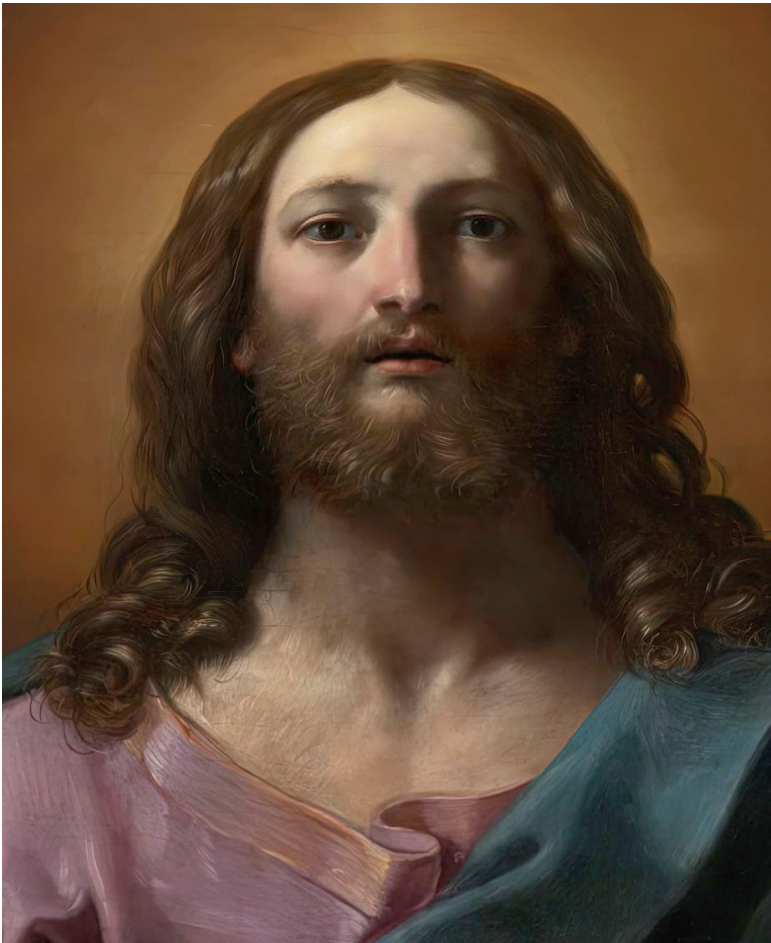

FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, St. Luke family!

I am writing to you after an awesome FIRE night. WOW. When we dreamed about our parish's future last year (remember the "Discern the Dream" survey?) I don't think any of us could have imagined how overflowing God's blessings would be. Over 400 people (!) from the young to the young at heart - came together to share their time with God tonight, and I am still amazed. You have no idea how happy it makes me to see us fill up the whole campus with smiling faces who want to know the Lord - *and want Him to know them!*

As I was walking back to the rectory, I was thinking about the coming elections and all the political unrest in our country, about the people in my parish family who have come to see me about the struggles in their relationships, and all the work that lies in the week ahead - and that led me to thinking about the point of our FIRE night: **PEACE**.

We are such *un-peaceful* people, aren't we? It's not because we are bad, it's because we are very *good*. Our souls are precious to God, and spiritual battles happen around us all the time, because God loves us. St. Francis de Salle said, *"The devil does his utmost to banish peace from one's heart, because he knows that God abides in peace and it is in peace that He accomplishes great things."* When our hearts are stressed and anxious, it's because the battle for our peace is being waged. If we want to be spiritual warriors, we have to recognize that the first goal of combat is not to always obtain a victory but to learn to maintain peace of heart under all circumstances, even in defeat. You are a tabernacle. The Lord abides in you. Protect the peace that lies within you by working to develop a confidence in God: Psalms 8 and 9 prayed together are a beautiful reality of why God is worthy to be trusted and encourage our confidence in His saving power and love. Keep a gratitude journal - a place where you write down a sentence or two each day about the blessings you've received. Come to daily Mass as often as you can. Come to Confession once a month. These things protect the peace in us even when the world around us feels chaotic.

But what happens when we feel *un-peaceful*? I know that when I am *un-peaceful*, I can feel all my relationships and work going off the cliff of my worries and concerns. To restore my peace, I have to remind myself that God acts in the *peace* of my soul, and that the pain of that *un-peacefulness* is actually wounded pride. I have to reconnect with the LOVE that in confidence says, *God loves me*. Even as difficult as this is, I have a God worthy of my trust and love. I have to abandon myself to *His* love. After being sick, I wrote these words, "I know that You are God. At Your table, at Your altar, I know You are God. Beneath Your cross, beneath Your tomb, I know you are God. Be Still. Be Still. I know that You are God." And suddenly, He was there, with me, reclaiming not just my peace but ME.

"Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid"
(John 14:27).

