

Pastor's Notes: What is gossip? Part Two

Before presenting the second part of our subject, there was a small typo in the first part. In the beginning, the scripture reference for St. Matthew's Gospel should be Mt. 12:36-37, not 1 Mt. 12:36-27.

The Golden Rule: "In everything, do to others as you would have them do to you; for this is the law and the prophets (*Mt* 7:12)."

Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor." (Exodus 20:16; Cf. Deut 5:20)

The Catechism Of The Catholic Church, paragraph 2479 states: Detraction and calumny destroy the *reputation and honor of one's neighbor*. Honor is the social witness given to human dignity, and everyone enjoys a natural right to the honor of his name and reputation and to respect. Thus, detraction and calumny offend against the virtues of justice and charity.

Since we define gossip as any unnecessary or trivial talk about others, some types of gossip are more sinful than others. Let's start with one of the worst of them all.

Calumny—lying about someone to harm or ruin their reputation—is a grave sin. There is never a valid or justified reason to do this. As the Lord says, you will recognize a tree by its fruit. (See Luke 6.43-45.) Calumny involves the double sin of lying and damaging or ruining someone's reputation (sins against charity and justice). Even if a person is the worst of sinners, God created us in His image and likeness. Everyone has a right to their good name. Even a terrible sinner or criminal still retains their human dignity.

In America, innocence is usually assumed first, or at least it used to be. This idea comes from Judeo-Christian beliefs. But today, we are quick to judge based on the first thing we hear about someone accused of wrongdoing. We make quick judgments and then enjoy spreading rumors about others, often with malicious intent.

Calumny violates the Golden Rule. Once a reputation is damaged, even slightly, it can affect that person for the rest of their life. Restoring one's good name is very difficult. Unfortunately, it is very common in today's society. St. Thomas Aquinas said that those who commit this sin must confess it, and justice requires that they recant the lie to those they lied to. Calumny in writing is called slander, and slander can lead to serious legal consequences in a lawsuit, especially if the lie was published. It also requires a written recantation of the lie.

I'll be away this week, but I will continue this subject when I return, where we'll discuss detraction. Until then, "Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for edifying, as fits the occasion, that it may impart grace to those who hear." (Ephesians 4.29, RSVCE), *Fr. JFXP*.





REFLECT

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ'" (CCC, 1025).

We can see how, throughout her life, the Blessed Mother continually chose to go deeper into her relationship with God. She modeled how to value and respect His precious gift of human life, from the moment of conception to its natural end. In the Annunciation, through her "yes," Mary witnessed to the undeniable humanity of pre-born children as she conceived and carried the Christ child in her womb. After the Annunciation, having learned that her cousin Elizabeth was with child, she went in haste to her aid.

Our Blessed Mother shows us how the way we live *today* can prepare us, in hope, to also enter into heavenly glory at the end of our lives. Are we open to God's precious gift of new life? How do we support pregnant mothers and parents? Do we prioritize showing our love to those who are ill or aging? Do we care for them in a way that respects God's gift of life?

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Canon Law 1004 § 1. The anointing of the sick can be administered to a member of the faithful who, having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age.

Saturday, September 13th St. John The Evangelist, Pawling NY

On Saturday, September 13, the vigil of the Solemnity of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, the parish church of St. John the Evangelist – St. Charles Borromeo will host a day of prayer for all those carrying the cross of suffering, whether in body, mind, or spirit. The day will include the following activities:

- 2:00 Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament
- 2:30 Penance and Reconciliation begins (English only)
- 3:00 Divine Mercy Chaplet and Holy Rosary
- 3:30 Litanies of the Sacred Heart and the Holy Name of Jesus
- 3:45 Penance and Reconciliation Ends
- 4:00 Personal Reverence with the Blessed Sacrament*
- 4:30 Benediction
- 5:00 The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass (Counts for Sunday Obligation). After the homily, the anointing of the sick will take place.

Penance and Reconciliation will be available in the afternoon. You do not need to attend all day to receive the anointing.

This is not a Charismatic healing service. It is a day of prayer and penance with Mass and the Anointing of the Sick. There will be no laying on of hands or praise and worship songs. The anointing is for those with chronic illnesses, disabilities, those before surgery, the elderly, individuals with mental health issues, or other infirmities

A basket will be placed on the table in front of the crucifix under the baldacchino. You may write your intentions to the Lord and place them in the basket. These intentions will remain before the altar throughout the entire weekend Masses during the Solemnity.

The parish must record the number of anointings performed that day.

* Father will stand at the front of the sanctuary with the monstrance, and people may come forward to offer personal reverence to the Blessed Sacrament.




