

Of all the words that the Lord uses to express His relationship with His people, *Bridegroom* is the most persistent. He refers to His faithfulness in terms of the love of a groom for his bride, or in painful times, our unfaithfulness in terms of the betrayal of a bride of her groom. The readings this week invite us to become the worthy bride awaiting the coming of the Bridegroom with a light in our hearts.

In the first reading, God calls us to see that Wisdom is the initial step to prudence, a virtue so necessary in relationships. In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that even in our death, God is faithful, and in the Gospel, Jesus tells us the parable of the bridesmaids - who like us - are caught sometimes unprepared to receive the Bridegroom when He comes.



Jesus wants a faithful, loving relationship with us. This week, take a look at the reading from the Book of Wisdom, and ask what you can do to prepare your heart for the coming of Jesus and to develop prudence in your daily decisions.

FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, Saint Luke Family!

Advent is fast approaching. When I was a kid, I used to look forward to the Christmas season — what little kid doesn't, right?! — but now, as St. Paul says, I have put aside the thoughts of childhood and look at the world and my life with the anticipation of a greater Christmas... the arrival of Christ in my heart, in my life, and, in His generosity, into my world. Don't skip Advent in your rush to Christmas — there's a lot to be learned in this beautiful season of ever-growing wisdom — and its reflection on prudence.

Prudence is an often overlooked virtue in the discernment process. Of the four cardinal virtues (prudence, temperance, fortitude, and justice), prudence is the one most often misunderstood. Prudence, according to the Catechism, is "the virtue that disposes practical reason to discern our true good in every circumstance and to choose the right means of achieving it" [CCC 1806]. Prudence is being aware of who you are and Whose you are, and choosing to make decisions about the best way to give what is due to God and what is due to others. In this day and age of "you be you," prudence is the better advice: "Be careful not to lose sight of how much God loves you and then choose the road that allows you to love others in the way He has loved you."

The parable in the Gospel this weekend reminds us that relationship takes work. If you're a wife or a husband, you know better than anyone how easy it is to get distracted from the focus of our lives. A husband or a wife can get lost in the weeds of "the project at work," or "the kids' sports," or "dinner at the in-laws," or "the mountain of bills or laundry," or "the football game," or "one more scroll through social media," or ... You only meant to spend an hour on whatever it was, and the next thing you know, it's been three weeks since you had a meaningful conversation together. The beautiful bride that made her groom cry because of her loveliness, now never gets seen past his game time with the guys. The groom whose gaze made his bride see her incredible worth, now can't get past her wall of screens. Sometimes, the biggest — and worst — decisions we make are the decisions that never get made at all.

Love gets lost when we lose focus.

Jesus says to us, "I am the Bridegroom." The Church is the Bride. What happens when the bride loses focus of her Bridegroom? Where is her identity, then? Where is her worthiness, then? The things we focus on are the things we value. We put our hearts, our minds, our strength, our souls on the things that we think are worthy, and if we're not careful — if we lose the virtue of prudence — we'll lose the light that guides us to the Lord — and the people — that will be the focus of our regrets as we lay on our deathbeds.

They say that home is where the heart is. But if we're doing it right, though, it should be, THE ONE in my home is where my heart should be. The bride in your home is where your heart should be. The groom in your home is where your heart should be.

The Bridegroom in our Church is where your heart should be.

The Lord waits patiently to be the center focus of our lives, He from Whom all good things come. Of all the things that make us a parish family, our worship should be the focus of everything we do on this campus. This Advent, dream of what this church ought to be — and who we ought to be as Church.

This Advent, welcome the Bridegroom home and discover the love that welcomes you here.



READING 1: Wis 6:12-16

Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her.

She hastens to make herself known in anticipation of their desire; whoever watches for her at dawn shall not be disappointed, for he shall find her sitting by his gate.

For taking thought of wisdom is the perfection of prudence, and whoever for her sake keeps vigil shall quickly be free from care; because she makes her own rounds, seeking those worthy of her, and graciously appears to them in the ways, and meets them with all solicitude.

