Jude, a slave of Jesus Christ and brother of James, to those who are called, beloved in God the Father and kept safe for Jesus Christ: may mercy, peace and love be yours in abundance.

Jude 1:1-2



Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18

God is just and does not show favoritism, but hears the prayers of everyone. Anyone who serves God, no matter how lowly his position here on earth, will be heard and answered.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

Paul writes to Timothy that he thinks his mission is near the end, and he is glad his faith is still strong. Paul hopes that all nations will hear the gospel. But, if he is executed as he anticipates, he is sure he will live forever in heaven.

Gospel: Luke 18:9-14

Jesus tells a parable about a Pharisee who went to the temple, and offered up a prayer of thanks because he was not a sinner like the tax collector who was also there to pray. The tax collector was far more humble, acknowledging his sins, and asking forgiveness for them. Jesus said the tax collector's prayer would be heard because, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, while he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Jesús cuenta una parábola sobre un fariseo que fué al templo y ofreció una oración de gracias por no ser un pecador como el cobrador de impuestos que también estaba orando. El cobrador era más humilde, reconociendo sus pecados y pidiendo perdón. Jesús dijo que la oración del cobrador sería escuchada porque "el que a sí mismo se engrandece será humillado, y el que se humilla será engrandecido".

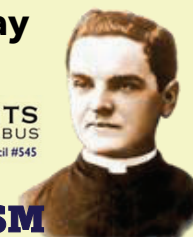

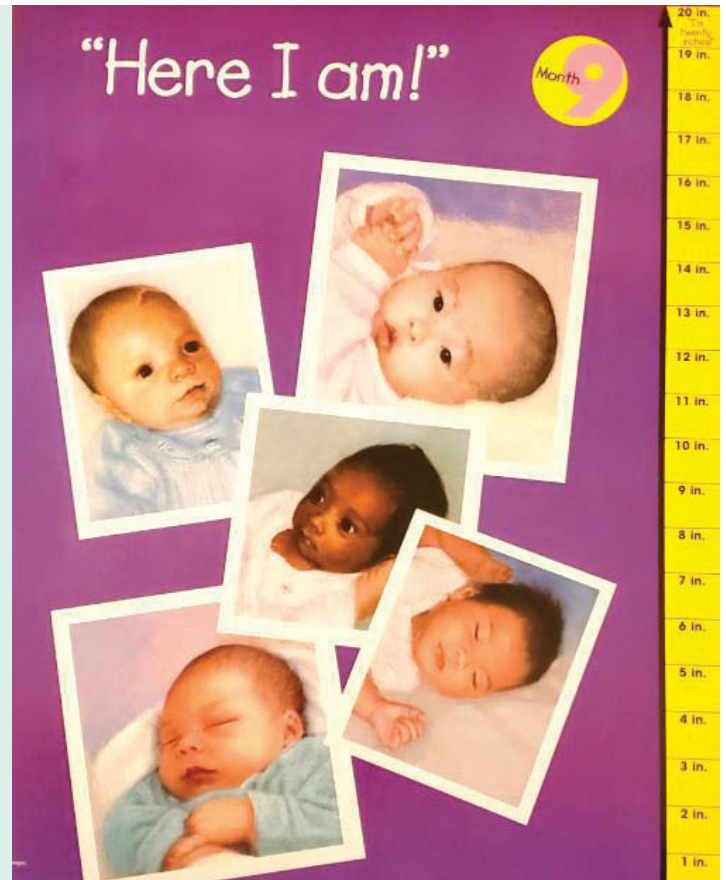

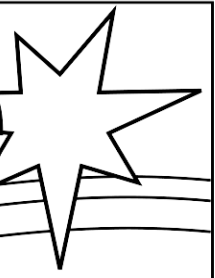

Momentos para pensar

San Pablo de la Cruz

Pablo Francisco Danei nació en el siglo XVII en Ovada, Italia, en el seno de una familia católica noble



y desde joven tuvo gran devoción a la Cruz de Cristo. Dedicó el resto de su vida a la oración, la penitencia, la predicación y las obras de caridad. En 1720 tuvo una visión que lo impulsó a fundar la orden de los Pasionistas. Tras muchas dificultades, la orden recibió el visto bueno papal en 1741. San Pablo fue su superior general hasta su muerte en 1775.

Lleve sus necesidades a Dios

El fariseo en el evangelio de este mes dedicó toda su oración a alabarse a sí mismo. Quizá pensaba que tenía que ganarse el amor de Dios. Se olvidó de su verdadera necesidad: la misericordia. Dios nos ofrece siempre su amor incondicional y su misericordia. ¿Lo aceptamos?

Hallar la Gracia en el caos

Todos deseamos que haya menos estrés en la vida de familia, pero a través de las dificultades Dios nos llama a menudo a que confiemos mucho más profundamente en su gracia. Estos retos no son sólo algo que debemos soportar: son oportunidades para que crezcamos juntos en santidad, paciencia y fuerza.

El tono crea la atmósfera.

Hablar con amabilidad, paciencia y firmeza contribuye a forjar el ambiente anímico de su hogar. Procuren que sea un lugar donde el diálogo respetuoso es la norma, incluso durante las correcciones o los enfrentamientos.

Distinguir las necesidades de los deseos. El estrés surge muchas veces de la confusión entre lo que es necesario y lo que simplemente se desea. Enseñen a sus hijos que no todo deseo ha de ser satisfecho. Den ejemplo de generosidad, autocontrol y servicio. Estos hábitos reducen las expectativas de

privilegios y desarrollan la responsabilidad.

Pidan—y ofrezcan—perdón rápidamente. Que el perdón fluya con facilidad en su hogar. Admitan sus errores.

Perdonen cuando otros se equivoquen. La humildad y la misericordia ayudan a los niños a resolver los conflictos de forma sana y duradera.

Recen juntos unos por otros. Cuando la vida se

vuelva abrumadora, enseñen a su familia a dirigirse enseguida a Dios. Conviertan la oración en un hábito y no se alejen de los sacramentos, especialmente de la misa. En Cristo encontramos "la paz de Dios, que supera todo lo que podemos pensar" (Filipenses 4:7).

Den prioridad a que el tiempo que pasen juntos sea relevante. El ajetreo es el enemigo del vínculo. Reserven un tiempo fijo para conectar como familia. Hagan algo que todos disfruten. Las experiencias compartidas crean vínculos fuertes y alegría duradera.

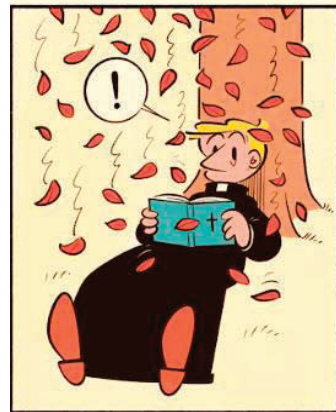

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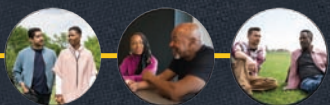
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
