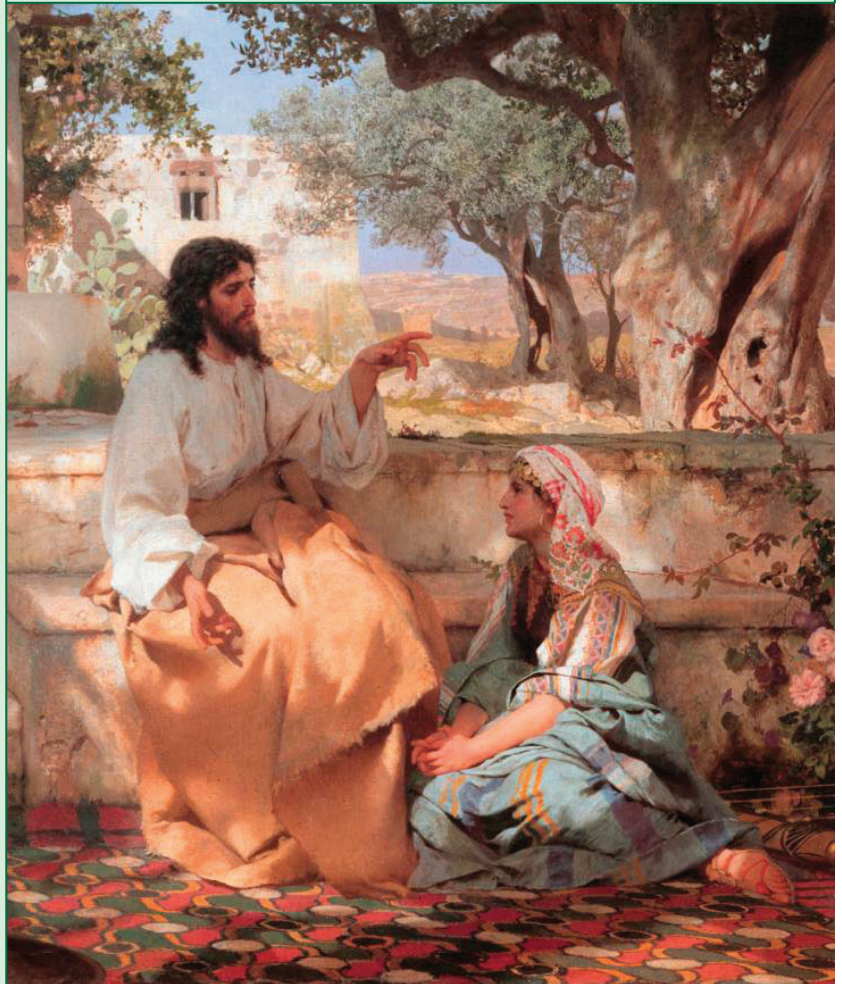

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water to refresh themselves. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name. Paul hopes that through his sacrifices, many people will become complete in Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.

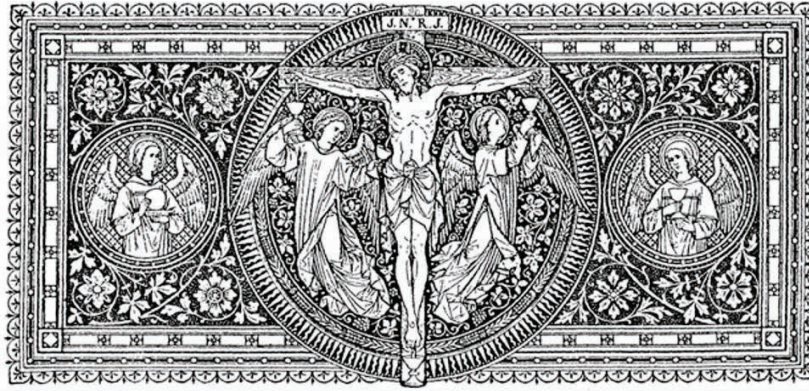

If you are not married in the Church and have a civil marriage license or are cohabiting with someone who is not your spouse, you should rectify the marriage issue before receiving the sacraments. 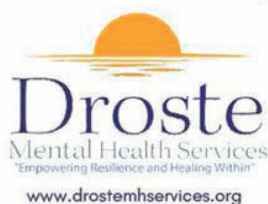

Vencer la tentación con la gracia en acción

Cuando llega la tentación, la primera línea de defensa suele ser simple: decir “no” o evitar la situación por completo. Pero cuando eso no basta, existen estrategias más profundas y comprobadas que pueden ayudarnos a responder con gracia y fortaleza.

Primero, piensa en la tentación como una oportunidad para la santidad. Dios siempre nos da una elección, y cuando le decimos “sí” a Él y “no” al pecado, Él responde con aún más gracia. Si hay otra persona involucrada, ora por ella. Ese pequeño acto de caridad no solo agrada a Dios, sino que desarma al enemigo. Como dice la Escritura: “*Resistan al diablo, y él huirá de ustedes*” (Santiago 4:7).

Segundo, no te limites a resistir la tentación — reemplázala.

Tratar de no pensar en el pecado muchas veces nos lleva de regreso a él. En lugar de eso, sigue el consejo de Filipenses 4:8: concéntrate en lo que es verdadero, honorable y bueno. Por ejemplo, cambia el chisme por palabras que edifiquen a los demás, o reemplaza un mal hábito por uno santo.

