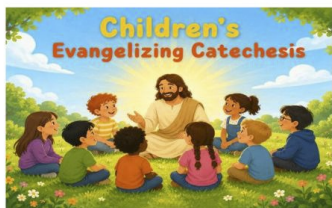

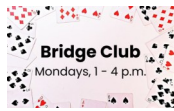
In order to enroll children into any of our programs, the following must be complete:

1. Families must be [registered parishioners](#) at St. Catherine of Siena Catholic Church.
2. At least one parent **must** complete the [Ethics in Ministry \(EIM\)](#) program through the Diocese of Austin. This parent will be required to help out in the classroom at times during the year. EIM certification is good for three years.
3. Copies of your children's baptism certificates need to be turned in to the Faith Formation office if your child is preparing for a sacrament and we do not already have one on file. These can be turned in to [Marti Salas](#) (marti.salas@stcatherine-austin.org).

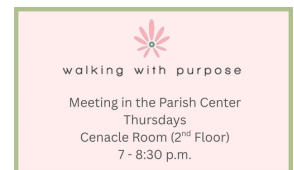

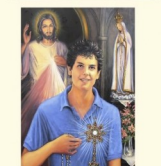
