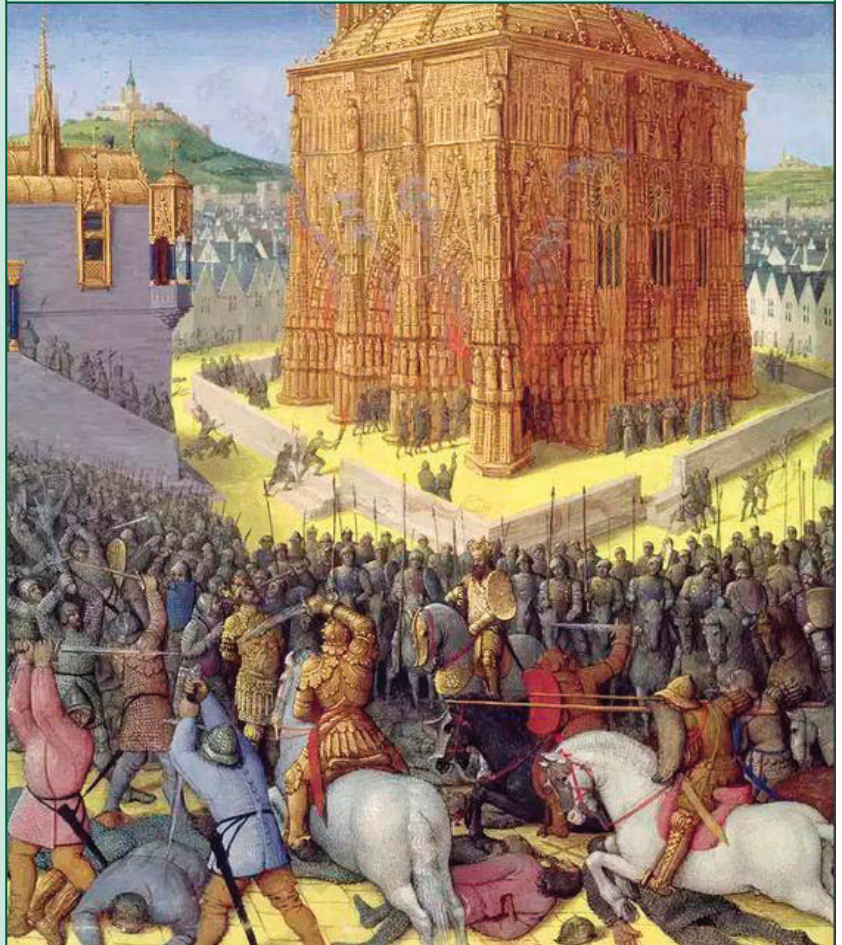

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.

Vigesimalseptimo Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario

Primera Lectura: Habacuc 1:2-3, 2:2-4

El profeta Habacuc se queja desesperadamente con Dios por el estado en que ha caído Jerusalén. Le pregunta a Dios por qué no hace nada para detener la violencia y miseria. Dios le asegura que el momento llegará cuando sólo los justos y fieles vivirán.

Segunda Lectura: 2 Timoteo 1:6-8, 13-14

Pablo le escribe a Timoteo desde la prisión y lo incita a seguir divulgando el evangelio sin miedo ni vergüenza. También le dice que saque fuerzas del Espíritu Santo para que lo ayude a afrontar las dificultades que encontrará al predicar.

Evangelio: San Lucas 17:5-10

Los discípulos le piden a Dios más fe. Jesús les dice que "la fe del tamaño de una semilla de mostaza podría transplantar una morera", indicando que una persona tiene fe que es fuerte y completa, o no la tiene. Jesús explica que un sirviente no recibirá gratitud por simplemente seguir las órdenes de su amo. Del mismo modo, nosotros somos sirvientes de Dios llevando a cabo nuestra obligación al obedecer sus mandamientos.

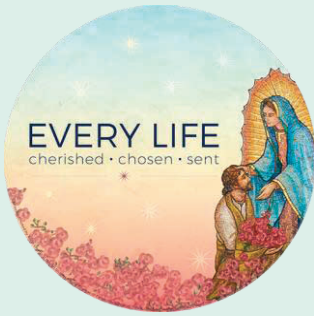

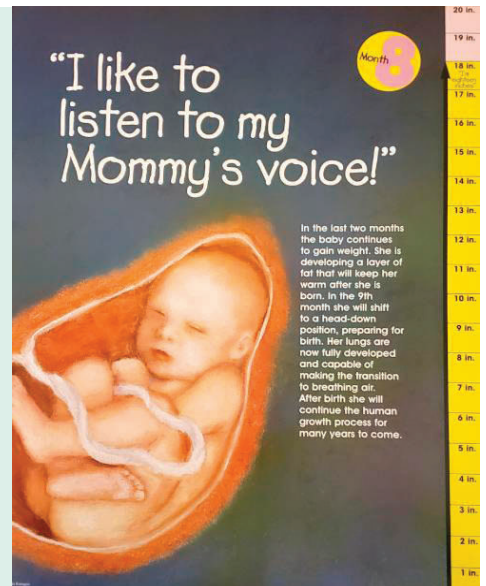
October is Respect Life Month.

“With great joy we celebrate October as Respect Life Month amid the Church’s Jubilee Year of Hope,” announced Bishop Daniel E. Thomas of Toledo, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ Committee on Pro-Life Activities, in a statement. “The daily headlines remind us of how desperately our world is thirsting for the hope that only God can provide.... the gift of human life exists as a sign of hope to our world today, defying the powers of darkness and the culture of death. It is of the utmost importance that we work to ensure that every life, in every stage and circumstance, is protected in law. This Jubilee Year we are challenged to be agents of hope to those whose hearts are burdened by trial, difficulty, or suffering, offering them the hope that comes from Christ Jesus alone,” Bishop Thomas said.

