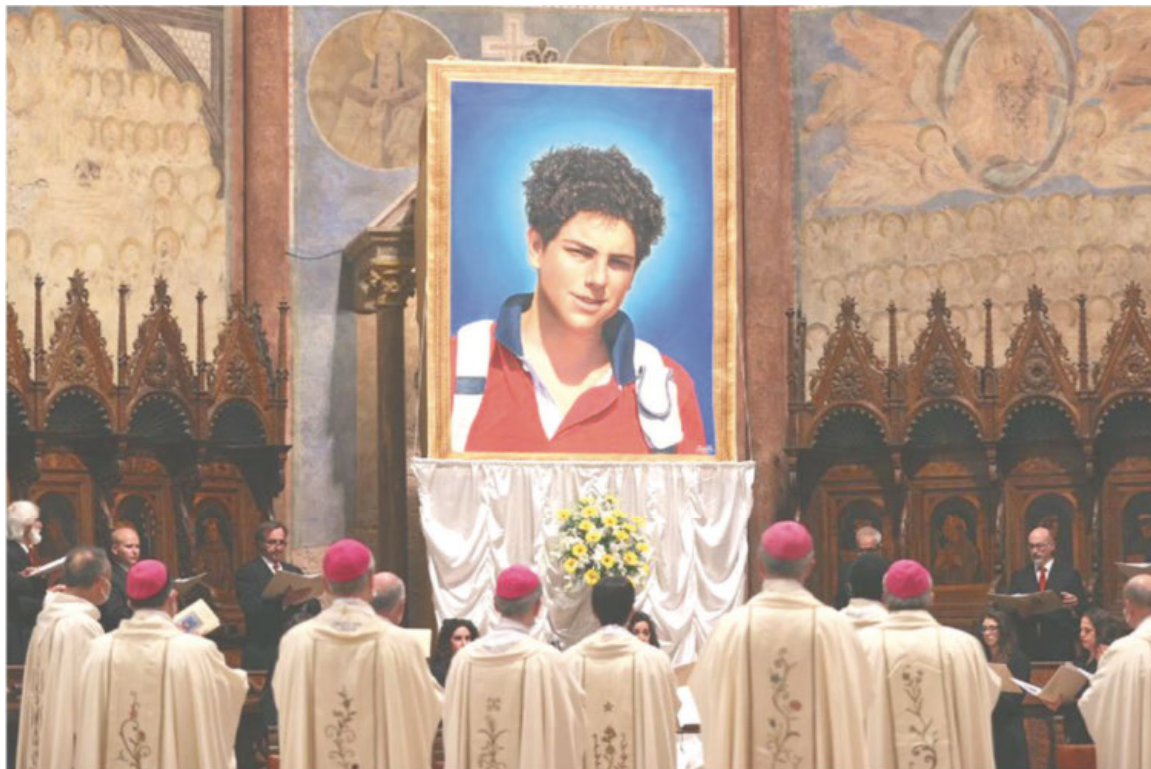

NOTES FROM FR. ROGER **MENSAJES DE PADRE ROGER**

Carlo did much of his work in his last year of life. In early October 2006, at fifteen, Carlo was diagnosed with acute pro-myelocytic leukemia. Right after that, Carlo's health got worse quickly and shockingly. He received the sacrament of the anointing of the sick on October 10, 2006. The next day, he went into a coma. Carlo died on October 12. He had wanted to donate his organs, but the leukemia had ruined them.

Incredibly, in only one and a half decades and just weeks after his diagnosis, a teen who had set his world on fire for Christ was gone. He was an original, not a photocopy. And while his life for Christ was brief, through the grace of God he did so much for so many.

The calls for Carlo to be recognized as a saint came almost right away. For Carlo's family and friends, this was a bit of a surprise. They had known he was an extraordinary young man, but seeing the countless people who had been touched by Carlo's witness moved them. Some were classmates whose families had gone through divorce. Carlo had supported them with prayer and kindness. Others were people who had fallen on hard times, and Carlo had used his own resources to provide food and blankets. Still others had been affected in a positive way by his eucharistic miracles project.

In 2013, the Congregation for the Causes of Saints of the Catholic Church formally recognized Carlo Acutis as a Servant of God, meaning that the people who look into the lives of possible saints could proceed. That same year, a boy in Brazil who had been suffering from a pancreatic disease was miraculously healed after his mother prayed for Carlo to intercede (step in). The proposed miracle was sent to the people in charge of investigating Carlo's cause for sainthood. After experts in medicine and theology approved the case, the proposed miracle was approved on February 21, 2020. That meant Pope Francis could beatify him. Carlo Acutis had spent countless hours online telling people about miracles. Now, officially, he had participated in one!

The ceremony beatifying Carlo took place in his favorite town, Assisi, on October 10, 2020. He is now called "Blessed," putting him one step away from sainthood in the Catholic Church. One more miracle that is credited to his intercession is needed first.