Finalmente, no subestimes las pequeñas victorias. La fidelidad en las cosas pequeñas nos fortalece para enfrentar batallas más grandes. Decir la verdad en una situación de presión, mostrar paciencia en el tráfico o cumplir una promesa entrena el alma para los momentos más difíciles. “Puesto que fuiste fiel en lo poco, te confiaré lo mucho” (Mateo 25:23). La gracia se construye sobre el esfuerzo. Aprovecha bien cada momento.

de las Escrituras

Lucas 11:1-13, El Padre Nuestro es una escuela de oración

Si alguna vez pensaste: “Quiero aprender a orar mejor”, este pasaje es para ti. Aquí, Jesús enseña a sus discípulos el Padre Nuestro. En realidad, es una oración que contiene cuatro en una. Primero, es una oración de alabanza y gratitud a Dios. Segundo, es una súplica pidiendo lo que necesitamos. Tercero, pedimos perdón y la fuerza para perdonar.

Finalmente, es una oración de reconocimiento de la providencia de Dios. Nos hace admitir que Él sabe lo que es mejor para nosotros. Al elegir

seguir Su voluntad, incluso cuando no coincide con la nuestra, depositamos nuestra confianza en Él.

Dios siempre responde a las oraciones. Usualmente con “Sí,” “No,” o “Espera... tengo algo mejor.” También, Él quiere ver que estamos comprometidos con lo que pedimos. Como el vecino en esta lectura, Jesús nos anima a ser persistentes, seguir pidiendo ayuda, buscar Su voluntad y estar abiertos a Su gracia en nuestra vida.

evitaría el fuego del infierno.

18 de julio – San Camilo de Lelis (1614). Nacido en la Italia del siglo XVI, San Camilo buscó la santidad a pesar de graves dificultades, incluyendo adicción al juego y mal carácter. Después de perder todo en el juego, fue contratado por franciscanos. Al ordenarse sacerdote, fundó junto a otros la orden de los camilos, dedicada al cuidado de enfermos graves, prisioneros y víctimas de la peste.

31 de julio – San Ignacio de Loyola (1556). Ignacio pasó varios años defendiendo su país natal, España, lo que le causó heridas graves. Durante su recuperación, experimentó una conversión religiosa y dedicó su vida a la educación. Escribió ejercicios espirituales y fundó una comunidad de sacerdotes conocida como la Compañía de Jesús, o los jesuitas.

¿Podemos consolar a Jesús?

Si vieras a un amigo muy cercano sufriendo profundamente, no pasarías de largo pensando: “Ya se le pasará — estoy ocupado.” Lo dejarías todo, correrías a su lado y le preguntarías: “¿Qué puedo hacer?” Esta es la lógica — y el amor — detrás de consolar el Corazón de Jesús. No es solo una tradición piadosa; llega al centro de nuestra fe.

Jesús es verdaderamente humano: sintió emociones reales — alegría, tristeza, traición, dolor. Él comprende nuestro sufrimiento, y nosotros podemos compartir el suyo. Y siendo también verdaderamente Dios, está fuera del tiempo. En el Huerto de Getsemaní, vio no solo cada pecado, sino también cada acto de amor, arrepentimiento y fe. Eso significa que tu amor hoy realmente puede consolar Su Corazón en Su Pasión.

Incluso actos pequeños de amor — una palabra amable, una oración, un momento de arrepentimiento sincero — lo tocan profundamente.

Fiestas y celebraciones

9 de julio – San Agustín Zhao Rong y compañeros (1648–1930). Esta fiesta honra a San Agustín Zhao Rong, un soldado convertido en sacerdote católico, y a sus compañeros mártires, formando un grupo de 120 cristianos chinos y misioneros católicos, incluidos niños, adolescentes, religiosos y obreros. Fueron canonizados por el Papa San Juan Pablo II en el año 2000.

16 de julio – Nuestra Señora del Carmen (1251). La Santísima Virgen se apareció a San Simón Stock en Inglaterra, llevando el escapulario marrón, signo de su favor hacia la Orden Carmelita, y prometió que quien lo llevase hasta la muerte

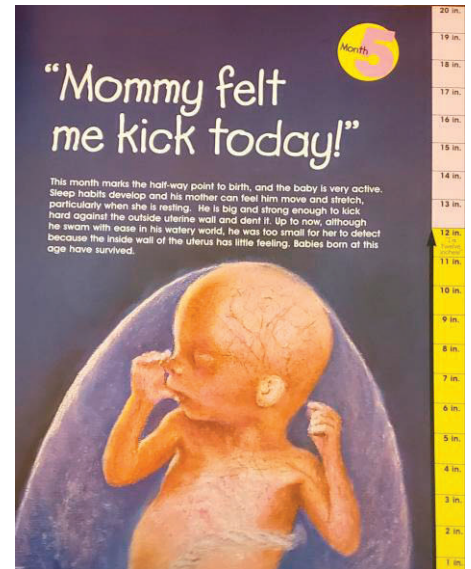

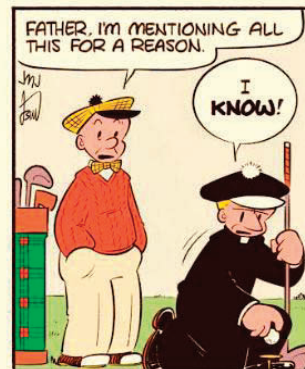

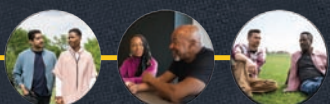
