2nd Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday

First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

In the early days of the Church in Jerusalem, the faithful listened intently to the teachings of the apostles. They lived a communal life, sharing all property in common and praying and taking their meals together.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

In this first letter from Peter, he speaks to the Christians with great joy and confidence, reminding them that through Christ's resurrection, they have been given a new birth and are heirs to the kingdom of heaven.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

After his resurrection, Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the power to forgive sins. Thomas, who is absent, sees Christ later and believes in His resurrection after feeling His wounds. Christ admonishes Thomas by saying, “You became a believer because you saw Me. Blessed are they who have not seen and believed.”

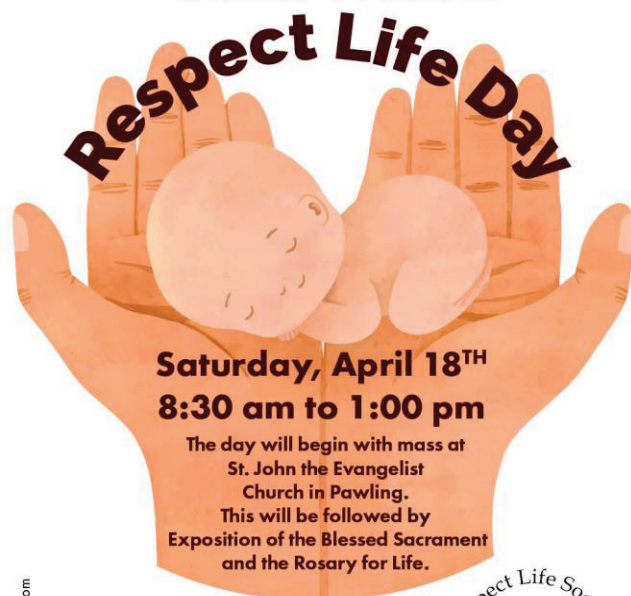

Sr. Diana Marie, OP and Sr. Mary Joseph, OP are members of the Dominican Sisters, Congregation of St. Rose Lima (commonly known as the Hawthorne Dominicans). Their community was founded by Venerable Servant of God, Rose Hawthorne in 1900 to provide free, palliative end-of-life care to the poor who have incurable cancer. They carry on this same mission today in their two homes in Hawthorne, NY and Atlanta, GA.
- Bonnie Ann Dombroski RN, BSN Talk On - "Love Doesn't Count Chromosomes."
Bonnie Ann is a member of Saint Kateri Tekak witha Parish in Lagrangeville, NY. Bonnie has been advocating for people with Down Syndrome and their families since 1991, when her second child, Christa was born. She was a founding member of the Down Syndrome Association of Central Florida and the Vice President of the Down Syndrome Association of the Hudson Valley from 2018-2021; President of DSAHV 2022-2024. Bonnie is currently Co-Leader of "Fans of Faith," a new Christian fellowship group for young adults with IDD (Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.) She has also been a catechist at Saint Kateri for several years, and has had several differently-abled students in her classroom.
- Christa Wicklund, self-advocate Talk On - "I Love My Life!"
Christa is a 34 year old young woman who was born with Down Syndrome, also known as Trisomy 21. Christa attended the "Think Ahead Program," at Dutchess Community College, and graduated in May 2020. She was a guest speaker at the Down Syndrome Congress Convention -2016, in Orlando, Florida. Christa has many volunteer jobs, including being a teaching assistant for Faith Formation classes and Vacation Bible School at Saint Kateri Parish. She also participates in Adaptive Cross-Fit classes, and enjoys adaptive skiing, swimming, and hiking with her dog, Jameson.

Commentary: Doubting Thomas

St. Gregory the Great's commentary on the Apostle Thomas and his struggle with doubt. It makes for especially good reading for the Octave of Easter or the Feast of St. Thomas, the Apostle, which since the fourth century has been commemorated on July 3, the date when the apostle's body was translated to Edessa. Though nothing certain is known of St. Thomas' life after Pentecost, he is said to have subsequently preached the Gospel to the people of India. Known as "Doubting Thomas" or "Thomas the Doubter," his profession of faith in Christ as Lord and God is the climax of the Gospel of John.

Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. He was the only disciple absent; on his return he heard what had happened but refused to believe it. The Lord came a second time; he offered his side for the disbelieving disciple to touch, held out his hands, and showing the scars of his wounds, healed the wound of his disbelief.

Dearly beloved, what do you see in these events? Do you really believe that it was by chance that this chosen disciple was absent, then came and heard, heard and doubted, doubted and touched, touched and believed? It was not by chance but in God's providence. In a marvelous way God's mercy arranged that the disbelieving disciple, in touching the wounds of his master's body, should heal our wounds of disbelief.

The disbelief of Thomas has done more for our faith than the faith of the other disciples. As he touches Christ and is won over to belief, every doubt is cast aside and our faith is strengthened. So the disciple who doubted, then felt Christ's wounds, becomes a witness to the reality of the resurrection.

Touching Christ, he cried out: *My Lord and my God*. Jesus said to him: *Because you have seen me, Thomas, you have believed*. Paul said: *Faith is the guarantee of things hoped for, the evidence of things unseen*. It is clear, then, that faith is the proof of what can not be seen. What is seen gives knowledge, not faith. When Thomas saw and touched, why was he told: *You have believed because you have seen me*? Because what he saw and what he believed were different things. God cannot be seen by mortal man. Thomas saw a human being, whom he acknowledged to be God, and said: *My Lord and my God*. Seeing, he believed; looking at one who was true man, he cried out that this was God, the God he could not see.

What follows is reason for great joy: *Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed*. There is here a particular reference to ourselves; we hold in our hearts one we have not seen in the flesh. We are included in these words, but only if we follow up our faith with good works. The true believer practices what he believes. But of those who pay only lip service to faith, Paul has this to say: *They profess to know God, but they deny him in their works*. Therefore James says: *Faith without works is dead*.
