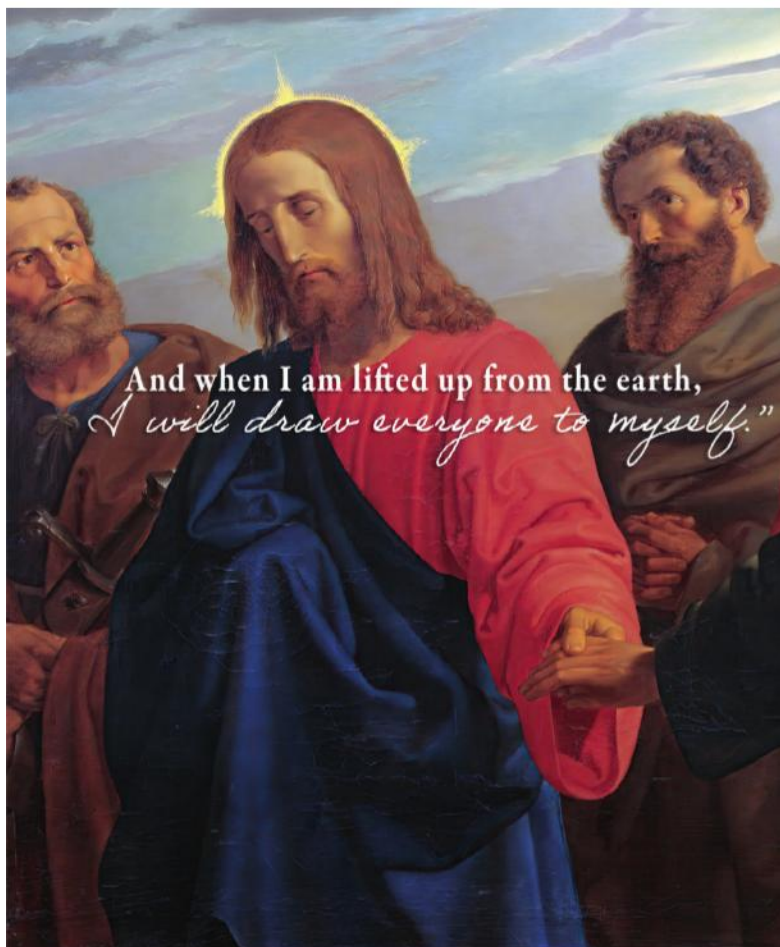

## 5th Sunday Lent

St. Thomas Aquinas once said that to love God is something greater than to just know Him, because it's in the loving Him that we come to really know how faithful He is and just how much He loves us.

In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah speaks about a covenant coming that will set the people of God free not because of written rules, but because of the love in their hearts. In the second reading, we are encouraged to follow the model of Jesus' faithful prayer and commitment to the Father. And in the Gospel, Jesus predicts the unimaginable love that exists in the Father, and the Son, and in the Holy Spirit to save us and give us reasons to hope and trust.



What do you hope God will do for you?  
What pain are you dealing with that God came to heal and use to bless the world? It's important to keep connected with God even when our hearts feel broken, because God is loving you even in the midst of all of this. How can you entrust your hope to Jesus and have confidence in His merciful love?

# FROM YOUR PASTOR 2

Hey, Saint Luke Family!

I sometimes meet with people whose whole world is collapsing. They feel as if God has left them. But in my heart, I **KNOW** God has not failed them. I **KNOW** that He is busy working on their behalf - healing, creating a new start, a fresh life, and forging a path forward for them. In the midst of their brokenness, it's just that they can't see that there will be new days with laughter, love, and friendship again. Jesus said that there is great reason to have hope, and He is trustworthy. I KNOW that.

But how are we supposed to just **KNOW**? Because Jesus is who He says He is. Throughout our lives, you and I have seen things happen that only God knew we needed. And on the other side of suffering, there lies a life full of goodness that is a testament to His holy Presence. We don't know what that future will be, but we know that it *will* be. The Lord is working things out for our good - ALL the things, good and bad - for our good just because He loves us. And He is worthy of our loving Him.

