

Lent is upon us and we begin this year with our Parish Mission.

Fr. Simeon Gallagher returns and will speak on the beauty & importance of the Holy Eucharist. Preaching at all Masses March 1st & 2nd, the reflection will be from Monday to Thursday following morning Mass and in the evening at 7:00pm. Please invite family and friends to begin our Lent with a Mission.

This year's patron for the Annual Partner in Charity appeal is Blessed (soon to be Saint) Carlos Acutis. He was a British born Italian website designer who documented Eucharistic Miracles and approved Marian apparitions. He died of leukemia at the age of 15 and is buried, per his request, in Assisi. His last words were: "Mom, don't be afraid. Since Jesus became a man, death had become the passage towards life, and we don't need to flee it. Let us prepare ourselves to experience something extraordinary in eternal life." He will be the first millennial saint.

We celebrate 3 wonderful events this year: Our parish's 125th Anniversary, the 75th Anniversary of our Diocese and the Church's Jubilee Year of Hope.

Special activities observing these events are being scheduled.

We extend our prayerful best wishes and heartful Congratulations to Bishop elect Richard Reidy of our Diocese, who was our Diocese Vicar General. He was recently appointed the Bishop of Norwich in Connecticut and will be consecrated and installed on April 29 at St. Patrick's Cathedral in Norwich, Ct.

It can be anyone and we can pray to Our Lord through Mary, asking special blessing on them. 





LENTEN REGULATIONS:

1) Abstinence on all the Fridays of Lent, and on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. • No meat may be eaten on days of abstinence. Catholics 14 years and older are bound to abstain from meat. Elderly, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt. 2) Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. • Fasting means having only one full meal to maintain one's strength. Two smaller, meatless and penitential meals are permitted according to one's needs, but they should not together equal the one full meal. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics from age 18 through age 59 are bound to fast.
