

## FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, Saint Luke Family!

Next week, I'll be talking to the ladies, but for this weekend, this is for the dudes. If you missed Mass, and your wife or girlfriend, daughter or friend, hands this to you, <u>read it</u>. There's going to be a test. This article is about what the women in your life would like you, the husband/dad/son/brother/boyfriend, to know. It might be a hard truth; but as your spiritual father, I need to tell you.

The Gospel this week is pretty harsh: first, because it's one of the last parables Jesus tells before His death. It calls out the leaders of the people of God who are turning against Him for demanding that they be generous with their faith, their time, and their love. And second, it's tough, because it's a warning for us, the men of the Church - priests and deacons (the men of the Church as a whole), and for you, (the men of your Domestic Church - your families.) To understand this weekend's Gospel, you're going to need to read Isaiah 5:1-7. It's so important, I'm adding it here:

Now let me sing of my friend, my beloved's song about his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside; He spaded it, cleared it of stones; and planted the choicest vines; Within it he built a watchtower, and hewed out a wine press. Then he waited for the crop of grapes, but it yielded rotten grapes. Now, inhabitants of Jerusalem, people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard: What more could be done for my vineyard that I did not do? Why, when I waited for the crop of grapes, did it yield rotten grapes? Now, I will let you know what I am going to do to my vineyard: Take away its hedge, give it to grazing, break through its wall, let it be trampled! Yes, I will make it a ruin: it shall not be pruned or hoed, but will be overgrown with thorns and briers; I will command the clouds not to rain upon it. The vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, the people of Judah, his cherished plant; He waited for judgment, but see, bloodshed! for justice, but hark, the outcry!"

God's prophet tells the story of the "vineyard" about 700 years before Jesus was born. This is the key to deciphering the parable Jesus tells the priests, scribes, and leaders of His day in this weekend's Gospel. The "vineyard" is the people of God, and responsibility of this vineyard is entrusted to us -- not simply the hierarchy -- but all of us who are called to lead in His name. From us, He expects mercy, prayer, and forgiveness. When those men were listening to Jesus talking about the vineyard, they knew exactly what He meant: when we fail to love as we ought, we fail in our God-given responsibility, and we let the vineyard that is the Church and is our families die.

This message is not simply for ancient Jews, nor only for disciples of Jesus in His day. This message is directed at me, at you; it is directed at every man entrusted with the tremendous blessing of leading in His name. You and I, we may look out at the vineyard entrusted to us... and it may seem fruitful, and abundant, and flourishing. But true leaders over the vineyard are entrusted with more than overseeing. We are called to direct its tending, to water it, to care for it, to nurture it, to guard and protect it.

I love my vineyard, my parish family, as I'm sure you love your vineyard -- your wife, your girlfriend, your daughter, your sister, your friend, your ministry. But Christ reminds us today that loving them includes tending to their spiritual needs, watering them with the Sacraments, caring for their spiritual growth, guarding their souls with prayer, protecting them with spiritual sacrifices. This is our primary role as spiritual leaders of our vineyards.

So when we see our vineyards a mess, or torn apart, or withering, or dieing, we cannot afford for someone else to tend to it. That's on us. Being leaders in spending time in adoration, being leaders in fasting and sacrifice, being leaders in the things of God -- this is how we respond rightly to the call of the Lord, who has granted us a share in tending His vineyard. And when we fall to respond, the vineyard is destined to die.

Men, this is my invitation to you, my challenge, a call to action: let us begin anew, let us begin today to become the leaders of our vineyards, to become the men we are called to be. Let us become the men that women need us to be. And let us begin today.

## FAITH FORMATION 6

#### The Newest Statue on Saint Luke's Campus: OUR LADY OF LA VANG Statue

The newest image of our Lady on the Saint Luke campus was donated by some generous Vietnamese parishioners, and it now greets guests as they enter our Adoration Chapel. The beautiful statue arrived at the end of September, and we are thrilled to have it to provide comfort to those coming to worship Jesus in the Eucharist. It tells the story of the astounding faith of the Vietnamese people.

