



FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, St. Luke family,

As you know, our awesome seminarian, Seth Smith, has been doing some letters to our community in this spot so that we can learn a little about what it means to go through the formation process to become a priest. Here's the third installment of a four part series about the importance of learning philosophy as we prepare to become priests - and as lay people become great leaders in their lives and families, too! PHILOSOPHY FOR BEGINNERS - PART 3

Introduction

Last week, we talked about epistemology and anthropology. I defined epistemology as an explanation of how we can know reality or a "school of thought." I defined anthropology as the study of the human person. This week, I will be talking about two more subjects in philosophy. The first subject I will explain is called metaphysics, and the second subject I will explain is called philosophy of God. Once again, I will be using my lecture notes from Dr. James Jacobs, and also his book Seat of Wisdom: An Introduction to Philosophy in the Catholic Tradition. I also just wanted to say thank you for all of the positive feedback on these articles, and I hope you continue to enjoy them. Please ask me more questions if you have them!

Metaphysics

Aristotle's first sentence in his book on metaphysics is, "all men by nature desire understanding." As humans, we desire to know the whole of reality. We are not satisfied with part of the truth, we want to know the whole truth. The definition of metaphysics is the study of being qua (as) being. It allows us to know the reality behind the appearance. In other words, it allows us to know the whole truth about the invisible reality that underlies existence. Being is the principle of unity that underlies the intelligible order of the cosmos. St. Thomas Aquinas defines being as "the actuality of all acts and the perfection of all perfections." I wish that I could talk about metaphysics more fully, but there is just way too much to explain in a short article. Instead, I will focus on metaphysics as the foundation by which we are able to approach God through reason.



you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn.""

[He proposed another parable to them.
"The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed
that a person took and sowed in a field.
It is the smallest of all the seeds,
yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants.
It becomes a large bush,
and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches."

He spoke to them another parable.

until the whole batch was leavened."

All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet: I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world.

Then, dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."



Metaphysics is a method by which one can approach God and ultimately prove His existence through the use of reason. Metaphysics leads to God because it is the study of being, and God is being itself. In Exodus 3:14, Moses asks God for His name, and God says, "I AM WHO AM." This verse provides tons of information about who God is, but it ultimately asserts that God is being itself. So, of course the study of being would lead to God who is being itself! Metaphysics allows us to talk about God in public debate because it is not based on faith alone. Faith is a subjective belief, so arguing for the existence of God based on faith alone in the public sphere is irrelevant. Metaphysics is necessary because it creates a harmony between faith and reason. We can come to know that God exists through reason alone. As St. Thomas Aquinas says, God only reveals Himself to us for the sake of our salvation and so that we can come to know him more fitly and more surely. Faith is not necessary to know that God exists, but He gives it to us so that not only a few would know Him.

Philosophy of God

Philosophy of God is the subject of coming to know that God exists through reason. It is also known as natural theology. In order to talk about this subject fully, we have to return to Ancient Greece. The Greeks had two questions that motivated their philosophy. The first question is "What is the world made of?" The second question is "Why do things change?" The first question is a philosophical question, and the second question is a religious question. In regards to the first question, the Greeks believed the world to be eternal because they were stuck with the inescapable logical principle: ex nihilo, nihil fit (from nothing, nothing can be made). They thought that it was impossible for something to come from nothing. This impacted their view of the gods or God because they viewed the gods as immanent (only acting in the world)

BLAZE NIGHTS ARE THE BEST PLACE FOR AN ADULT OR A FAMILY TO BECOME CATHOLIC

If you or someone you love would like to talk about questions they have about the Catholic faith or on becoming Catholic, our BLAZE nights are just the place.

We live in a secular culture that constantly bombards us with subtle messages that tell us we aren't good enough, we don't have enough, and that we need something new to make us happy. But having more is never completely satisfying. When we start searching for deeper meaning and purpose, we often discover a spiritual world inside ourselves that we had never explored before. And that usually creates a longing inside our hearts to know God better, but how do we know where to find the truth?

