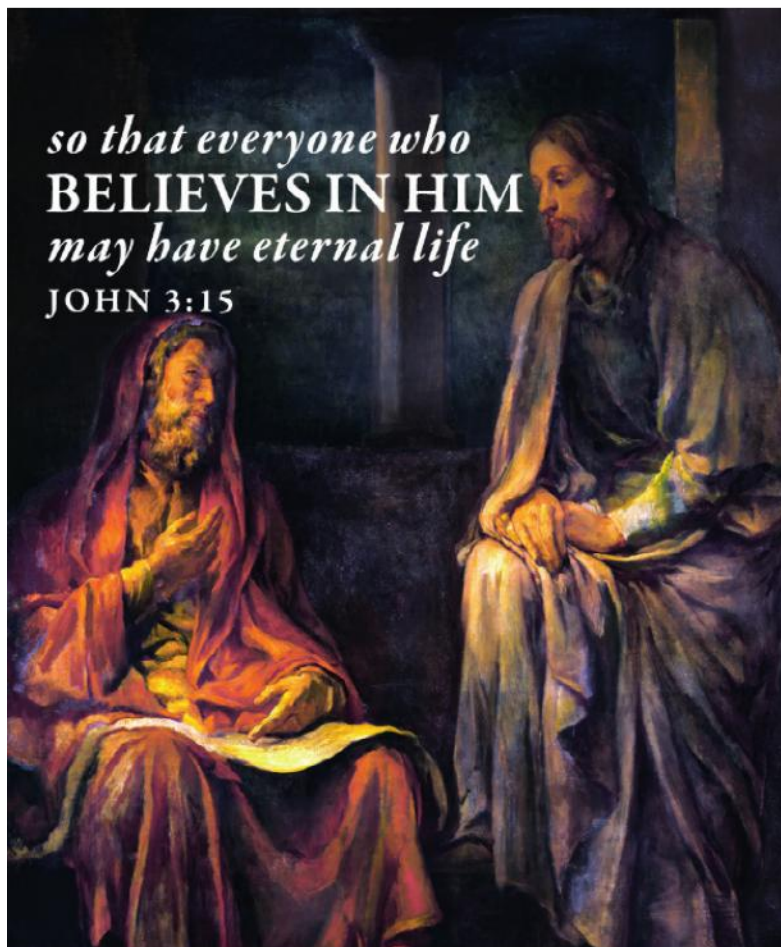

## 4th Sunday Lent

Football players. Motivational speakers. Everybody seems to be on the John 3:16 band wagon. But what is this popular Scripture really all about?

In the first reading this weekend, we are told how severe our bad decisions can be, and how often God has tried to get us to see that we're only wounding ourselves. In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that it's CHRIST who has come to give us a chance to try again - to be the people we wish we were. And in the Gospel, St. John makes clear what Christ has come to do for us: to give us a chance to try again, over and over if necessary - so that we might attain the eternal life and the eternal love for which we were created.



What mistakes have you made that come back to haunt you? What relationships do you have in tatters that need mercy - from you and for you? What things have you been hiding from God that just need to be brought to the light and given to Him for redeeming?

# FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, Saint Luke Family!

I'm not sure I can count how often I hear the words, "Father, I just feel like nothing will ever change..."

Marriages that feel like they will never be the love you hoped for. Children who seem to be unable to give the forgiveness and compassion they demand from their own parents. Friendships that always seem to be one sided and never as fulfilling for one of the friends. Failures that never seem forgotten. Habits that never seem to be "quittable."

Sins that seem to never be able to be overcome.

It would be so great if we could just have a "do over." If only we could just go back in time and live our lives over like our bad decisions never happened, right?

The Gospel this weekend is Christ saying that God hears us every single time we ache to undo the sorrow we made and has provided a means for us to try again. But... what we actually want is not to have a "do over." To have a "do over" would require for us to be erased. Our decisions have outcomes. The bad ones have often devastating outcomes in our lives and in the lives of others. But our good ones bless us and others, too. We are a mixture of great and not so great days. We do things that astound others for their selflessness and goodness — and we also do things that wound others because of our selfishness and indifference. YOU aren't what you've done — but what you've done has an impact on who you are now. Sometimes, our really great decisions get forgotten, and we lose sight of the good people we want to be. Sometimes, our really regrettable decisions are powerful reasons why we choose to make better decisions now. We can't stop being ourselves. The "do over" won't work - what we need is to become NEW PEOPLE who learn from the mistakes and the achievements of our pasts. We need to be "born again" — to be given a chance to start afresh, not once but at least 490 times. We need forgiveness that lasts so that we can take this amazing freedom for which we were created and be allowed to use it again to make the kind of decisions that we would like to make.

Jesus coming to us is a really powerful statement about God's insistence that you were meant to BE. He didn't just want you to be born. It's that He has it in His power to make sure that you — the YOU that He created you to be: selfless, humble, compassionate, honest, and very good — could simply BE, no matter how many times you need to try again...to give you a chance to try again over and over if necessary. You have been and always will be WANTED.

Saint Pope John Paul II said something at the 17th World Youth Day that I hope you'll keep close to your heart regardless of whether you are young or just young at heart:

*The Pope still fully identifies with your hopes and aspirations. Although I have lived through much darkness, under harsh totalitarian regimes, I have seen enough evidence to be unshakably convinced that no difficulty, no fear is so great that it can completely suffocate the hope that springs eternal in the hearts of the young. You are our hope, the young are our hope. Do not let that hope die! Stake your lives on it! We are not the sum of our weaknesses and failures; we are the sum of the Father's love for us and our real capacity to become the image of his Son.*

*I finish with a prayer. O Lord Jesus Christ, keep these young people in your love. Let them hear your voice and believe what you say, for you alone have the words of life. Teach them how to profess their faith, bestow their love, and impart their hope to others. Make them convincing witnesses to your Gospel in a world so much in need of your saving grace. Make them the new people of the Beatitudes, that they may be the salt of the earth and the light of the world at the beginning of the Third Christian Millennium! Mary, Mother of the Church, protect and guide these young men and women of the Twenty-first Century. Keep us all close to your maternal heart. Amen.*

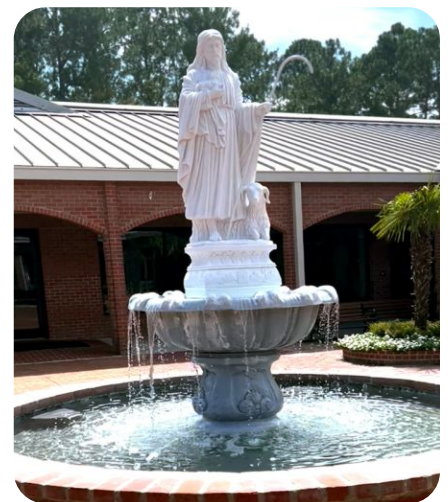

## READING 1: 2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem.

Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled."

In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

# LITURGY READINGS + MUSIC 4

## READING 2: Eph 2:4-10

Brothers and sisters: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ — by grace you have been saved —, raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

## GOSPEL: Jn 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus:  
“Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert,  
so must the Son of Man be lifted up,  
so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.”  
For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son,  
so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.  
For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world,  
but that the world might be saved through him.  
Whoever believes in him will not be condemned,  
but whoever does not believe has already been condemned,  
because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.  
And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world,  
but people preferred darkness to light,  
because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light,  
so that his works might not be exposed.  
But whoever lives the truth comes to the light,  
so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

## LENT

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection. During Lent, we seek Jesus in prayer by reading Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.
