



## Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

#### Second Reading: 2Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

#### **Gospel: Luke 17:5-10**

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.

#### Evangelio: San Lucas 17:5-10

Los discípulos le piden a Dios más fé. Jesús les dice que "la fé del tamaño de una semilla de mostaza podría transplantar una morera", indicando que una persona tiene fé que es fuerte y completa, o no la tiene. Jesús explica que un sirviente no recibirá gratitud por simplemente seguir las órdenes de su amo. Del mismo modo, nosotros somos sirvientes de Dios llevando a cabo nuestra obligación al obedecer sus mandamientos.





#### Sisters of Allegany Mission Appeal

Sister Margaret Magee, OSF and Sr. Lucy Cardet, OSF of the Franciscan Sisters of Allegany, NY will be here October 11th & 12th 2025 for our annual Mission Appeal. The Franciscan Sisters of Allegany were the first American founded congregation to send sisters to the foreign missions. They minister to those in need, especially the underprivileged, the undernourished, the marginalized, and to vistims of injustice and violence. Funds to support the missions where our sisters work and volunteer are solicited through the efforts of the St. Elizabeth Mission Society.

The congregation continues to respond to the overwhelming needs of our brothers and sisters through education, health care, and social ministries in Jamaica, Brazil, Mozambique, Bolivia, and the United States. This appeal by the sisters will take place at all Masses.

# ADULT SACRAMENT COMPLETION:

OCIA class begins in September. Please get in touch with the office if you wish to complete your sacraments or if you know of someone in our parish who would like to do so. You must be 14 and older to participate in OCIA. All sacraments will be admitted during the 2026 Easter Season. #### St. Paul of the Cross

Born in seventeenth-century Ovada, Italy, to a noble Catholic family, Paul Francis Danei had a great devotion to the Cross of Christ since he was young. He devoted the rest of his life to prayer, penance, preaching, and charitable works. In 1720, he experienced a vision, calling him to found the Passionist Order. After many difficulties, the Order received papal approval in 1741. St. Paul served as their superior general until his death in 1775.

## Finding Grace in chaos


Ask for—and offer—forgiveness quickly. Let forgiveness flow freely in your home. Admit when you're wrong. Forgive when others fail. Humility

Henry Newman. While this does not mean that the works themselves are completely free from error, the Church considers their contributions to be good guides for the spiritual life. To be declared a Doctor of the Church, one must

possess great learning and holiness, and be officially proclaimed as such by the Church.


