LITURGICAL MATTERS

OTHER LITURGICAL MINISTRIES: This catalog of specialized roles might give the impression that those who are not exercising one of these roles are free to sit back passively and simply let the Liturgy happen around them. Nothing could be further from the truth. Those who come together for Liturgy do not have the luxury of acting as spectators, waiting for all to be done for them. "Full, conscious, and active participation" in the Liturgy (as commended by the Second Vatican Council) is not only their right but also their duty and their responsibility. That responsibility includes full engagement throughout the liturgical celebration. The baptized faithful who form the congregation are called to join in praise and thanksgiving in song and spoken word, to listen attentively to God's Word, and to exercise their baptismal priesthood in prayer for the Church, the world, and all in need during the Prayer of the Faithful.

FROM: "By any measure, natural family planning is a winner" by Archbishop Joseph
Naumann. [...continued from last week] One of the ways in which many oral contraceptives achieve their high effectiveness rate is through a secondary mechanism that does not prevent fertilization, but makes the lining of the uterus hostile to the implantation of a newly conceived embryo. These oral contraceptives do not always necessarily prevent pregnancy, but may actually cause a very early abortion of a newly conceived human life.. [to be continued...]





From the Code of Canon Law (the law of the Roman Catholic Church) ON THE TEMPORAL GOODS OF THE CHURCH

can. 1283 Before administrators take office:

- 1° they must take an oath before the ordinary or his delegate that they will be efficient and faithful administrators;
- 2° they are to prepare, sign and subsequently renew an accurate and detailed inventory of immovable goods, movable goods, either precious or of significant cultural value, or other goods along with a description and appraisal of them;
- 3° one copy of this inventory is to be kept in the archives of the administration; the other, in the curial archives; any change whatever which the patrimony may undergo is to be noted on each copy.