The decision to embrace Catholicism entails more than adopting a new set of beliefs or following certain practices. It's about choosing to join a family that has known God for more than 4000 years. It's discovering the love that was always meant for you and finding a place where you can be



truly known, truly seen, understood, and belong - so your light can truly shine.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is a series of steps in which someone who isn't Catholic or has been away from the Church since Baptism or another sacrament can ask questions about the faith, and as they go along, develop a spiritual formation that deepens prayer, helps them discover the purpose of their lives and relationships, and take a closer walk with Christ. It's perfect for a spouse who isn't Catholic or for someone who wants to consider the Catholic faith for themselves. Throughout the process, there is never any pressure to convert: God never imposes - He proposes. So, our process is always laid back and patient.

Designed specifically for our parish, BLAZE takes the Order of Christian Initiation and makes it totally interactive, since it's built around having dinner and conversations with people who can really answer your questions from the heart of the Church and their own personal encounters with Jesus.

Every journey through OCIA is unique, however the process usually takes about a year so that you can adequately prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Communion, and/or Confirmation.) Once they reach the end of the formation process, adults or children in need of baptism (or other sacraments they may have missed,) can receive their sacraments on Easter Vigil at one of the most beautiful Masses of the liturgical year.

WHO GOES TO BLAZE NIGHTS?

Anyone seriously asking questions about the Faith or becoming Catholic and any family preparing for a sacrament

- Families who have or will be having a baby or child needing Baptism
- Families who have a child preparing for First Holy Communion
- Families who have an adolescent preparing for Confirmation
- Couples preparing for marriage
- Anyone who would like to revisit the core beliefs of the Church - even if you have received all your sacraments!

WHEN ARE BLAZE NIGHTS AND HOW ARE THEY RELATED TO FIRE (FAMILY INVOLVED RELIGIOUS EDUCATION)?

Blaze nights are a deeper level of FIRE nights designed for the preparation of sacraments. Just like FIRE nights, dinner is provided and only happen once a month on Sunday following the 4 pm Mass. So, if you are part of BLAZE, you attend two nights a month (FIRE nights AND BLAZE nights.)

When it comes to being formed in the faith, there is no age limit. All parishioners should be involved in faith formation. And this formation is only made possible by (1) the inspiration of God and (2) the fueling of other parishioners in our parish family. There are a few different ways that one can "Fuel the FIRE."

SPIRITUAL FUEL

Although all fuelers are important, this is by far the most important. Those who are willing to provide spiritual fuel are asked to sign up to be an official intercessor of our FIRE program. An intercessor is someone who prays and offers sacrifices on behalf of another. The good news is: You can be an intercessor no matter where you are! Whether you are confined to your home or are able to drive to our adoration chapel, any and everyone is welcome to sign up as a spiritual fuel-er!

Here are your opportunities for helping us:

- Pray daily for a deeper love and faithfulness to our Lord for yourself and for everyone in our parish.
- Offer up small sacrifices -- like we do during Lent -- for those in our program.
- Pray from home or in our adoration chapel specifically during the time of our FIRE Nights.

FIRE is more than simply one night of formation or catechesis. It is a wholistic parish program by which we grow and are formed. The program is designed to help every member of your family grow not only in faith but in family life, strengthening the bonds of love between parents and kids. Our FIRE Nights are for Saint Luke families of all sizes and ages who want to learn to how to be truly Catholic. FIRE is about empowering parents and grandparents to become the best catechists of their children and grandchildren.

FIRE Nights are the primary focus of the year meant to bring together the entire parish family in an ongoing formation process. These nights occur monthly and are approximately 2 hours long. A typical night includes dinner, fun activities, ageappropriate breakout sessions, and a chance for all the members of your family to learn about a particular faith topic. That way, when you head home, everyone has something to share!

WHAT'S A FIRE YEAR LIKE?

IGNight! is the first FIRE Night on September 17, 2023, following the 4 pm Sunday Mass. It's a pump-up night to start off the new year of formation right with an overview of all that will take place in this year of parish formation. Subsequent FIRE Nights follow the same pattern (see the calendar to prepare for the year!)

BLAZE Nights are for those families preparing for a sacrament - First Communion, Confirmation, and for those joining the Church! BLAZE NIGHT** will be held August 27, 2023, following the 4 pm Mass. Those members of our parish who are part of **BLAZE** attend both **FIRE** and **BLAZE** Nights (a total of two nights a month.) 


