Priesthood Sunday

RCIA PROGRAM

Who Belongs in the Catechumenate (RCIA)?

Unbaptized children ages 7 through 12 and unbaptized teenagers ages 13 through 17. These children are to be enrolled in the catechumenate process and are to be fully initiated at the Easter Vigil receiving all three sacraments of Christian initiation from a priest.

Unbaptized adults ages 18+. These adults are to be enrolled in the catechumenate process and are to be fully initiated at the **Easter Vigil** receiving all three sacraments of Christian initiation from a priest.

Baptized Catholic teenagers and adults who seek preparation for their first holy communion and confirmation. These Catholic teenagers and adults may participate in the catechumenate process and may receive their confirmation and first holy communion during the Easter season from a priest.

Baptized **Protestant teenagers and adults** who seek to become Catholic. These Protestant teenagers and adults may participate in the catechumenate process and are to make their profession of faith and receive their confirmation and first holy communion **any time of the year** from a priest.

Who Does Not Belong in the Catechumenate (RCIA)?

Baptized **Catholic children ages 7 through 12** who seek preparation for first holy communion. They are to prepare through a sacramental program offered by a Catholic school or parish religious education program.

Baptized **Catholic teenagers and adults** who already received their first holy communion and are now seeking the sacrament of confirmation. They are to prepare through a sacramental program offered by a parish or the archdiocese. They are to be confirmed by a bishop.

THE CHURCH DOES NOT COLLECT UNSOLICITED DONATIONS OF ANY GOODS.

Recently people have been leaving their old holy cards, rosaries, holy pictures, old clothing, and even kitchen utensils at the churches. While I understand everyone's need to find a place where these can be of use, 99% of the time they get thrown away.

Here is some information that may help you.

- When a religious organization is looking for a donation, they'll usually send a rosary, prayer card, or holy card pictures along with their solicitation. The cards and holy pictures can be thrown away. But if you uneasy in throwing an unblessed rosary away, then may I suggest you bury it. Do not feel guilty doing so. There's no sin when you do. These organizations should never send blessed items in the mail to entice donations since once an item is blessed it should never be sold or used as a solicitation.
- To prevent further contact from these organizations, it is best to send a small donation to them with a letter requesting that your name be removed from their mailing list. Also request that your name be removed from any list being sold to other organizations. (Yes, they can do that legally, and they usually do.)
- Old clothing and household items such as utensils, pots and pans, etc., can be donated to either the *Pawling Resource Center* or the *Center for Compassion in Dover Plains* or *The Pawling Methodist Church Thrift Shop*. Please do not leave them here at the church since we cannot use them, and they will be discarded.

Again, I understand the sentiment and desire to give these to a person in need, but the parish has neither the need for these items nor the staff to redistribute them. It's best to donate them to one of the area organizations that help the poor.

Good News Reflection

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time August 29, 2021

Honoring God with our hearts

In the Gospel reading this Sunday, Jesus chastises the Pharisees for honoring God only with their lips while their hearts were far from him; love was missing from their analysis of whether or not Jesus and his disciples had sinned when they disobeyed a Jewish rule about cleanliness.

The rule was more important to them then the person. They had the self-righteous attitude of: "I know better than you, and I am better than you, proven by the fact that I obey the laws that you're breaking."

Obedience, when motivated by a self-righteous adherence to rules, is hypocrisy. It uses the law as an opportunity to feel superior to others. A modern example might be when someone tells a priest that he is sinning because he isn't adhering exactly to the norms for Mass as prescribed in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal. If he or she doesn't stop to understand why the priest believes the adaptations are allowable and pastoral, who really is the sinner?

When this happens, "in vain do they worship me," Jesus says. The meaning of the Mass has been lost.

There is a hierarchy of rules and laws. Some rules change with the needs of the times. Of greatest importance are the Commandments of God, the Moral Laws, which never change. All of them are supposed to help us on our journey to heaven.

It is right to speak up when we witness disobedience, and we *should* do it, but only because we care about the sinner's spiritual growth and only when we can handle it without ignoring or overlooking the reasons behind the disobedience. We are most successful in guiding others into greater holiness when we take the time to first understand the roots of their disobedience and then address those concerns with love.

This is how we become, as the second reading says, "doers of the word and not hearers only", because, as James adds, "pure" religion is caring for others. The Pharisees in the Gospel story didn't care about the hunger of the disciples.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How do you know when you're being hypocritical in your faith? How do you handle the discovery that you've done something uncaring?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

Give an example of a Moral Law and an example of a regulation that was instituted by the Church to address a specific need for a specific time. How do they differ in importance? Name one of the 10 Commandments or a teaching of the Church and explain how it became an opportunity for you to become more like Christ.

Honrando a Dios con nuestros corazones

En la lectura del Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús reprende a los fariseos por honrar a Dios sólo con sus labios, mientras sus corazones estaban lejos de Él; faltaba el amor en su análisis de si Jesús y sus discípulos habían pecado cuando desobedecieron la regla judía acerca de la limpieza.

La regla era más importante para ellos que la persona. Tenían la actitud farisaica de: "Yo sé mejor que tú, y yo soy mejor que tú, demostrado por el hecho de que yo obedezco las leyes que ustedes están quebrantando".

La obediencia, cuando es motivada por una adhesión farisaica a la normativa, es hipocresía. Utiliza la ley como una oportunidad para sentirse superior a los demás. Un ejemplo moderno puede ser cuando alguien le dice a un sacerdote que está pecando porque no se está adhiriendo exactamente a las normas de la Misa según lo prescrito en la Instrucción General del Misal Romano. Si él o ella no se detienen para entender por qué el sacerdote cree que las adaptaciones son admisibles y pastorales, ¿quién es realmente el pecador?

Cuando esto sucede, "en vano me honran," dice Jesús. El significado de la Misa se ha perdido.

Hay una jerarquía de normas y leyes. Algunas reglas cambian con las necesidades de los tiempos. De mayor importancia son los Mandamientos de Dios, las Leyes Morales, que nunca cambian. Todos ellos son para ayudarnos en nuestro camino al cielo.

Es correcto hablar cuando somos testigos de la desobediencia, y *debemos* hacerlo, pero sólo porque nos preocupamos por el crecimiento espiritual del pecador y sólo cuando podemos manejarlo sin ignorar o pasar por alto las razones detrás de la desobediencia. Somos más exitosos guiando a otros a una mayor santidad, cuando nos tomamos el tiempo para entender, primero las raíces de su desobediencia y luego hablar de esos temas con amor. Así es como llegamos a ser, como dice la segunda lectura, "practicantes de la palabra y no tan sólo oyentes", ya que, como añade Santiago, la religión "pura" es el cuidado de los demás. Los fariseos en la historia del Evangelio no se preocuparon por el hambre de los discípulos.

Preguntas para la Reflexión Personal:

¿Cómo sabes cuando estás siendo hipócrita en tu fe? ¿Cómo manejas el descubrimiento de que has hecho algo sin amor?

Preguntas para Compartir la Fe en Comunidad:

Da un ejemplo de una Ley Moral y un ejemplo de una regla que fue instituida por la Iglesia para atender una necesidad específica durante una época específica. ¿Cómo difieren en importancia? Nombra uno de los 10 Mandamientos o una enseñanza de la Iglesia y explica cómo se convirtió en una oportunidad para que pudieras parecerte más a Cristo.


