

The baby is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form and her fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, lips, and tongue can now be clearly seen. Even her brain waves can now be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By eight weeks all body systems are present and the baby is called a "fetus", a Latin word meaning "little one" or "young one." Ultrasound reveals that this little one can now spring and jump – her first dance steps!



SPIRITUAL PRACTICES: Stations of the Cross

Our Catholic faith contains a rich treasury of powerful words: beloved prayers, timeless creeds, scripture readings, and liturgical texts. Words of Faith is a growing collection of bulletin inserts structured around these amazing words that teach us who we are, what we believe, and how we are to live.



We Hear

Leader: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

All: Because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world!


We Practice

This is the traditional call-and-response antiphon used repeatedly when we pray the Stations of the Cross. This simple prayer is a powerful reminder of the universal and life-transforming hope that Christians have found in the Cross of Christ. By praying the Stations, one of the most popular and widespread devotions in the Catholic Church, we seek to join Jesus in the saving mystery of his passion and death by accompanying him on his final steps to Calvary. Along the way, we stop at key moments on his journey, referred to as “Stations,” to meditate and reflect on what Jesus did and the love with which he did it. There are fourteen Stations in all, beginning with Pilate condemning Jesus to death and ending with him being laid in the tomb. In some places a fifteenth station is prayed, recalling the scriptural story of the empty tomb. This practice seeks to affirm our belief that

the Paschal Mystery (our salvation through the death and resurrection of Jesus) is not complete without the resurrection.

The Fourteen Traditional Stations

1. Jesus is Condemned to Die
2. Jesus Takes up His Cross
3. Jesus Falls the First Time
4. Jesus Meets His Sorrowful Mother
5. Simon Helps Jesus Carry the Cross
6. Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus
7. Jesus Falls the Second Time
8. Jesus Meets the Women of Jerusalem
9. Jesus Falls the Third Time
10. Jesus is Stripped of His Garments
11. Jesus is Nailed to the Cross
12. Jesus Dies on the Cross
13. Jesus is Taken Down from the Cross
14. Jesus is Laid in the Tomb



DID YOU KNOW?

On Good Friday in 1991, Pope John Paul II introduced a new form of the devotion called “The Scriptural Way of the Cross.” In this form, all the Stations find their root in the Bible, whereas with the traditional fourteen Stations, six of them find their basis in the broader tradition of the Church, rather than in a particular biblical text.

Andrew Gawrych, C.S.C., is a Holy Cross priest, serving as Associate Director of the Office of Vocations for the Congregation of Holy Cross, Indiana Province.

Given their focus on Jesus' passion and death, the Stations are most widely prayed during Lent. In fact, many parishes pray the devotion communally during the season, often on Friday, the traditional day of fasting and penitence in remembrance of the crucifixion and death of Jesus on Good Friday.

To help us enter into this spiritual pilgrimage with our Lord, stations of the Cross (small artistic depictions) have been erected in most churches as well as in many outdoor shrines. Typically, these consist of a cross and some artistic image of the particular scene from Jesus' passion and death. At each station, the traditional call and response is repeated, drawing us ever deeper into the mystery of our redemption.

We Believe

The more we pray the Stations, the more we can echo what St. Paul wrote almost two thousand years ago, "The message about the Cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18). For us, the Cross is the enduring symbol of the love and life of God that conquers sin and even death.

Jesus himself told his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 16:24-5). Praying the Stations of the Cross helps us confront the darkness of our own lives so that we might die to our sorrow and our sin in ways that liberate us to find new life in Christ Jesus.

We Live

As closely as we can enter with Jesus into his passion and death through praying the Stations, it is just the tip of the iceberg when it comes to our participation in the mystery of his saving love. We take up our crosses and follow Jesus much more fully by living faithfully everyday in whatever time and place we find ourselves. We truly walk the way of the Cross with our Lord toward salvation by making the daily sacrifices that our faith and our vocations call forth from us.

Human life is like a great Way of the Cross. We do not have to go to the chapel or church to go through the different stations. This Way of the Cross is everywhere and we travel it every day, even in spite of ourselves and without being aware of it.

The true fruit of praying the Stations, then, is precisely that we become aware—right in the midst of our daily lives—that we are never alone in our trials, failures, and sufferings. They need not be meaningless. Instead, through the trials, failures, and sufferings of our lives, we are united ever more closely with Jesus who suffered and died for the sake of the world. Along the way, we learn how Jesus redeems our steps, picks us up from our falls, and unites our sacrifices and sufferings with his in the transforming power of his Cross. Our whole lives are turned into a pilgrimage with Jesus, making that transformative journey with him through death to new life.

- Pray the Stations of the Cross the first Friday of every month. Prepare for them by reflecting on your own trials, failures, and sufferings of the past month so that you can join them to the mystery of Christ's love revealed in his passion and death.
- Write your own reflections for the Stations, based on the events and experiences of your own life. Use *Everyone's Way of the Cross* or *You Have Redeemed the World: Praying Stations in the Holy Cross Tradition* as guides (both available from Ave Maria Press).

With Children

- Make a pilgrimage to a nearby church or outdoor shrine known for its beautiful stations to pray them as a family.
- Help children create their own set of the stations on paper or with foam board, modeling clay, or other materials to be displayed and prayed with during Lent.
- Encourage children to create their own Stations of the Cross booklets, perhaps using published meditations, paired with prayers written in their own words.



A BIT OF HISTORY

The Stations of the Cross grew out of the ancient practice of pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Many early Christians traveled to Jerusalem to literally walk in Jesus' footsteps. The shape of the devotion as we know it today can be traced in large part to St. Francis of Assisi and the Franciscans. In all likelihood, the Franciscans developed the *Via Dolorosa* (Latin for the "Sorrowful Way") in the Middle Ages. This solemn tracing of Jesus' final steps through Jerusalem to Calvary marked the route with various "stations" for meditation and prayer.

As the devotion grew beyond the Holy Land, it included anywhere between eleven and thirty Stations until the number was fixed at fourteen through a series of papal decrees in the eighteenth century.
