From the Desk of Father Raaser

In St. Luke's Gospel, as our Lord was sending out the 72 disciples, He told them that the laborer is worth his wage, to eat and drink what was set before them. From that moment on, even unto today the clergy depend on the goodness and generosity of their parishioners, family and friends for their care and maintenance. In the early Church, people would share their food with the priest as well as bread and wine for the Mass, which was taken up at the Offertory of the Mass. The washing of the hands of the priest at Mass started as a practical routine. In Africa today and other poorer nations, the people still bring food for their priests.

One of the other ways of supporting the clergy was to give an offering (stipend) to the priest whenever he offered the Mass for the people. Over the years, a particular Mass was to be offered for the intentions of the giver.

It is very important to know that the person who has offered the stipend has not "bought a Mass," the Mass is obviously impossible to buy. The power of the Mass brings forth much grace and something the Church calls the "fruits of the Mass." Everyone who attends the Mass receives grace from the Mass, those who are prayed for by the laity, the altar servers, lectors and ministers of Communion receive special fruits from the Mass. The priest receives special graces as well as the person whom the Mass is offered. The power of the Mass is not restricted to one person, so it is terribly inaccurate to say, "this is my Mass." Any Catholic may offer up the Mass in which he or she participates for any good intention. Certainly, graces will accrue in accordance with the intensity of that person's participation and sincerity.

Because the intention is essentially a spiritual act, its publication in word or print neither adds nor subtracts from the graces received. There is no requirement in Church law to mention the intention at the Mass. Thus, a mention in the bulletin is a legitimate option.

Publicly announcing the intention is done for the comfort of the living and not for the benefit of the dead. God doesn't need a priest to mention the name for the fruits of the Mass to be applied to the person. God knows for whom the Mass is offered, He knows the intention of the giver and He knows the priest is offering the Mass for the intention.

Our parish publishes the Mass intentions for the week in the bulletin. The intention is mentioned at the beginning of the Mass on weekdays, and on Sunday, the name is mentioned in the Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful). In Christian charity, we pray for the person or the particular intention along with our own personal intentions.

It is not liturgically correct, to insert the name in the Eucharistic prayer, as this insert is reserved only for Funeral Masses. Another time this is done is at a Nuptial Mass, when the newly married couple is prayed for in the Eucharistic prayer.

Sometimes, mishaps can occur when a name is not mentioned. In this case it is enough that the priest celebrated according to the intention of the donor. If the wrong name is mentioned, then our parish will reschedule another Mass for your intention, if you wish. Priests, secretaries and bulletin companies are human. It is not the end of the world if the name is not mentioned, and there is no need to get upset if this happens, God takes care of our human foibles. I know it is comforting to hear the name of your loved one, but sometimes humanity gets in the way.

I don't like to see people get upset leaving Mass because of a human mistake. Just remember the graces and the fruits of the Mass are applied to the person, whether their name is mentioned or not.

When priests are ordained and before his First Mass, the new priest makes two habitual and perpetual intentions: to offer the Mass by consecrating the bread and wine to be consecrated into the Body and Blood of Jesus, and to offer the Mass for the intention given. He makes those intentions once and for all.

Another column can be devoted as to why we need to offer Masses for our loved ones, especially those who have died.




