

## SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM

This weekend the Respect Life Committee continues to have materials available in the vestibule for parishioners of all ages to sign up and spiritually adopt a baby. You can name the child and commit to pray for the baby's safety in the womb for the next nine months. There will be sign up cards to complete. You keep the half with the prayer. The returned slips with the babies' names will be placed in the basket near the statue of the Blessed Mother for the next nine months. Posters will be hung in the entrance of the church to show the gradual growth of the baby from conception to birth. We encourage you to participate in this rewarding annual parish program. All of the returned slips will be placed in the wicker basket and placed in front of Mary's statue until October, when the adopted babies will hopefully be born.

Our Catholic faith contains a rich treasury of powerful words: beloved prayers, timeless creeds, scripture readings, and liturgical texts. Words of Faith is a growing collection of bulletin inserts structured around these amazing words that teach us who we are, what we believe, and how we are to live.

with fasting, and weeping, and  
mourning;  
Rend your hearts, not your garments,  
and return to the Lord, your God.  
For gracious and merciful is he,  
slow to anger, rich in kindness,  
and relenting in punishment.

### We Practice

These powerful words from the prophet Joel in the first reading for Mass on Ash Wednesday nudge us toward repentance. Each year these words usher in another season of Lent and call us to a renewed and deeper holiness. To assist us in our spiritual growth, we commit ourselves to the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Of these, fasting seems to capture our collective attention most deeply.

Around Ash Wednesday, you likely hear many Catholics asking, “What are you giving up for Lent?” We are fascinated to know what others are doing—so much so that even those among us who would usually never dare ask people about their faith jump into the conversation. We talk with friends, colleagues—and at times perfect strangers—about giving up sweets, soda, television, music, or whatever else we are inspired to forgo for the forty days. When we talk about “giving things up,” we are of course talking about the ancient spiritual practice of fasting. Fasting includes the giving up not just of food or drink, but of anything that might hinder our quest for deeper union with God.

In the past, the practice of fasting was much more common in the Church, including, for example, during the season of Advent as well as the vigils of important feasts. Today, however, Lent has become the primary time for fasting. In addition to the things we individually give up, Lent includes several communal fast days. As testified to by the many parish fish fries and the fish specials at restaurants, all Fridays in Lent as well as Ash Wednesday are days of abstinence (refraining) from eating meat. In addition, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of fasting. According to the Church, fasting on those days means having “only one full meal a day but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing—as far as quantity and quality are concerned—approved local custom.”

### DID YOU KNOW?

Those under eighteen and over fifty-nine are dispensed from the obligation to fast, but everyone over the age of fourteen is obliged to abstain from meat on the designated days. The Church, however, permits the substitution of “other forms of penance, especially works of charity and exercises of piety, in whole or in part, for abstinence and fast” (*Code of Canon Law, #1253*). It is in this spirit, for example, that in 2009 the Bishop of Modena, Italy, challenged youth there to fast from text messaging on the Fridays of Lent.

In addition, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of fasting. According to the Church, fasting on those days means having “only one full meal a day but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing—as far as quantity and quality are concerned—approved local custom.”

### DID YOU KNOW?

Those under eighteen and over fifty-nine are dispensed from the obligation to fast, but everyone over the age of fourteen is obliged to abstain from meat on the designated days. The Church, however, permits the substitution of “other forms of penance, especially works of charity and exercises of piety, in whole or in part, for abstinence and fast” (*Code of Canon Law, #1253*). It is in this spirit, for example, that in 2009 the Bishop of Modena, Italy, challenged youth there to fast from text messaging on the Fridays of Lent.


