Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

Abraham pleads with the Lord, who planned to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah because of the evil and sin in those cities. Abraham asks him if he would spare the city if fifty, forty, thirty, twenty or even only ten innocent people were found there. God says that he would spare the cities even for the sake of only ten.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Paul explains to the Colossians that through baptism, they are raised to life with Christ because they believed in the power of the God who raised him from the dead. Even though they once lived in sin, their sins have been pardoned through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

Jesus' disciples asked him how they should pray. He gave them some phrases similar to those now used in the Lord's prayer. Jesus also reminds the disciples how even men with sins are able to give good things to their children, and explains how much more the heavenly Father wants to give to us.

Pablo explica a los colosenses que a través del bautismo son alzados a la vida con Cristo, porque creen en el poder de Dios quien se levantó de entre los muertos. A pesar de que antes vivían en pecado, han sido perdonados por medio de Jesús.

Evangelio: San Lucas 11:1-13

Los discípulos de Jesús le preguntan cómo deben orar. Les dió algunas de las frases que son similares al Padre Nuestro. Jesús también les recordó a los discípulos cómo hombres pecadores son capaces de darles cosas buenas a sus hijos, y explica cuánto más nuestro Padre en el cielo quiere darnos.

PASTOR NOTES: Spread the word: believe it or not, COVID restrictions are over. It's time to attend Mass again. Family and friends should be coming back. Do you know anyone who has been away and used to go regularly? Please encourage them to return. Ask them why they are separating themselves from the Body of Christ? It's been four years since the restrictions were lifted. It's time to return now...Which brings up another point. Some have asked me to record my Masses or livestream them. I've been thinking of a way to do that. I wouldn't mind live-streaming each Sunday, but it would require a decent sound and camera system. The iPad/Facebook thing doesn't cut it. I'll certainly keep this in mind. Although the initial reason I started this was the COVID pandemic. Having online Masses defeats the purpose of encouraging people to return to the church...Does anybody know of a company that can put the American flag back up at St. John's? Several months ago, a windstorm tore the rope in half. I have a new rope and flag, but I need someone with a bucket truck or something similar to get up there and attach the new rope. Chief White of the PFD said his bucket truck is too heavy to do that and would take up too much space in the street to get it done. Old Glory needs to be raised back up to the crow's nest. Suggestions?...The third floor of the rectory house is brutally hot. Fr. Clifford should not have to live like this. I'm surprised the poor man hasn't melted away by now. A third-floor ceiling/roof exhaust fan should help draw the heat out not only on the third floor but throughout the house. I've waited too long to do this, so I'd like to get this done sooner rather than later. AC window units are practically useless unless they're one of those split systems, like the ones we see in apartments nowadays. They also gorge on electricity all day on these exceptionally hot days, causing NYSEG bills to skyrocket each summer. Fr. Clifford constantly runs his unit 24/7 just to make his room barely livable. Plus, we run the guest room unit to try to cool down the rest of the floor. Central air would be the best option. I don't understand why it was never installed at the rectory. It's more economically feasible in the long run, especially with the systems available today - clean and efficient. If I had half a million bucks, the things I could do...Upcoming events to keep in mind include the St. Charles Ice Cream Social and Parish Picnic. The former will occur in August, and the latter in September. Please stay close to these pages for more details... Let's welcome Mr. David Oaks from St. Charles and Mrs. Paulette Carlucci from St. John's as our new trustees, effective September 1. And thank you so much, Lorraine Oaks and John Canevari, for doing a terrific job over the last three years...Finally, a new parish council will be formed in September. If you're interested in participating, please send your contact information to the parish email, and we'll discuss it further. Former members are free to re-enlist! ... That's all for now, *Fr. JFXP*.