READING 2: 1 Thes 4:13-18

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. A GUIDE TO GROWING IN GRATITUDE By Emily Jaminet

If you are like me, it is easy to forget how "God provides" if you are too focused on others' blessings. We live in a culture that incessantly prompts us to want more and more of what others have – and INSTANTLY!

Temptations are thrown in our path relentlessly and we are provided many opportunities to lose perspective on our blessings, to want more, and to forget that what the Lord has given us is more than adequate. As a Christian, living a life rooted in gratitude is essential to growing in our faith. For example, when we plug into the internet we need to be well aware of ourselves and our own deadly pitfalls that lead us to personal sin. How is it that in just a few short minutes we can lose our grounding and perspective? It is easy to fall quickly into being jealous of others' blessings whenever it is something we ourselves desire. We may find ourselves coveting, desiring, wanting, or believing that just maybe we SHOULD have those blessings ... possibly even have our neighbor's life! Keep your mind in a grateful and thankful mode and avoid these near occasions of sin.

IT IS EASY TO FALL QUICKLY INTO BEING JEALOUS OF OTHERS' BLESSINGS

Now more than ever, thanks to social media, we can view every single blessing of another person's life in a flash from vacations, talents, summer camps, family life, and even what others are cooking or eating out for dinner! Social media is a tool for sharing but also a dragon well worth taming so you are not tempted to become jealous of another's blessings. Keep a healthy perspective on your life and the life of others! Remember, life isn't perfect on the other side of the screen and, instead, learn to cultivate gratitude in your heart so you can discover true Christian joy.

SIMPLE STEPS TO GROW IN GRATITUDE!

Prayer impacts our perspective! If you are struggling with being grateful, take this matter to your prayer time! Ask the Lord for more graces to accept each moment of your life, as it is, and to overcome whatever is holding you back from being grateful.

SURROUND YOURSELF WITH PEOPLE WHO ARE GRATEFUL FOR LIFE

Gratitude is an important virtue and flows from humility. "If souls are humble, they will be moved to give thanks," St. Teresa of Ávila said. We need to overcome the desire to be "Pinterest-perfect" or to believe that this type of perfection will bring us happiness!

MATERIALISM FUELS OUR INGRATITUDE

Our culture and greed often lead us into a vicious circle of materialism: The more we get, the more we want. Materialism leads to the "give me" mindset in which "stuff" fills the void of our hearts. It is important to focus on the non-material world where we share our thanks with words of affirmation, kind deeds, and prayers of thanksgiving. This is especially true with raising children. In fact, we do not always need to "reward" them with things, but instead we can affirm them and their dignity as children of God. Consider praying before making a big purchase or a spontaneous one. Decide whether this item will bring me or my family lasting joy: Will it end up in the trash can within a week? Instead, reward with experiences,

be purposeful on how you express your love for others, and avoid the trap that materialism leads to happiness.

A MAJOR OBSTACLE TO BEING GRATEFUL OR GROWING IN THIS VIRTUE IS REFUSING TO FORGIVE

When we refuse to forgive it leads us to grow in hard-heartedness. Consider forgiving those who have hurt you or robbed you of your joy. Seek to mend that relationship. When we seek out to strengthen our relationships with others, we grow closer to Christ. In the meantime, we grow in gratitude.

WORRY AND ANXIETY CAN ALSO LEAD US AWAY FROM BEING GRATEFUL

There is a direct link between screen time and anxiety, especially with our teens. St. Paul says:

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7)

If we are anxious and stressed out, let us take a breather and unplug. Detach and spend some time in nature or go to Eucharistic Adoration for some restful quiet before Jesus.

Let us close with these powerful words by St. John Paul II: Remember the past with gratitude ... live the present with enthusiasm and ... look forward to the future with confidence. (Novo Millennio Ineunte, At the Beginning of the New Millennium, 1)

When we look to the past with gratitude it not only creates beautiful memories but helps us navigate our life.
