7:15 am, 12:15 pm and 6 pm.
Please try to attend with your families and children.

All Saints' Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, the Feast of All Saints, the Feast of All Hallows, the Solemnity of All Saints, and Hallowmas, is a Christian solemnity celebrated in honor of all the saints of the Church, whether they are known or unknown.

From the 4th century, feasts commemorating all Christian martyrs were held in various places, on various dates near Easter and Pentecost. In the 9th century, some churches in the British Isles began holding the commemoration of all saints on the 1st of November, and in the 9th century this was extended to the whole Catholic Church by Pope Gregory IV.

In Western Christianity, it is still celebrated on November 1 by the Roman Catholic Church as well as many Protestant churches, such as the Lutheran, Anglican, and Methodist traditions. The Eastern Orthodox Church and associated Eastern Catholic and Eastern Lutheran churches celebrate it on the first Sunday after Pentecost. The Syro-Malabar Church and the Chaldean Catholic Church, both of which are in communion with Rome, as well as the Church of the East, celebrate All Saints' Day on the first Friday after Easter Sunday. In the Coptic Egyptian Orthodox tradition, All Saints' Day is on Nayrouz, celebrated on September 11. The day is the start of the Coptic new year.

The diversity of the Catholic Church in its celebration of the dates of Feasts and Solemnities is amazing and life-giving for local communities of faith.

Padre Serra Says...

As a lay person, you can serve the Church in several ways. Your vocation could include service at the diocesan or parish level, as a director of religious education, as a church musician, or as an administrator of social services. If you want to do volunteer work, such service is usually for a year or two in a mission of the Church either in the United States or overseas.

In addition, the Catholic Church has restored the order of permanent diaconate. A deacon is a man 35 years of age or older, married or single, who serves the people of God in the ordained diaconal ministry. His ministry is liturgical (preaching), sacramental (except Eucharist and Penance), pastoral and social. To find out more about all three types of service, contact the diocesan chancery in charge of each type of service.



Pastoral Planning Parish Survey

In May 2023, Bishop Koenig began a pastoral planning process for the parishes and schools of the Diocese of Wilmington: *United in Christ*. Having been our bishop for two years, he has travelled throughout our diocese and, through the Synod listening sessions, has heard from representatives of each parish. He has also met with and had extensive discussions with the priests of the diocese. These conversations led to the pastoral planning process, including this survey of all parishes in our deanery.

Where will this pastoral planning lead us and what is the desired outcome? Throughout this letter [United in Christ] I have used the word vibrant several times. I believe this word precisely describes what we are looking for in our parishes, schools, and Diocesan ministries. To say that our ministries will be vibrant means that they are spirit filled, alive, and adaptive to the everchanging needs of those they serve.

The first Catholic church in the City of Wilmington was established in 1816—the Cathedral. Many other parishes were later established to serve our Catholic population, with the most recent poised to celebrate its 100th anniversary next year—Saint Anthony of Padua. Since then, to say our parishes have changed greatly is an understatement. We no longer walk to our neighborhood church, with many of us driving in from the suburbs. In that time, our congregations have decreased in size. In the past 15 years alone, our Sunday attendance has dropped by more than half! And in the past 30 years, the number of priests serving our churches has as well, not to mention the fewer religious and retired priests available to fill in when our priests are sick or away.

We're profoundly grateful for the diligent efforts of so many faithful and dedicated people over the decades, but much of what we've known and always done is no longer as effective as it once was in handing on the faith. Sadly, the "way we've always done things" might now regrettably inhibit rather than serve the Church's unchanging mission and the formational needs of people today. Rather than "doubling down" on once effective but now inadequate models and strategies from a previous era, it is time for us, to courageously "cast into the deep" by letting go of of some of the ways we have done things up to now—as challenging as it can be for all of us—so that with God's help we might reimagine and realign our parish ministries, programs, personnel, and other resources for the sake of evangelization, discipleship, and mission in our increasingly post-Christian culture and city. This is especially true if we are going to fulfill more faithfully Jesus' mandate to "Go make disciples" in the present as well as build a healthier and holier reality to leave for future generations.