According to the documents of the Archbishop of Hue (1988): During the reign of King Canh Thinh (who ascended the throne in 1792), an edict banned religion. Some believers lived near Dinh Cat Hill (now the town of Hue) and had to find a place to hide. They took refuge in the mountains and forests of La Vang. In the sacred forest, through poisonous water, difficult circumstances, lack of food, illness, fear of military opposition, and fear of wild animals the believers entrusted themselves to God and the Virgin Mary. They often gathered together under the ancient banyan tree, praying together.

One day while praying the rosary together in honor of the Virgin Mary, they suddenly saw a beautiful woman, wearing a loose robe, holding the Baby Jesus, with two angels holding lamps on either side. They immediately recognized her as Mother Mary. She expressed kindness, affection, and comfort to the parishioners, encouraging them to endure hardship. She taught them to pick a type of leaf from a nearby tree, boil it in water, and drink it to heal any illnesses. She gave them a promise: whoever came to pray in this place, she would accept their prayer.

This event happened on the grass near the ancient banyan tree where parishioners were praying. After that, Mother Mary appeared many times to support and comfort her children in their tribulations.

Since then, the Virgin Mary has appeared in the mountains and forests of La Vang for generations, and many people sincerely believe in and come to pray through the intercession of the Virgin Mary. Our Lady of La Vang is often symbolized by a woman wearing a Vietnamese ao dai holding a child also wearing traditional Vietnamese clothing.

Although the apparition is not recognized by the Vatican, many popes have acknowledged the importance of the apparition of the Blessed Mother to the Vietnamese people, and Saint Pope John Paul II himself said of our Lady of La Vang, "...For two centuries [Our Lady's] message, still up to date, has been fervently welcomed in La Vang. Despite the great trials which have marked it in the course of its history, it has now become a national Marian center, which has been able to keep alive the tradition of pilgrimages. Many people, of all origins and all conditions, come here privately to entrust their troubles and hopes to their Mother in heaven. Bishops, priests, religious, and lay people like to find in her the welcoming presence of the One who gives them the courage to bear an admirable witness of Christian life in circumstances that are often difficult.

"I bless God who never abandons the people who seek him and who, with the motherly assistance of the Virgin Mary, continues to guide them, in days of happiness and of adversity. I hope that the faithful who will come here to pray to Our Lady of La Vang at

her shrine during this jubilee year and those who will invoke her in other places will find a new apostolic impetus for their Christian life and receive comfort and strength to face life's trials...."

Our Lady's presence at La Vang is held in high esteem throughout the Church, and even at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Northeast Washington, DC, a little chapel stands to honor the Mother of Jesus who came to the aid of the people of Vietnam. On both sides of the statue there, there are two glass mosaics that honor the many martyrs of Vietnam, some 130,000 to 300,000 men and women who were tortured and killed for their Catholic faith.

The story of the people of Vietnam is a story of unshakable faith despite outrageous suffering. According to the Vatican itself, "Vietnamese men currently make up 12 percent of the American seminary population with an approximate number of 450-500 Vietnamese priests in the US. There are still many new vocations in Vietnamese community because of the importance of the Catholic faith in their family life. Faith is the first priority for Vietnamese people. Bishop Dominic Luong, auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Orange and a Vietnam native says: The families take time to pray together every night, and they go to Mass together on Sundays. Sunday Mass attendance among Vietnamese Catholics is almost 90 percent."

At Saint Luke, there is a thriving and very faithful community of Vietnamese families who live their sacramental faith quietly but incredibly generously and humbly. This beautiful statue is a tribute to their love for Saint Luke and grows our own Marian devotion here in our parish family. It also represents their prayerful contribution to our Church and invites all of us to love Mary more deeply and richly.

Take a moment to stop by our Adoration Chapel and look at her tender face as she holds out to us the Savior who abides with us, and please pray for the Vietnamese people here and in their country who still suffer and witness to the power of His incredible love for the world.
