FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, St. Luke family!

I spend a lot of time talking to you about Eucharistic Adoration. I plead with you to come. I plead with you to bring your husband or your wife. I plead with you to bring your babies, your adult children, your teenagers, and your little ones. I plead with you to bring your elderly parents. I suppose I spend a lot of time pleading with you to come and see Jesus.

But I do that because I know how life-changing time with our Eucharistic Lord can be. I myself grew up adoring our Lord with my dad every Monday at 5 pm. And, without realizing it, the Lord gently pursued me, formed me, and formed in me a capacity to love Him... and to love Him deeply.

I talk to you about coming to see Him, because I want you to know how passionately He pursues you - He looks for you, He listens for you - because you matter more to Him than to anyone else. I want you to experience the forgiveness, the gentleness, and the compassion He pours out for love of us. I want you to come to the Adoration Chapel and experience the power of His presence there, and to find the peace in the still silence of being before Him as He wraps His love around you. I want you to feel that He KNOWS your burden, your sadness, your worry, your fear - and He is in the middle of it, weaving a tender, beautiful blanket of mercy and hope around you. I want you to know that if you're sick or dying, that you are not sick or dying alone - Jesus is there, allowing you to lean in to His tender heart and know that no matter how it plays out, you will be with Him always.

I want you to know that all the tears you've shed for love of your children are mixed in with His tears and His love for you and them. I want you to know that all the joy that you bring to Him when you come to adore Him is like the best Christmas morning. I want you to know that when you just sit in the Adoration Chapel, He just sits there with you, happy to be near you, waiting for you to speak to Him.

I preach on the power of the Eucharist, because It has transformed my life - and I have seen It transform the lives of countless others. I preach His ability to hold marriages together. But I preach His ability to help you find your recovery or forgiveness when the divorce is final, too. I preach the wisdom He provides to help you raise children, but I also preach His tender Sacred Heart when you're struggling to deal with an estranged son or daughter. I preach to you about His magnificent strength in the midst of the storm - but I also preach to you about His tenderness in the quietness.

It's a shock to me when someone says to me, "I can't commit to taking an Adoration Hour, Father. I just don't have time."

I've made those excuses, too. But what could possibly be more important, more necessary than coming to see Jesus?

For those of you who make the time to see our Lord in the Adoration Chapel, THANK YOU. You console Jesus, and you help others through your prayers.

I hope I'll see you at the appreciation dinner on January 30, 2023, at 7 pm in the Family Life Center. Please bring your spouses.

For those who have not yet been able to avail yourself of time spent with Jesus in Adoration, I urge you to take the plunge. Head on in there. There's nothing to fear. Your life will never be the same.

READING 1: Is 8:23 - 9:3

First the Lord degraded the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali; but in the end he has glorified the seaward road, the land west of the Jordan, the District of the Gentiles. Anguish has taken wing, dispelled is darkness: for there is no gloom where but now there was distress. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing, as they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as people make merry when dividing spoils. For the yoke that burdened them, the pole on their shoulder, and the rod of their taskmaster you have smashed, as on the day of Midian.

READING 2: 1 Cor 1:10-13, 17

I urge you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose. For it has been reported to me about you, my brothers and sisters, by Chloe's people, that there are rivalries among you. I mean that each of you is saying, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ."

INTRODUCING OUR VISITING PRIESTS: FR. KURT YOUNG

Fr. Kurt R. Young is a priest of the Archdiocese of New Orleans. He grew up in St. Edward the Confessor Parish in Metairie, LA, and graduated from Archbishop Rummel High School. After completing one year of studies at Louisiana State University, he went on to graduate from college seminary at St. Joseph Seminary College in St. Benedict, LA. Fr. Young spent four years in formation for priesthood at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans and received a Masters in Divinity (2012). Following his seminary formation, Fr. Young went on to receive his Doctorate in Ministry in Preaching from Aquinas Institute of Theology in St. Louis, MO (2021). Fr. Young was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of New Orleans on June 2, 2012.

Throughout his more than decade-long ministry as a priest, Fr. Young served as Parochial Vicar of St. Philip Neri Parish in Metairie, LA, as well as the Director of Vocations for the Archdiocese of New Orleans for five years. In 2019, Fr. Young was granted permission to serve as a Chaplain in the United States Navy Reserve and was mobilized to Camp Lemonnier in Djibouti, Africa, for seven and a half months in 2022. Fr. Young is a Lieutenant (O-3) in the United States Navy, currently serving as a member of the Religious Support at Marine Forces Reserve in Algiers, LA.

Fr. Young joined the faculty of Notre Dame Seminary in 2019 as a Formation Advisor and the Director of Human Formation. He currently serves as the Vice-Rector of Propaedeutic Formation/Coordinator of Human Formation, and he is the Director of Homiletics and Preaching.

While Fr. Kurt was Director of Vocations for our Archdiocese, he wrote the following reflection about a day in the life of a priest.

Never are two days exactly alike in the life of a priest. From baptisms to funerals to weddings to daily masses to anointings of the sick, a priest is required to offer up himself and his time to serve the people of God in whatever way he is needed. St. Paul tells us, "I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some." (1 Cor 9:22b) Indeed, a priest is called to be all things to all people because he is working for the salvation of souls.

That being said, I would not trade being a priest for anything in the world. From the day that I was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ, I have had the privilege and the opportunity to be present in people's lives in a way that is unprecedented in any other walk of life, and for that blessing, I am very appreciative. There are times when the mission of priesthood seems unrealistic or overwhelming, but in those moments, Christ always finds a way to fill up what is lacking in each of us and to remind us that it is not us, the priest, that people are seeking, but it is Christ, in the person of the priest, that people seek.

A priest's life is generally composed of four areas, sometimes referred to as the four pillars of priestly formation—Human, Spiritual, Academic, and Pastoral—the combination of which might vary from time to time.

I begin my day with prayer and I end my day with prayer, these are two bookends that cannot be negotiated. Prayer is the key to fulfilling the mission of Christ and his Church as a priest, and every priest makes a commitment to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, which is an ancient prayer of the Church that is prayed five times throughout the day—at morning, at midday, at evening, and at night, along with an office devoted to lengthier readings of scripture and writings of the saints. In addition to the Liturgy of the Hours, a priest must be rooted in his own private prayer, which is the fuel for one's personal relationship with God.

Prayer, is of course the Spiritual Pillar, but outside of prayer, there is a need to labor in the vineyard of the Lord, that is to do ministry. This ministry would be known as the Pastoral Pillar. After I begin my day with prayer, I then walk over to the office to greet the secretaries and the money counters and anyone else that is present. I then return emails and phone calls and create a "game-plan" for my day, based on what needs to be accomplished. Sometimes I have to immediately run to an anointing of the sick, other times I celebrate Mass in the nursing home around the corner. Some days I might spend a bit of time working on my homily preparation for the weekend, other days I might have meeting after meeting with people who are looking for some spiritual guidance and help.

In the evenings, after having celebrated daily Mass in the parish and having attended to all the aspects of ministry to



which a priest must attend, I take some time for personal recreation and physical maintenance, otherwise known as the Human Pillar. Sometimes this takes the form of visiting with friends and catching up, other times this takes the form of physical exercise or sports. Whatever the case may be, I try to fit in some time for personal growth and development.

Finally, the area of a priest's life that is oftentimes the most difficult to make time for but is also the most fruitful is the Academic area. I try to have a book, whether on a theological topic or a spiritual topic or a world event, that I work through at my own pace.

No one day is ever the same.
