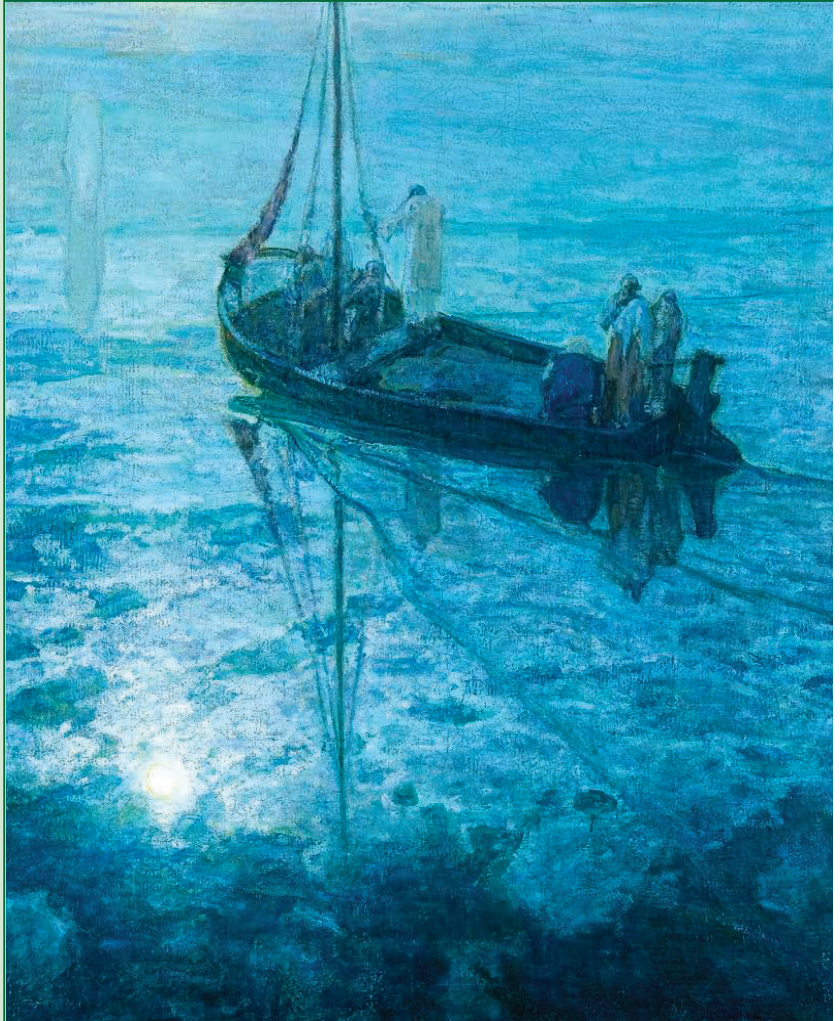

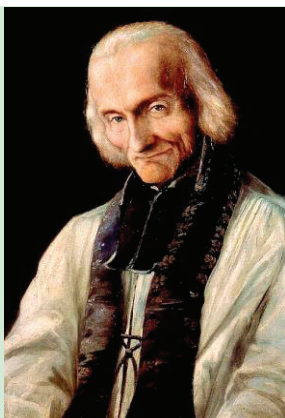

The 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-3

With great enthusiasm and fervor, God urges his people to come to him and to accept the gifts he extends to them.

Second Reading: Romans 8:35, 37-39

In words that are both stirring and courageous, Paul exclaims that nothing will separate him and his followers from the love of Christ neither trial nor persecution nor death.

Gospel: Matthew 14:13-21

Matthew gives us a straightforward and convincing account of the miracle of the loaves and fishes. Because the crowds following Jesus were hungry, he took five loaves and two fish, blessed them, and gave them to the crowds. Although the people numbered about five thousand, there was still food remaining.

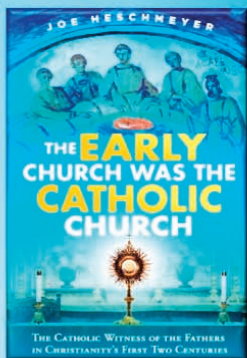
Our Young Men's Study Group Continues to Grow!