The great saints never look at us and say that we are foolish for being anxious, but they do constantly remind us that all the things that create sadness, fear, and discouragement in us are nothing compared to the ocean of love in the Lord. Sickness, or broken relationships, or the fears of work or life - these things are going to happen - but God's love is capable of using them to make us incredible deposits of peace in which He can do amazing things. St. John of the Cross said, *"Love is able to profit from everything, the good as well as the bad that It finds in me, and to transform it into Itself."* St. Catherine of Siena would pray, *"Holy Spirit, come into my heart; draw it to Thee by Thy power, O my God, and grant me charity with filial fear. Preserve me, O beautiful love, from every evil thought; warm me, inflame me with Thy dear love, and every pain will seem light to me."*

It is not our exterior circumstances that must change for peace to abide in us, but our hearts. God may cause me to lack in many material ways, but He will never leave me wanting of Himself or of His assistance. And I trust in Him -

Because **HE** is my peace.

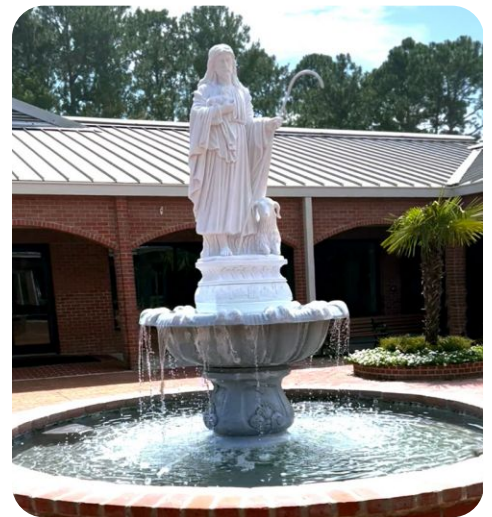

He answered,

Then he said to them,

"Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

FAITH FORMATION 6

THE BIBLE AT CORE OF CATHOLIC BELIEFS

People ask if everything Catholics believe is found in the Bible. The answer? Both “yes” and “no.” The Church “does not derive her certainty about all revealed truths from the Holy Scriptures alone” (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC 82] (Dei Verbum 9). Jesus is the ultimate Source of everything Catholics believe, for he reveals God’s plan to save the world from sin as he reveals the Father’s love. Jesus does this because he is the Son of God. He is always united with his Father and thus is the fullness of both Revelation.

The mission of Jesus continues through the ministry of the Church that he founded, and he has given the Church the inspiration of the Holy Spirit for guidance in everything. The Revelation of Jesus is thus extended to the Apostles and handed on through two means: Sacred Scripture and Tradition.

Sacred Scripture is the inspired word of God, the collection of sacred books that hand on the truth of Revelation in written form.

Tradition, as understood by the Church, is more than a collection of customs or time-honored habits. It encompasses

the Church’s teaching, life and worship. The living apostolic Tradition highlights the fact that the Apostles received the words and deeds of Jesus who passed on the authority to teach in his name. “Tradition transmits, in its entirety, the Word of God which has been entrusted to the apostles by Christ the Lord and the Holy Spirit” [CCC 81] (Dei Verbum 9).

The Bible reveals that God fulfilled his saving plan of love to free us from sin. The culmination of the entire Bible are the words and deeds of Jesus, in particular his Passion, death and glorious Resurrection.

The beliefs of Catholics are found in the Bible in two ways: explicit and implicit. Some teachings of the Catholic Church are easily found in the Bible. For example, that Jesus is the Son of God, that he called twelve Apostles to follow him, that he healed, forgave sins, proclaimed the Kingdom of God present in his person, and that he suffered, died and rose again for our sins, are all very explicit in the Bible. The Holy Spirit makes known the full meaning of these events in and through the Church, and makes the power of these events effective throughout history and in our lives today.

Some beliefs are more hidden. Love loves to hide secrets, so that when we find them we are enraptured even more by their beauty. The mystery of Jesus is so profound that sometimes you have to look closely to see all the parts that he has made known. The Holy Spirit has hidden some dimensions of the mission of Jesus in the Bible. The truths of faith are clarified by the Tradition through the Magisterium, the Church’s authentic teaching office. These truths never contradict the Word of God in Scripture, but serve to articulate its truth more clearly.

The Holy Spirit helps us to find and to articulate these mysteries. The teaching on the Trinity, that is, that there are three Persons in one God, is found in the Bible in the many instances where Jesus speaks about his relationship with the Father and the Holy Spirit. The terms that the Church needed to express this mystery were given to her over several hundred years by the same Holy Spirit that inspired the Gospel writers as they wrote of the words of Jesus that revealed the mystery in the first place. The Church’s teachings about the Blessed Mother, the saints, the role of virtue and holiness are found in the Bible implicitly in varying degrees.
