

FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, Saint Luke Family!

Wow. A year sure can fly by! There are only 31 days until Thanksgiving. Only 63 days until Christmas. I don't know about you, but it feels like I blinked, and the year is about to end.

As we move further and further into the end of the liturgical year, (Advent is the beginning of the new one), the readings - especially the Gospels - are going to draw us deeper and closer toward making a decision about how we are going to love Jesus. Back in August, we heard the Gospel where the Apostles were discussing how people felt about Jesus, and the Lord asks them **THE** question:

But you're the ones who KNOW ME. Who do YOU say that I am?

Peter's response is the only right answer.

Jesus, YOU are the Christ, the Son of the living God.

Last weekend, we heard how Jesus looked at a coin and said, "Does Caesar want your money? Then give him his due. **But...** give to God what has *HIS* image and likeness." In essence, Jesus is asking you to give <u>yourself</u> to God.

And here we are this weekend, and He's doubling down on it. He's saying, "Don't just give words to God... Give Him ALL of you."

This is taking the next big step in recognizing if we're going to say that we believe in God, then we are going to have to give ourselves away with the same lavish way He has loved us - forgiving with the same unfathomable mercy He has shown us - being willing to worship God with the same shocking selflessness that Jesus has modeled for us. A life like this has deep, soul-altering consequences. If Jesus is the Son of the Living God, and we believe it, then we are going to have to live, think, pray, and love

A WHOLE OTHER WAY.

If we believe that Jesus *is* the Christ, then we are going to have to live and give with the confidence that we <u>believe</u> it. Saints are made from this reality. Saints are the men and women who put in the time to show up, pray up, serve up, live up, and never give up. If we believe that He *is* the Lord, then we are going to have to move beyond fear, beyond anxiety, beyond worry and do the impossible - we're going to have to love Him without fear.

This crazier, greater love makes you like Maximillian Kolbe who stands up to Nazis in a concentration camp. It makes you like Damien of Molokai willing to step into illness and heartbreak to take care of those who have no one. It makes you like Carlo Acutis who reaches out across the internet to teach about the Eucharist and the power of God's mercy. It makes you like Clare of Assisi who stands up to mercenaries with the Lord in a ciborium. It makes you like Marie Rivier who stands up against animosity to the Faith in order to care for the poor and the vulnerable. It makes you like Gianna Molla as a loving wife and mother willing to sacrifice everything for your child. It makes you like Ignatius of Loyola leading others into prayer, into hard work and danger, and into trusting in God in ways the world is still unable to understand.

It will make you like the man or the woman you know down deep inside God is calling you to be. Regardless of the adversity - regardless of what others say - regardless of how much it's going to cost: love God with the lavish abandonment that says to the world, He <u>IS</u> the Christ, and


GOSPEL: Mt 22:34-40

WHY DO CATHOLICS CELEBRATE ALL SOULS DAY?

The commemoration of all the faithful departed is celebrated by the Church on November 2, or, if this falls on a Sunday or a solemnity, the feast is celebrated on November 3. The Office of the Dead must be recited by the clergy on this day, and all the Masses are to be of Requiem except one of the current feast, where this is of obligation.

The theological basis for the feast is the doctrine that the souls which, on departing from the body are not perfectly cleansed from venial sins, or have not fully atoned for past transgressions, are debarred from the Beatific Vision, and that the faithful on earth can help them by prayers, almsgiving and especially the sacrifice of the Mass.

In the early days of Christianity the names of the departed brethren were entered in the diptychs. Later, in the sixth century, it was customary in Benedictine monasteries to hold a commemoration of the deceased members at Whitsuntide. In Spain there was such a day on Saturday before Sexagesima or before Pentecost, at the time of Saint Isidore (d. 636). In Germany there existed (according to the testimony of Widukind, Abbot of Corvey, c.980) a time-honoured ceremony of praying to the dead on October 1. This was accepted and sanctified by the Church.

Saint Odilo of Cluny ordered that the commemoration of all the faithful departed be held annually in the monasteries of his congregation. From here, it spread among the other congregations of the Benedictines and among the Carthusians.

Of all the dioceses, Liège was the first to adopt it under Bishop Notger (d. 1008). It is then found in the martyrology of Saint Protadius of Besançon (1053-66). Bishop Otricus (1120-25) introduced it into Milan for October 15. In Spain, Portugal, and Latin America, priests say three Masses on this day. A similar concession for the entire world was asked of Pope Leo XIII; he would not grant the favour, but ordered a special Requiem on Sunday September 30, 1888.

In the Greek Rite this commemoration is held on the eve of Sexagesima Sunday, or on the eve of Pentecost. The Armenians celebrate the passover of the dead on the day after Easter.

Why We Pray For Those In Purgatory

Praying for the souls in Purgatory is one of the Spiritual Works of Mercy. These souls long for God but they need to be purified of their sins before they can enter Heaven. It is us, those on earth, who can pray for these souls. The dead need our prayers. It does not matter when a person died, recently or long ago in the past. Our prayers always help the dead.

As Catholics, we believe in the Communion Saints – those in Heaven, those in Purgatory, and those on Earth. All three groups are connected. The ones on earth have a responsibility and an obligation to pray for one another and for those in Purgatory. The Saints in Heaven are role models and intercessors for those on earth.

Prayer For Those In Purgatory -From the diary of St Faustina

Eternal Father, turn your merciful graze upon the souls suffering in Purgatory, who are enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. I beg you, by the sorrowful Passion of Jesus Your Son, and by all the bitterness with which His most sacred Soul was flooded, manifest Your mercy to the souls who are under Your just scrutiny. Look upon them in no other way than through the Wounds of Jesus, Your dearly beloved Son; for we firmly believe that there is no limit to Your goodness and compassion. Have mercy, O Lord, have mercy on the Poor Souls in Purgatory. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Prayer For All Souls (Missionaries of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary)

Dear God of Mercy, I pray this day for all souls, both known and unknown to me, who, although touched by death, have not yet entered Your Heavenly Kingdom. While they loved you in their lifetime, they failed in some way to attain the perfection Heaven demands. So in my love for them, I offer my prayers, my small works of mercy in the hope that Your mercy will flow to them and bring them to eternal peace with You.