That confidence in Him doesn't come from our being naive about suffering. I know you've seen suffering in your own life. I've seen it all around me. My heart has been broken for families in this parish who have lost children and parents, who grieve broken relationships and painful breakups. But those people have also been the ones who witnessed to me that joy returns and peace happens on the other side of great sadness, if only we will trust that God won't abandon us now... and if only you and I will witness to those around us that what is broken now will, one day, glorify the Lord.

This is the Gospel that triples down on the selfless love that Jesus wants you and me to **KNOW** is ours and which demands of us a selfless love in return. Pay attention. When some reduce glory down to the events of Easter morning, they are avoiding the uncomfortable reality that Jesus breaks down for us in this weekend's Gospel: that the door into heaven is cruciform - it looks only like a cross and that's the only way in. Don't avoid the suffering: love like you have never known lies on the other side.

Next week, you and I will embark on a journey with Jesus down a bitter and painful road that passes through a fickle crowd cheering one minute on Palm Sunday and demanding His blood a few days later... It winds up in an upper room where He will say that there are crucial things we should do in memory of Him... out into the evening in the olive grove of Gethsemane where Jesus will allow Himself to be swept away by our pride, our anger, and our sins without fighting back... and up a grinding, excruciating, humiliating path carrying the burdens and the heartbreak of the world on His shoulders, all the way up to Golgotha, where He will lay down His life, forgive all of us, and say that the enmity between ourselves and God is finished. Don't lose hope in these days of Holy Week: it's true that Easter Morning lies ahead, but first, we have to remember what it took to get there.

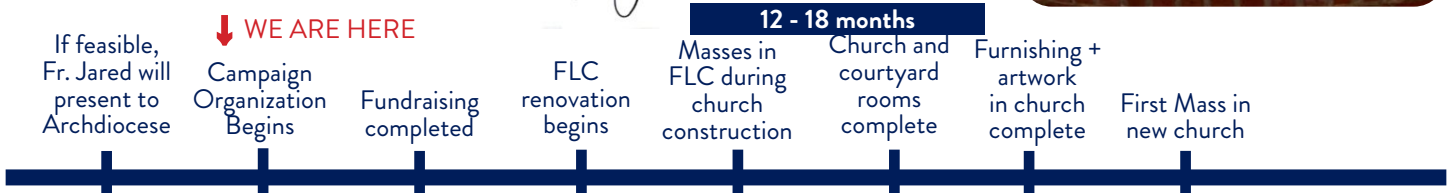
In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus tells us that HE **KNEW** all along what it would take to love us so that we would know that He loved us. I want you to read it over and over this weekend. Read it to your children. Read it to your parents. Read it to your spouse and your friends. This is the Gospel that should convince you how much you are worth. It's how you **KNOW** how much God loves you.

He is the One who forgives the sins of the world - and the One who rose from the dead to make our freedom permanent. He will lift us up. He will carry us on. He will cry with us, have pity for us, and love us right now, and tomorrow, and months from now, and years from now, and on our deathbeds.

I **KNOW** how much Jesus loves us. I hope in the days ahead, you will, too.

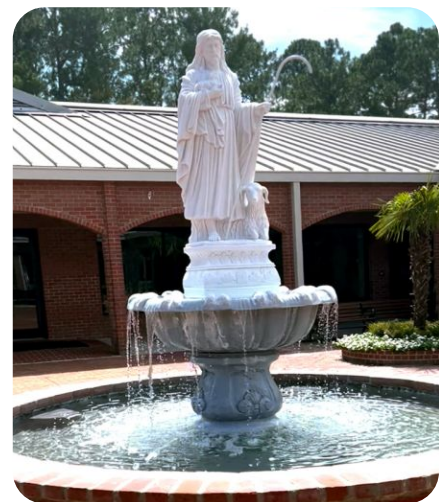

## LENT

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection. During Lent, we seek Jesus in prayer by reading Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.
