

SOMETHING NEW IN CHRIST

Jesus knew that the Scribes and Pharisees were trying to trap him. They put Him in what seemed to be a no-win situation. Let the woman who was caught in adultery go, and He would have been accused of ignoring the law. Let her be stoned, and He would fail to show mercy toward her, contradicting His life's message. Jesus' response teaches three crucial lessons: none of us is free of sin; we are not the ultimate judges of others: Jesus is the mercy of God, in whom we can always trust. In Christ, God does something new. When we give our hearts to Christ, we have the hope of new life, a life in which mercy reigns.

Holy Week Schedule Passion (Palm Sunday) ~ April 10

On this weekend, the Church celebrates Christ's triumphal entrance into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. We commemorate this event through the blessing and distribution of palms at all Masses for Sunday.

The Triduum Holy Thursday ~ April 14 The Mass of The Lord's Supper at 7:30 p.m.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is a multicultural celebration in our parish. The parish hall will be especially decorated to receive the Blessed Sacrament which will be carried there in procession for adoration on the Altar of Repose. The parish hall will be opened until 11:00 p.m. for adoration, prayer, and reflection.

Good Friday ~ April 15 The Service of the Passion

The Good Friday service consists of three parts: the Reading of the Passion, the Veneration of the Cross, and the Service of Communion. The Church will be open for private prayer from 11 a.m. until 2 p.m.

The Great Vigil of Easter April 16 at 8:30 p.m.

The principal and most important Mass of Easter begins with the blessing of the new fire. New water will be blessed for the baptism and sprinkling rite. The Elect and Candidates will be joyfully received into the Church and a reception for them will follow in the parish hall.

On the above Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there will not be any other events, i.e. no Masses nor Confessions.
