# PERIOD OF INQUIRY (PRE-CATECHUMENATE)

This is a period of exploration, in which seekers - especially the unbaptized - encounter the message of the Gospel and are invited into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, through the Catholic Church.

#### PERIOD OF THE CATECHUMENATE

This is a time of apprenticeship as unbaptized seekers (Catechumens) and non-Catholic Christians (Candidates for Full Communion) learn the teachings of the Catholic Church, begin to live the fundamentals of Christian life, and continue on a path of conversion accompanied by their Sponsors.

#### PERIOD OF PURIFICATION AND ENLIGHTENMENT

This is a time of intense spiritual preparation. Catechumens (now called "the Elect") and Candidates for Full Communion journey through the season of Lent with our parish community; they focus on cultivating a spirit of repentance and a desire to encounter Jesus Christ through the grace of the Easter Sacraments.
