
In this example, there was a large group class on September 15. After that session, our example family (who has a 5th grade student) will read and review chapters 2, 3, 13, and 15 at home. After reading a chapter, families will complete the online "Interactive Chapter Review" for that lesson. We'll go through how to do that later on in this How-To. For now, let's look at another example from later in the year:

January 19	Unit Three: Moral Life Chapter 17	Chapters 21, 22, 24


Some months, there will not be any work at home. In the example above, there is no "Work at Home" for November. In December, families will be reading together from the "What Catholics Should Know" supplement at the back of the book. These supplemental chapters DO NOT have Interactive Chapter Reviews, so your family will simply read and discuss this material. In January, we are back to our regular material, including Interactive Chapter Reviews.

The link will take you to a page that has resources for all grades K-8. Our example family has a 5^{th} grader, so they will click "Grade 5" on the page to access their specific resources:




At Home Editions


The "At Home Editions" of each Unit give you lesson planning tools to help you read and review the chapters at home:



Each "Part" lines up with the units we cover in our large group session. Let's look at the Unit 1: The Creed At Home Edition.




You'll notice the At Home edition begins with chapter 1 – looking back to our Class Outline, you can see that our example 5th grader already reviewed Chapter 1 in class, so our family can scroll down to the second lesson in the PDF for chapter 2:



Interactive Chapter Reviews


After reading and reviewing Chapter 2 with our 5th grader, let's complete the Interactive Chapter Review! Scroll down on the Grade 5 page past the At Home Edition, and you'll see each review listed by chapter:



Just like before, we can skip the review for Chapter 1, since this was covered in class. Click the link for the Interactive Chapter Review for Chapter 2 as indicated by the arrow:



You'll be welcomed to the Review with a landing page that looks just like the one on the left. Click "Begin" and get to work answering questions!




Answer questions normally – need a hint? If you mark the incorrect answer, the program will help narrow down your choices and prompt you with the correct answers.


Interactive Chapter Reviews (continued)