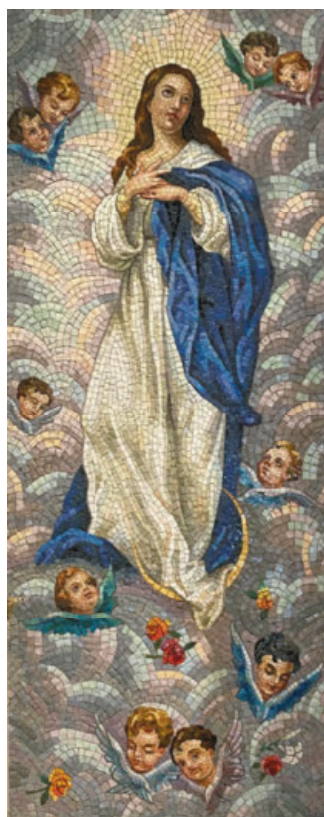

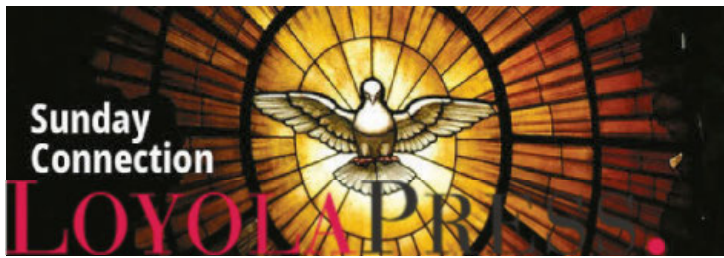

A DOOR OF HOPE

In the fall of 2022, the Monsignor Grant Council held a baby item drive at Saint Elizabeth Church. The parishioners of Saint Elizabeth donated baby clothes and items valued at more than \$2,000 that were donated to A Door of Hope on Lancaster Pike in Wilmington. A DOOR OF HOPE Pregnancy Center is a faith-based, medical facility operating under the direction and supervision of a licensed physician. Through the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council's Aid and Support After Pregnancy Program, Monsignor Grant Council was granted \$400 to present to A Door of Hope for their mission. On July 26, 2023 Father Roger and Larry Gardner presented Rachel Metzger, Executive Director the check. Rachel and her staff gave a presentation on how the center uses Ultrasound Machines to help pregnant women hopefully make decisions to carry their child to birth. Rachel also showed the area where the baby items are stored and displayed for mothers to pick from. Monsignor Grant Council would like to thank the parishioners of Saint Elizabeth Parish for the donations to the baby item drive and also the special collection held last year to help the Knights of Columbus who donated three ultrasound machines to Delaware pregnancy centers in 2022.





This Sunday's Readings

First Reading: *1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a*

The Lord appears to Elijah in a whisper.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 85:9-14*

The Lord is the source of salvation.

Second Reading: *Romans 9:1-5*

Paul speaks of the blessings that have come to the Israelites.

Gospel Reading: *Matthew 14:22-33*

Jesus walks on water, and the disciples acknowledge him as the Son of God.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel directly follows last week's account of Jesus feeding a crowd of more than 5,000 people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. For the sake of the crowds, Jesus had postponed his time of solitude. Now, at last, Jesus finds some time for quiet and prayer. He sends his disciples ahead of him by boat, dismisses the crowds, and then withdraws to the mountain to pray.

The disciples do not fare well. They struggle to weather the wind and waves, making little progress in their journey. We are reminded of a previous story in Chapter 8 of Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus calms the seas. This time, however, Jesus does not calm the seas, and the disciples do not express fear until they see Jesus walking toward them on the water. In this story it is not the storm that is feared but the sight of Jesus before them, whom they mistake for a ghost.

Clues like these suggest that this story is about the disciples' growing understanding of the identity of Jesus. In continuity with last week's Gospel about the feeding of the multitude, today's Gospel is also about what the disciples' faith in Jesus will enable them to do. In last week's Gospel, when the disciples see the crowds, they ask Jesus to send the crowds away. Jesus turns the situation around, telling the disciples to feed the crowd with the provisions that they have. Both of these Gospels tell us much about ministry.

Jesus calls to the disciples and calms their fears. He is not a ghost. The impulsive Peter seeks proof that the person is indeed Jesus. He asks Jesus to call him out onto the water, and Jesus grants this request. Peter's fear and doubt overtake him, however, once he is walking on the water. Jesus reaches out to Peter and saves him. When Jesus and Peter enter the boat, Matthew reports that the wind ceases, and the disciples confess that Jesus is the Son of God.

Faith in Jesus will enable the disciples to do the work that Jesus has done. Peter walks on water. The five loaves and two fish feed a multitude of people. The disciples can and will participate in the work of the kingdom of heaven. When Peter fears and doubts the person of Jesus, however, he falters. Peter's example teaches us that true Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah, God's only Son.

Family Connection

The mission of the Church is to continue the work of Jesus. The family, the domestic church, participates in this mission too.

Talk about how your family participates in the mission of the Church. Discuss ways in which you seek to reach out to your neighbors and people in need through acts of kindness, mercy, and justice. Then read together today's Gospel, Matthew 14:22-33. Talk about how Peter wanted to be like Jesus, to walk on water like Jesus did. Note that Peter was successful for a time, but then he doubted Jesus, and he began to sink into the water. Talk about how your family's acts of mercy and justice are rooted in your faith in Jesus. Pray together that Jesus will continue to work through your family to prepare the kingdom of heaven. Pray together the Morning Offering or the Lord's Prayer
