Pastors Place

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, also known as Corpus Christi Sunday. The central act of our faith is the Sunday Eucharist, and from there everything we believe originates and is ordered towards. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

1324 The Eucharist is “the source and summit of the Christian life.” “The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch.”

1327 In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: “Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.”

To deny the true presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is a grave sin and heresy. The Church has always taught the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist. Besides the teachings of the Lord at the Last Supper, the Bread of Life Discourse (John 6), and St. Paul in First Corinthians 10:16-17 and 11: 23-27, all the writings on the Eucharist beginning with St. Ignatius of Antioch (martyred 103 A.D.) have taught that Jesus is truly present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist.

When we participate in Holy Communion, each of us becomes a living tabernacle. Like Blessed

Mary Ever Virgin, we carry within us, the living God! When the priest or bishop consecrates the bread and wine, both are transformed into the Eucharist. The bread is no longer bread, and the wine is no longer wine. It becomes the Body and Blood of the Lord, even as we sense bread and wine when consuming it. The essence changes but the appearances of wheat and wine remain! So while we sense wheat and wine by smell, taste, and touch, the essence of its wheat-ness and wine-ness changes into the Eucharistic Lord. It may look and feel like wheat and wine, but, in fact, it's become the Divine Lord Jesus Himself. What an astounding mystery! This is the basis of the theology of transubstantiation.

I can go on and on with this, but due to the lack of space in the bulletin I will leave it here. So today, brothers and sisters, let us recommit ourselves to a loving devotion to the Eucharist, which is the “...source and summit of the Christian life.”

Procession- Next year I'm hoping to have a Eucharistic procession that connects both churches. There are 12 miles between the two, so walking there would be impossible. But maybe we can process in Pawling, and then travel by car to Dover Plains to complete the procession.

Sacred Heart of Jesus Enthronement

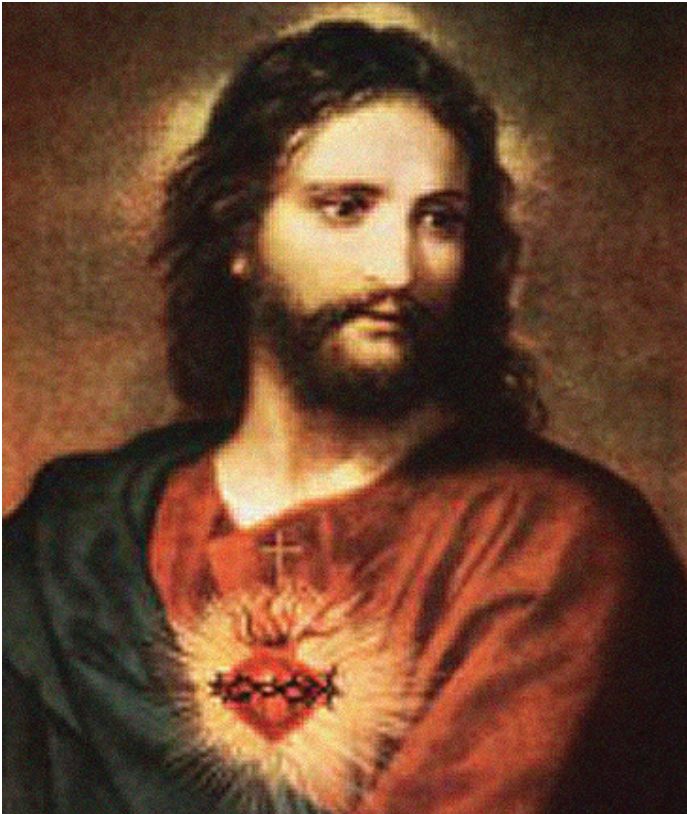
Each Friday immediately following the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, Holy Mother Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

This simple, yet profound devotion began with Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque (Feast day October 6), a young nun with the Order of the Visitation in Paray Le Monial, France.

Beginning December 27, 1673 and lasting for the next year and a half, St. Margaret Mary received private revelations and mystical encounters from Jesus and His desire for a devotion to His Sacred Heart. The Lord revealed to the saint the Twelve Promises to those devoted to His Most Sacred Heart. (These are listed below.)

It's encouraged to enthrone one's home, office, school or parish to this honor. On Sacred Heart Friday I am planning to do just that. We will have adoration in the usual manner immediately following the daily Mass. Then, at the beginning of adoration I will offer the prayer of consecration and enthrone our parish to the Sacred Heart. It's open to all parishioners who would like to participate in it. I hope to see you there.

The 12 Promises of Jesus to Those Devoted to His Sacred Heart

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their families.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of their death.
5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
9. I will bless the homes where an image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the power of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be effaced.
12. The all-powerful love of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; My heart shall be their assured refuge at that last hour.
