

FROM THE DESK OF Deacon Dan Laquet



As we hear in our first reading from Jeremiah, the themes of covenant that have been part of our scriptural journey this Lent are coming to a climax as we prepare to join with Jesus as he enters into Jerusalem. That journey will culminate in Jesus' passion, death, and Resurrection. The Lord God will reveal the promise of a new and perfect covenant, prepared for, and foreshadowed by the old covenants He made with His people. The new law given by Christ fulfills, refines, and surpasses the laws of the Old Testament, bringing them to perfection. This new law is directed at reforming the human heart, rather than providing written laws that must be followed. We still have God's commandments to guide us, but Jesus sums them up by telling us to love God with our all our mind, heart, and soul, and our neighbor as ourselves. We know from the covenantal

traditions in the Old Testament that every covenant must be sealed, and the most solemn ones were sealed with a blood sacrifice. Since Jesus is the fulfillment of the Father's promises and the new covenant by which He will perfect His previous ones, then what is the sacrifice required to seal such a covenant? Ultimately, it would be the suffering and death of Christ on the cross. Jesus makes this clear in John's Gospel reading this week, in which the main image is the necessity of wheat falling to the ground to die so that it might multiply into many stalks of wheat. The implications are clear, Jesus must go to the cross, die, and be raised again, so that we might receive the life of God's Kingdom. He is the paschal sacrifice that seals the new and eternal covenant. Jesus's divine and human nature exist together in unity. Jesus is the bringer of the covenant, and the symbol of its fruit. What Jesus is by nature, the Son of God, he invites us to become through grace, as adopted sons and daughters of God. This is why Sacred Scripture invites us to repent and be baptized through His Church. If we repent and surrender our lives to Jesus, and enter His covenant through Baptism, then His life takes root in us and helps conforms us to Him. We have an opportunity to be part of that dynamic of surrender, of dying and rising, every time we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass. Let us prepare ourselves then, so that when we say "Amen" before receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, it becomes an intentional submission. The total surrender of our hearts, minds, and entire lives to the one who died so that we might live free from the encumbrances of our sins.

Pope Francis has asked our parish to support the Pontifical Holy Land Collection which will be held on Good Friday. Your support helps the Church minister in parishes, provide Catholic schools and offer religious education to our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. The collection also helps to preserve the sacred shrines. In times of crisis, the Pontifical Holy Land Collection also provides humanitarian aid to refugees. When you contribute to the collection, you become an instrument of peace and join with Catholics around the world in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land. Please be generous.

#### LENTEN REGULATIONS

**PRAYER:** "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." -St. Therese of Lisieux (CCC 2558) During Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in prayer and reading Scripture, to service by giving alms, and to practice self-control through fasting. Dive into God's word in Scripture this Lent or pray the rosary with your family.

**FASTING:** Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 14 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

ALMSGIVING: The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2462). Particular Opportunities for Almsgiving during Lent: There are several special opportunities for almsgiving through donations to Church ministries for which collections are conducted during the Lenten season including: Collection for the Church in Central & Eastern Europe, National Black and Indian Mission Collection, Catholic Relief Services Collection, Pontifical Good Friday Collection for Care for Christians in the Holy Land, CRS Rice Bowl.


