PART TWO: DARE TO DREAM

Hello, St. Luke family!

If we return to our story from last week's bulletin article, we have Samuel and the high priest Eli. Samuel had never heard the voice of the Lord before; so when the Lord began calling him in his sleep, he thought the voice to be Eli's. But Eli tells him, "I did not call you. Go back to sleep."

So Samuel returns to his sleep. But soon, he is awoken once more by the Lord, whose voice Samuel does not know. So again he jumps up, runs to Eli, and says, "Here I am. You called me." But Eli did not call him. This happened a third time, and finally Eli realized that this was the Lord calling.

So Eli tells Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." And Samuel, with perplexity, returns to his place to sleep... and he dares to dream.

We too, as a people of God, even if we have learned how to dream — in silence, in prayerfulness, and thoughtfulness, and hopefulness — there is still the necessary task of daring to dream.

To dream is daring because it has no limits. The moment we surrender our wills to the Will of the God for whom nothing is impossible... is the milestone moment, the bookmark by which we measure all things — before the dream or after the dream.

To dare to dream takes vulnerability and openness; our wills must become like Jericho — our walls of comfort tumbling to the ground.

To dare to dream takes generosity; it takes a spirit by which we hold nothing back, a spirit like Mary's that pours out even the most expensive of oils to honor the Lord.

To dare to dream takes courage, fortitude — the gift of the Holy Spirit by which we do what we know to be God's will, even when it is most difficult.

So I ask again: Will you dare to dream? Will you dare to dream with me of the most incredible and most amazing future... without fear, without constraint, without limits?

For if our God is with us, which He is, then what could possibly stand against us?

Blessing of a Christmas Manger or Nativity Scene

In its present form, the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223.

The blessing of the Christmas manger or nativity scene may take place on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time.

When the manger is set up in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another family member.



All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord. R/. Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example:

Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Luke: 2:1-8

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be enrolled, each to his own town. And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

Now there were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock.

Or Isaiah 7:10-15 — The birth of Emmanuel.

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord. R/. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The leader prays with hands joined:

God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love: when our need for a Savior was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary.

To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord,

bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus.

and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever. R/. Amen.



FATHER DAVID

Dear friends,

A joyful Christmas to you! In spite of the disastrous year that 2020 has been in so many ways, each of us can still have joy in our hearts. How is this possible? It is because our joy doesn't ultimately come from our earthly wishes coming true, or from everything going our way, but from the fact that Jesus has come our way, and not only stopped by to visit, but actually stayed to live with us! Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us, the Word who became flesh and made His dwelling among us!!!! If we realize that God is truly with us, we can have a deep and abiding joy and peace no matter what, whether in good times or in times of great suffering.

I apologize that I have not written in the bulletin for so long. The truth is that since October 1 I have had a hard time knowing what words to write. At times, I have been at a loss for what to say; at other times, I had so much on my heart that I was overwhelmed at the task of organizing those thoughts into an article, or even into words at all. I am grateful to Fr. Jared for allowing me to go on a short retreat to the Sister Servants of the Eternal Word in Irondale, AL, followed by two weeks of vacation in VA/NC/TN at the end of November. It was much needed, as you might imagine. I return to you hopefully more filled with joy and peace than before. I pray that you also will receive that gift of Jesus' true and lasting joy and peace today and throughout this Christmas season.

Thank you to all who have given me notes or gifts of encouragement during these past difficult months, around my birthday, and during this Christmas season. Each token of your appreciation and love gave me great encouragement, lifted my spirits, and kept me reminded of how we are truly a family here at St. Luke and how God put me right here at St. Luke for just such a time and situation as this (which I have never doubted). I look forward to a much brighter year, as Archbishop Aymond has declared a Year of the Eucharist in our archdiocese, and Pope Francis has proclaimed a Year of St. Joseph for the Church throughout the world! I can't wait to spend this new year with y'all!

For us as Catholics, the Christmas season only begins on Christmas Day. Then we have the octave of Christmas, where every day for 8 days (with Christmas as Day 1) we celebrate as though each day were Christmas Day! Culturally, even if not liturgically, you can of course extend that to the 12 Days of Christmas. Liturgically (at least in the Ordinary Form calendar) the Christmas season extends to Sunday, January 10, the Baptism of the Lord. And if, like me, you need your Christmas to last as long as possible to purge the ghost of 2020, you can be like my family and leave your decorations up until February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas (the end of the Christmas season on the old calendar). (Then come get your throat blessed at Mass on February 3, the feast of St. Blaise; you and I will likely be hoarse after a month of singing Christmas carols in the cold.)

Let the Christ Child into your heart today. Do not push Him away by ignoring the homeless, the needy, or the isolated and lonely. Do not crowd Him out (on His own birthday!) by being too busy to take extra time to pray today, contemplating the great gift Jesus is to your life. In the dark, cold stable, Jesus Himself was the light and warmth! Let His light and warmth radiate through you today and throughout this season. Share His joy with others, and let them share it with you! Merry Christmas!



LECTIO: PHILIPPIANS

Towards the end of his life, under arrest and awaiting trial in Rome, Saint Paul writes a short but powerful letter to the Philippians. In six sessions, Dr. Tim Gray combines insight and practical guidance using the lectio divina disciplines to make the Scriptures come alive in *Philippians: Life in Christ.*

THERE IS NO COST TO PARTICIPATE

This 6 week bible study on the life of Christ taken from the book of Philippians is part of the **Lectio** Study Series which will help participants to discover the profound importance, meaning, purpose, and beauty of Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. The Latin word **lectio** means "reading" and often refers to a careful and prayerful reading of Scripture.

Lectio Divina is an ancient practice of enhancing one's prayer life through the power of God's Word.

The term itself means "divine reading" of the Sacred Scriptures. It is our hope that by using these simple steps each day as we study Sacred Scripture in LECTIO, we will develop an effective way to study and pray with God's Word and hear God's voice in their daily lives.

- Sacred Reading of the Scriptures (lectio): The reading and rereading of the Scripture passage, with close attention to words, details, themes, and patterns that speak to you.
- **Meditation (meditatio):** Meditating or reflecting on what you've read to gain understanding. Allow the Holy Spirit to guide you as you spend time pondering what you have read and striving to understand it in meditation.
- **Prayer (oratio):** A time to bring your meditative thoughts to God in prayer. Talk with God about how the connections and implications of your meditation on the Scripture affect your life and the lives of those around you.