NOTAS DEL PÁRROCO: Corran la voz: aunque parezca increíble, las restricciones por el COVID han terminado. Es hora de volver a asistir a misa. Los familiares y amigos deberían volver. ¿Conocen a alguien que haya estado ausente y solía asistir con regularidad? Por favor, anímenlos a que regresen. Pregúntenles por qué se están separando del Cuerpo de Cristo. Han pasado cuatro años desde que se levantaron las restricciones. Es hora de volver... Lo cual nos lleva a otro punto. Algunos me han pedido que grave mis misas o las transmita en directo. He estado pensando en una forma de hacerlo. No me importaría transmitir en directo cada domingo, pero se necesitaría un sistema de sonido y una cámara decentes. El iPad y Facebook no son suficientes. Lo tendré en cuenta. Aunque la razón inicial por la que empecé a hacerlo fue la pandemia de COVID. Tener misas en línea va en contra del objetivo de animar a la gente a volver a la iglesia...¿Alguien sabe de alguna empresa que pueda volver a colocar la bandera estadounidense en St. John's? Hace varios meses, una tormenta de viento rompió la cuerda por la mitad. Tengo una cuerda y una bandera nuevas, pero necesito a alguien con una camioneta con cesta elevadora o algo similar para subir y colocar la nueva cuerda. El jefe White, del PFD, dijo que su camioneta con cesta elevadora es demasiado pesada para hacerlo y que ocuparía demasiado espacio en la calle. La bandera estadounidense debe volver a ondear en lo alto del mástil. ¿Alguna sugerencia? El tercer piso de la rectoría es brutalmente caluroso. El padre Clifford no debería tener que vivir así. Me sorprende que el pobre hombre no se haya derretido ya. Un ventilador de techo en el tercer piso ayudaría a sacar el calor no solo del tercer piso, sino de toda la casa. He esperado demasiado para hacerlo, así que me gustaría hacerlo cuanto antes. Los aires acondicionados de ventana son prácticamente inútiles a menos que sean de los que se dividen en dos, como los que vemos hoy en día en los apartamentos. Además, consumen mucha electricidad durante todo el día en estos días tan calurosos, lo que hace que las facturas de NYSEG se disparen cada verano. El padre Clifford tiene el aire acondicionado encendido las 24 horas del día solo para que su habitación sea mínimamente habitable. Además, encendemos el aparato de la habitación de invitados para intentar refrescar el resto de la planta. El aire acondicionado central sería la mejor opción. No entiendo por qué nunca se instaló en la rectoría. A largo plazo es más rentable, sobre todo con los sistemas que hay hoy en día, que son limpios y eficientes. Si tuviera medio millón de dólares, las cosas que podría hacer... Entre los próximos eventos a tener en cuenta se encuentran la Fiesta del Helado de San Carlos y el Picnic Parroquial. El primero tendrá lugar en agosto y el segundo en septiembre. Por favor, permanezcan atentos a estas páginas para más detalles... Demos la bienvenida al Sr. David Oaks, de San Carlos, y a la Sra. Paulette Carlucci, de San Juan, como nuevos miembros del consejo de administración, a partir del 1 de septiembre. Y muchas gracias a Lorraine Oaks y John Canevari por el magnífico trabajo realizado durante los últimos tres años... Por último, en septiembre se formará un nuevo consejo parroquial. 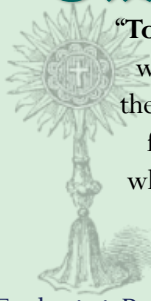

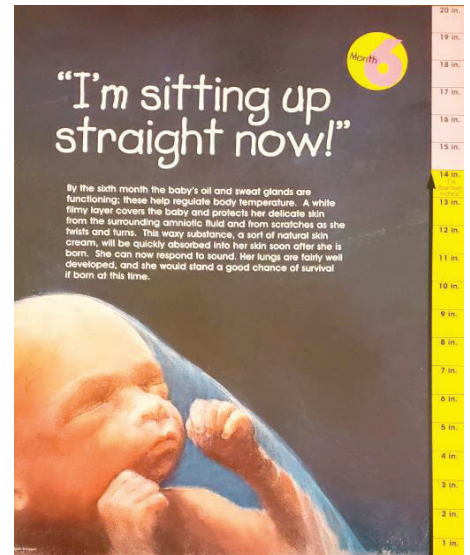
Those who cannot make a pilgrimage due to serious reasons (elderly, sick, imprisoned, or caregivers) may obtain the indulgence by:

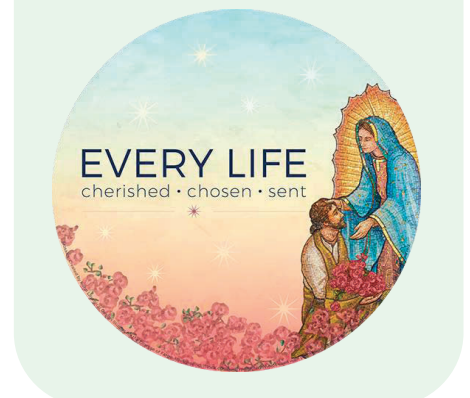

Because it can be difficult for many in our community to afford fresh food, **PFM has a program that provides cash equivalent tokens each week to qualified customers to use at the market to purchase fresh produce and food products.** In 2025, PFM will be offering weekly tokens worth at least \$15 and perhaps more, depending upon funding, through this Feed Your Neighbor (FYN) program. Those who live, work or worship in Pawling or Holmes/Whaley Lake and have income below a certain level qualify. To participate in the Feed Your Neighbor program, **please go to the Pawling Resource Center to complete an application.** Applicants will need to provide proof of residence, work or worship in Pawling and make a statement regarding income. **If you have questions about the program, please call Chris Carty (917-670-7340). 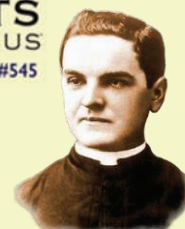

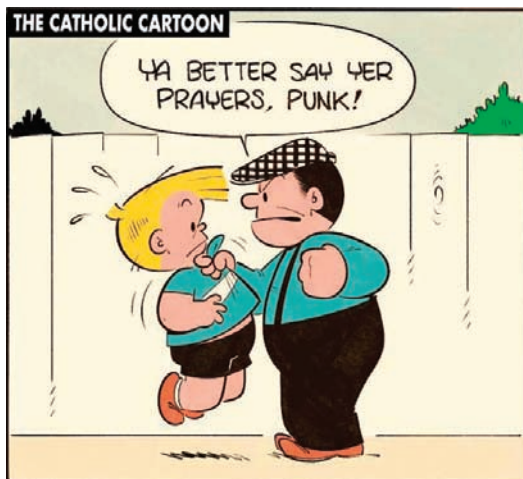

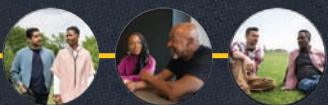