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

I need to get something off my chest. I just can't understand why some Catholics don't call a priest when they're dying. Since I've been here, I've buried so many people who died at home or in the local nursing home in Pawling without receiving the last rites. Why pass up the final graces the Lord offers through His Church? It really bothers me. Don't we see the risk to our souls if we die with unrepentant mortal sin? The Last Rites give us everything we need to leave this world in God's good graces. We should never say, "They lived a good life, so they'll go to heaven." This misses the bigger picture. If Jesus gave His Church this authority, why ignore it? Even if loved ones don't believe, we should at least ask someone close to call a priest for the final sacrament. Every priest has the authority to offer final absolution, provide an apostolic pardon, and anointing—this is God's mercy at work so souls can reach heaven, not hell. As your pastor and brother, let's take this sacrament seriously before our final judgment.

Christ the Divine Physician calls us to accompany the sick and dying with compassion, not abandon them to death. The court should protect that millennia-old mission."

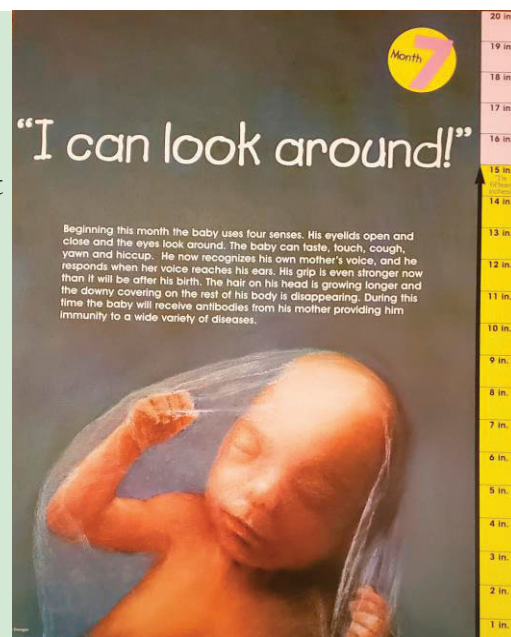
Catholic Nuns Sue New York to Stop Coercive Assisted Suicide Law

WASHINGTON – In a courageous stand for faith, conscience, and dignity of the dying, four orders of Catholic nuns and several Catholic healthcare ministries [sued](#) New York on Friday over a new law that forces them to help terminally ill patients kill themselves in violation of their faith. In [Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm v. James](#), Becket is asking a federal court to block the law before it takes effect on August 5, when healthcare providers who refuse to take part in assisted suicide will face crippling fines, professional sanctions, and criminal penalties.

For generations, Catholic healthcare ministries have been a refuge for the sick, elderly, and dying across New York. Guided by the belief that every life is a precious gift, nuns like the Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm, the Dominican Sisters of Hawthorne, the Missionary Sisters of St. Benedict, and the Little Sisters of the Poor offer those nearing death expert medical care, prayer, and loving accompaniment until God calls them home. The Diocese of Rockville Centre likewise shares this commitment to care for the sick, elderly, and dying throughout Long Island.

Following their Catholic faith, these ministries cannot prescribe lethal suicide drugs, direct patients to obtain them, or help facilitate a patient's suicide in any way. Yet New York's Medical Aid in Dying Act (MAID) will force them to do exactly that. Beginning August 5, any healthcare provider who declines to prescribe suicide pills could still have to tell terminally ill patients about their "right" to kill themselves, help them meet the requirements for obtaining suicide pills, and direct them to a provider willing to prescribe the lethal drugs. Refusal invites significant fines, license revocation, or even time behind bars. Federal law forbids New York from discriminating against healthcare providers who object to assisted suicide, but New York has done so anyway. Becket is asking the court to stop New York from forcing these ministries into the impossible choice between their faith and their mission to serve—and to protect vulnerable patients from being pushed toward assisted suicide at their lowest moment.



Beginning this month the baby uses four senses. His eyelids open and close and the eyes look around. The baby can taste, touch, cough, yawn, and hiccup. He now recognizes his own mother's voice, and he responds when her voice reaches his ears. His grip is even stronger now than it will be after his birth. The hair on his head is growing longer and the downy covering on the rest of his body is disappearing. During this time, the baby will receive antibodies from his mother, providing him immunity to a wide variety of diseases.