October 5 - Respect Life Sunday. There will be a special blessing for all new and expectant parents during the masses this weekend. If you are able to participate, there are Life Chains all across the country today, including ones in Poughkeepsie, Danbury and Mount Kisco.

Sisters of Allegany Mission Appeal

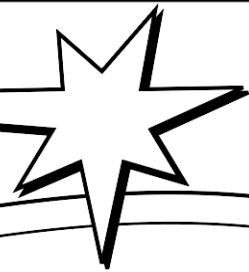
Sister Margaret Magee, OSF and Sr. Lucy Cardet, OSF

American founded congregation to send sisters to the
foreign missions. They minister to those in need,
especially the underprivileged, the undernourished, the
marginalized, and to victims of injustice and violence.
Funds to support the missions where our sisters work
and volunteer are solicited through the efforts of the St.
Elizabeth Mission Society.

The congregation continues to respond to the
overwhelming needs of our brothers and sisters through
education, health care, and social ministries in Jamaica,
Brazil, Mozambique, Bolivia, and the United States.
This appeal by the sisters will take place at all Masses.

St. Paul of the Cross

Born in seventeenth-century Ovada, Italy, to a noble Catholic family, Paul Francis Danei had a great devotion to the Cross of Christ since he was young. He devoted the rest of his life to prayer, penance, preaching, and charitable works. In 1720, he experienced a vision, calling him to found the Passionist Order. After many difficulties, the Order received papal approval in 1741. St. Paul served as their superior general until his death in 1775.

Finding Grace in chaos

We all wish family life came with less stress, but it's often through struggle that God calls us to rely more deeply on His grace. These challenges aren't just to be endured—they're opportunities to grow in holiness, patience, and strength together.

Tone sets the atmosphere. Speaking with kindness, patience, and firmness helps shape the emotional climate of your home. Make it a place where respectful dialogue is the norm, even when correcting or confronting.

Distinguish needs from wants. Much stress comes from confusing what's necessary with what's simply desired. Teach children that not every want must be met. Model generosity, self-control, and service. These habits reduce entitlement and build responsibility.

Ask for—and offer—forgiveness quickly. Let forgiveness flow freely in your home. Admit when you're wrong.

Forgive when others fail. Humility and mercy help children learn how to resolve conflict in healthy, lasting ways.

Pray with and for one another. When life gets overwhelming, teach your family to turn to God first. Make prayer a regular habit, and stay close to the sacraments—especially the Mass. In Christ, we find the "peace... which surpasses all understanding" (Philippians 4:7).

Prioritize meaningful time together. Busyness is the enemy of connection. Block out regular time for family connection. Do something you all enjoy. Shared experiences build strong bonds—and lasting joy.

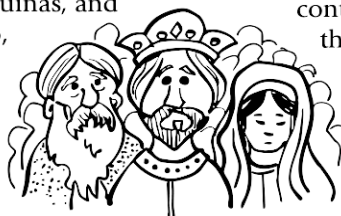


Why Do Catholics Do That?

What is a "Doctor of the Church?"

There are thirty-seven Doctors of the Church, including St. Thérèse of Lisieux, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Augustine of Hippo, plus the recently nominated St. John Henry Newman. While this does not mean that the works

themselves are completely free from error, the Church considers their contributions to be good guides for the spiritual life. To be declared a Doctor of the Church, one must possess great learning and holiness, and be officially proclaimed as such by the Church.

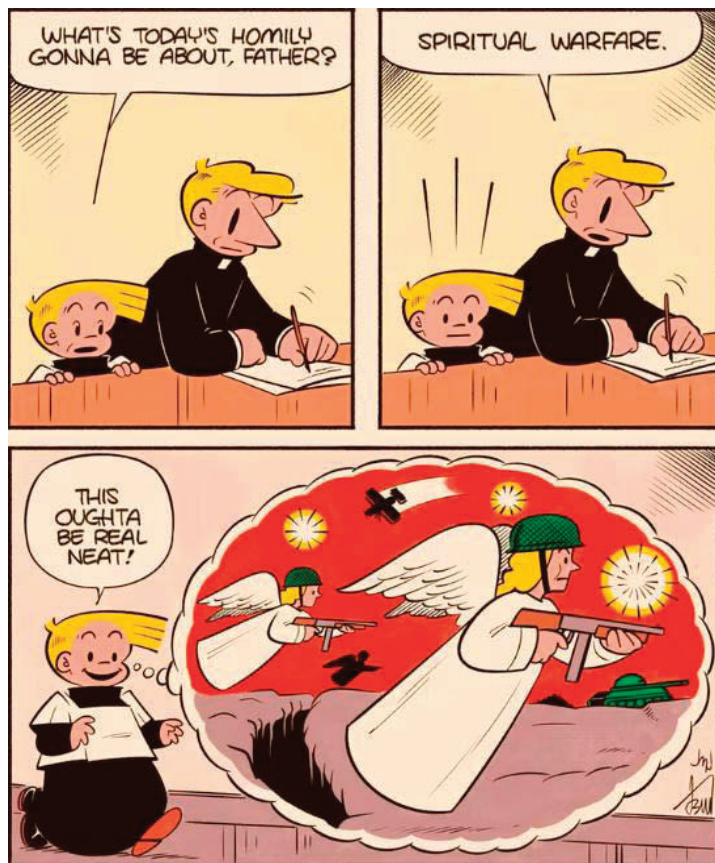

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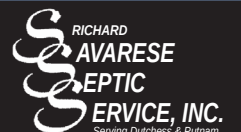
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
