For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. (U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops)

THE PASTOR'S PEN

Greetings in Christ Jesus!

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus goes into the temple and upsets the money-changers' tables. He drives the cattle and sheep out with a whip, along with the people who sold them. Away with the caged pigeons.

This was a prophetic act. The authorities knew this instinctively. They did not get Jesus arrested, or arrange for Jesus to get beaten up by the security. The authorities asked, 'What sign can you show us?'



There were three parts to the temple, the innermost courtyard for Jewish men, then the courtyard for women, and outermost, the courtyard of the Gentiles, the non-Jews. This marketing occupied at least part of the courtyard of the Gentiles.

By throwing the merchants out, Jesus was restoring this courtyard for the use of the Gentiles. So, Jesus may have been symbolically clearing up what was widely perceived as a corrupt business practice and restoring a more reasonable business culture.

However, the cleansing of the temple is much more than correcting corrupt business practices. It is about allowing non-Jews to worship along with Jews. This was the expectation of the coming of the Messiah so that all would worship the one true God.

Symbolically Jesus cleanses the temple and allows Gentiles to worship. But at a deeper level it is Jesus who by his passion, death and resurrection allows Gentiles and Jews, men and women into the temple which is his own body so that all might be saved.

The true temple of God is not any building, however beautiful, however ancient, however long and expensive it has been to build. No, the true temple of God is God's holy people, baptized into his death, redeemed by his precious blood. We are God's holy temple.

Indianapolis, Indiana, July 17-21, 2024

What is this event?

The National Eucharistic Congress will be held in Indianapolis, Indiana from Wednesday July 17th to Sunday July 21st. This will be a gathering of Catholics from across the United States to witness our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The Diocese of Crookston has a block of hotel rooms and tickets still available for this event and will be taking a bus for adults who do not wish to fly or drive themselves. The Bishop of the Diocese of Crookston, Andrew Cozzens, is the national chair of the Eucharistic Congress.

Schedule

Tuesday, July 16th, Crookston or Moorhead, Minnesota: Bus Departs: For those who wish to take the diocesan bus, you will be able to load in Crookston or Moorhead Minnesota in the morning and the group will spend the night in South Bend, Indiana. The cost of the bus will be \$250 plus your room accommodations in South Bend (we are negotiating for a block of rooms).

Wednesday, July 17th, Indianapolis: All members of the Diocesan delegation will check into hotels and receive your entrance tickets for the Congress. The Congress will begin at 7:00 am with Bishop Andrew Cozzens opening the Congress with a procession of Christ in the Monstrance entering Lucas Oil Stadium.

Thursday, July 18th: Speakers on this day include Fr. Mike Schmitz, Fr. Rocky Hoffman, Julianne Stanz, Trent Horn, Sr. Mary Grace Langrell, Dr. Edward Sri, Cardinal Dinardo, and Fr. Leo Patalinghug among many others.

<u>Friday, July 19th: Speakers include Sr. Josephine Garrett, Jason Evert, Dr. Hosffman Ospino, Damon Owens, Meg Hunter-Kilmer, Dr. Mary Healy and Archbishop Gustavo Garcia-Siller among others.</u>

Saturday, July 20th: Speakers include Bishop Robert Barron, Gloria Purvis, Dr. Tim Grey, Curtis Martin, a Eucharistic Procession, music by Matt Maher among other speakers.

<u>Sunday</u>, <u>July 21</u>*: The Congress will conclude with an address by Chris Stefanick followed by the closing Mass with the papal delegate. The bus will depart for Moorhead immediately after the Mass and will drive through the day and into the night until arriving back in the diocese.


