### 6 November 2016

### **Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

What is heaven like? Is it an absence of pain and suffering? Is it an eternity of transcendent joy? A fulfillment of our deepest human longings? The grace of seeing God face to face? A continuation of the life we knew on earth?

The Sadducees, who did not believe in eternal life, looked to trap Jesus in an argument about the afterlife. So they raised the possibility of the most pitiable woman one could imagine. A childless woman married seven times to seven brothers, one after the other, with each of them dying and leaving no children to support or comfort her. Because there were no sons to support her, each brother, faithful to Jewish law, marries his brother's widow so that she might have some measure of security. In all of this, was she loved? Was she treasured? Or was she a burden grudgingly received and duly borne? The Sadducees conjure the image of this woman and say, "Riddle us this, Jesus... with everyone dead, whose wife, cook, caregiver, housekeeper, servant, and sexual partner will this woman be in heaven?"

But Jesus, as he so often does, turns their question inside out. "The resurrection is not what you think" he says, informing them that they are missing the truth altogether. The Sadducees crafted the question from their belief that if there was an afterlife, it would be an endless state of "more of the same", this life played out on an eternal stage. But Jesus insists that not only will there be a resurrection, but that eternal life and heaven will be radically and profoundly different.

In this world, people marry and remarry and love and hate and grow old. We live out our earthly lives encountering a range of experiences: birth and death, disappointment and triumph, barrenness and the joy of new beginnings, and the pain of loss and separation. But despite the significance of these moments, Jesus challenges us to see that our eternal lives will be something else, that our existence will be wholly changed, completely unique, and filled with more grace than we can imagine. Jesus is putting us on notice that the afterlife is not merely an extension of this life. All will be transformed in ways we cannot yet contemplate. And the barren woman? Perhaps most shocking for the Sadducees, in eternity the woman who "belonged" to all the brothers by marriage will belong to no one. She will take her rightful place as a beloved child of God and sister in Christ.

The Sadducees wanted to trip Jesus up—to lay a messy legal knot in his path and then watch him stumble. What they received in turn, was an invitation to step beyond the limits of what they thought they knew and see eternity through the eyes of possibilities—to place their whole trust in God the Father, master of life and death. Questions like: "What will the resurrection be like? What is heaven? Will I see my loved ones? Will we still be family?" are real and profound. They emerge from our love for this life and the relationships and deep connections we form during our lives. Yet, even as we ask them, Jesus reminds us that our questions are too small. For we too, like the Sadducees, must place our whole trust in God the Father, master of life and death, who out of love for his creation, has created for us an eternity far greater than what we can imagine.
