

PHILOSOPHY FOR BEGINNERS - PART 4

Introduction

Well, we've finally made it to the fourth part of the series. I would say I am sad that the series has come to an end, but you guys have loved it so much that I've decided to make a part 5! I am excited for this part because it is about two of my favorite subjects in philosophy. The first subject is called ethics, and the second subject is called political philosophy. As usual, I will be using my lecture notes from Dr. James Jacobs, and I am also using his book Seat of Wisdom: An Introduction to Philosophy in the Catholic Tradition. Both of these topics are really interesting, so let's get started!

Ethics

Ethics is definitely one of my favorite topics to talk about in philosophy. Before we talk about what ethics actually is, it is important to explain the term good in a philosophical context. Aristotle defines the good as "that which all desire." All human acts are motivated by a desire to possess some good. For example, I work hard on my studies because I desire to grow in wisdom and knowledge. The good is essentially the standard or meaning for acting. Given this, the subject of ethics is ultimately the search for a universal definition of the good as a standard for human acts or actions.

Ethics is defined as the formal study of codes of behavior. Ethics is not to be confused with morality. Morality is a personal code of behavior, but ethics is the study of those codes of behavior. We need ethics because everyone's code of morality is different. For example, some people view euthanasia as intrinsically evil, while others view it as a human right. This is a problem because the same thing cannot be both good and bad at the same time. If everyone just used their own morality to evaluate human actions, then society would be chaos because everyone has a different morality. We need ethics because morality alone does not work. Ethics analyzes all of the codes of conduct, but its goal is to find the best one.

There are two fundamental reasons why human beings do things. The first is simply "I wanted to," and the second is "I thought I should." This implies that human nature has both appetites (desires, feelings, sentiments) and reason. Some philosophers argue that human acts are based only on desire or appetite for pleasure or to attain happiness. Other philosophers argue that human acts are based only



on reason, specifically their moral duty to the law. Both of these approaches are inadequate because it divides what people want (happiness) from what they ought to do (fulfill the moral law). The truth is that human acts arise out of both appetites and reason, so the best definition of the good must be that which allows you to attain happiness through fulfilling the moral law. This is the logic that is at the heart of St. Thomas Aquinas's theory of natural law.

St. Thomas's natural law theory is very complex, but I will try to explain it very simply and briefly. The eternal law is the order of creation as determined by God, or the application of providence in creation. This is important because St. Thomas defines the natural law as a rational creature's participation in the eternal law. The natural law is specific to humans because we are the only creatures who have reason. Humans can participate in the eternal law through the natural law because we have reason. There are three different "levels of precepts" in the natural law. The first are the primary precepts which are self-evident to all or in itself, the secondary precepts are the immediate conclusions from the primary precepts, and the tertiary precepts are the concrete applications of the secondary precepts. St. Thomas says that the most basic principle which is the basis for how things ought to be done is, "do good and avoid evil." This is his definition of the good. He says this principle is evident to all people for how things should be done. Something can also be self-evident in itself, but not to all. He says this in regards to man's good. Once you know that man is a rational animal, then it is self-evident what his goods must be. As a being, man is perfected by the preservation of his own existence (survival). As an animal, man is perfected by reproduction and raising offspring (duty to uphold the family). As rational, man is perfected by seeking the ultimate truth (God) and living in society. Hence, man's end is to grow in wisdom and love by knowing God and loving others. The immediate conclusions of this can be found in the Ten Commandments. The Ten Commandments provide HOW to know and love God and HOW to live in society. The first three commandments provide how to know and love God, and the last seven commandments provide how to love others while living in society. These precepts are the general rules, but they have to be applied in certain circumstances. There are different situations that occur which require the rule to be applied. This can be difficult, so it requires the virtue of prudence. Prudence allows you to best judge a circumstance and determine how the natural law should be applied. Overall, reason allows us to know these precepts of the natural law so that we can obtain happiness through fulfilling the moral law.

Political Philosophy

Why do we need to cover political philosophy? We need to do political philosophy because as Aristotle says, "man is by nature a political animal." As I have said before, man has a human nature which has an end or "final cause." Things exist for a purpose. For example, the final cause of an apple tree is to grow apples. Man also exists for a purpose, and he has an end. Man's end or final cause is ultimately happiness. According to Aristotle, happiness is the rational activity of the

soul in accord with virtue. Man's function is to be rational in the most excellent way (through virtue). Happiness also has two forms of criteria for Aristotle. It is an end in itself, which means that everything else is a means to obtaining it, and it is self-sufficient, which means that nothing can be added to it. In order for us to attain happiness, it is necessary for us to live in society. We cannot grow in wisdom and love by ourselves; we need other people to help us grow and to attain happiness. It is also important to note that a person exists for something beyond themself. Politics exists for the sake of the common good of all people and to direct us all toward our end. Man's ultimate end is the Beatific Vision (union with God), so politics should always be something that is an aid to helping us attain that.

In order to better understand why we need political philosophy, we need to talk some more about Aristotle. Aristotle came up with something called the four causes. The four causes are called material cause, formal cause, efficient cause, and final cause. In order to explain what the four causes mean, I will use the example of a statue. Material cause is what something is made of, so this would be the wood of the statue. Formal cause is what something is, so the formal cause would be that it is a statue. Efficient cause is where something came from. The efficient cause of the statue then would be the carpenter who made the statue. Finally, the final cause is the purpose for which something is or acts. The final cause of the statue is that it is beautiful. The four causes are very important to understanding Aristotle's philosophy. They are also very important to political philosophy because these four causes apply to politics as well.

St. Thomas Aquinas' definition of law is very influenced by Aristotle and his four causes. St. Thomas Aquinas defines law as an ordinance of reason promulgated by the proper authority for the common good. Let's try to break down this definition into the four causes.

The final cause of the polis (the ideal city or state) is the common good. There is a twofold meaning of the word good here. There is a temporal good of society which refers to man as an individual who lives in society in order to meet his basic needs. There is also an eternal good that refers to man as a person who lives in society because of his dignity and the need to share wisdom and love with others in order to attain his end which is union with God in the Beatific Vision.

The formal cause of the polis is the natural law. As I said before, there is a structure and rules that one needs to follow in order for man to attain his end. This structure is the natural law. The natural law is based on reason that informs the people in the society how to maintain justice (giving to each person what is owed to them). Earlier, I mentioned that there are concrete applications of the natural law that we need prudence for in order to determine how the natural law should be applied. This is

why we need positive law or civil law to guide us so that we can attain our end. Positive law should only be based


on reason and the natural law.

The material cause of the polis is the people or society itself. It is the thing that is being formed by the formal cause (natural law) for the final cause (common good). The material cause in its perfect form is what Jacques Maritain calls the "body politic." The body politic is the whole of political or civil society. It is a work of reason and will ordered to the common good.

Lastly, the efficient cause of the polis is the state or the government. The state has three primary functions in its authority. The first function is the paternal function because of the idea that children need discipline, and it arises out of a deficiency in a person to attain happiness. The second function is called the essential function which is united action. Man has an end, but there are several different ways to attain it. This is why authority is necessary because the more freedom you have, the more you need authority. The third function is called the most essential function which is the united will. There needs to be a community of will where everyone intends the common good materially (as individuals) and formally (as persons). This function requires the virtue of obedience in respect to authority.






