FROM THE DESK OF FATHER STEVE

God in the Streets...

There is something unforgettable about a Corpus Christi procession, something ancient, yet alive. As a young altar server in a red cassock, I remember the weight of the moment: incense billowing, bells ringing, all of us moving with purpose through the streets of our small town. We weren't putting on a show. We were proclaiming something real. that Christ walks with us.

Every sacred object in the procession speaks. The monstrance, radiant and golden, doesn't just carry the Eucharist, it lifts high the Presence of Jesus Christ for all to see. The humeral veil reminds us that it is not the priest, but Christ who blesses. The cope, flowing like royal vesture, declares the majesty of the King. And when the priest covers his hands, it's not out of fear, but reverence, because no hand is worthy on its own to carry the King of Glory.

But perhaps the most powerful moment comes when we see hands reaching out, young and old, people of every walk and culture, reaching not to touch fabric, but like the woman in the Gospel, reaching in faith for Jesus Himself. In that moment, the Church walks as one body, clergy and laity, mystery and majesty, tradition and longing, all centered on Christ who walks with us, who is not far off, but near, in the monstrance, in our streets, and in our hearts.

One video I return to often is God in the Streets of New York City, filmed by Grassroots Films in 2009. It shows Jesus in the monstrance being processed through one of the busiest cities in the world, sirens wail, taxis honk, construction roars, and yet, right in the middle of it all, there is peace. Christ doesn't wait for silence or perfection. He walks straight into our chaos. The monstrance used in that video was one of six blessed by Pope John Paul II before his death for the Year of the Eucharist. That's no small footnote. It's a reminder that the Church sees this moment as a mission, to bring Christ out of the Church and into the world.

So I ask again: Where do you take Jesus? Do you leave Him behind with the hymnals and holy water, tucked safely into a Sunday routine, or do you carry Him out into the noisy, messy, beautiful world that desperately needs to see Him? Because here's the truth: Jesus is not content to stay hidden behind sanctuary walls. He didn't come to sit still. He came to walk, through our neighborhoods, into our homes, and across the thresholds of our ordinary lives. He wants to be carried into conversations where kindness is scarce. Into workplaces where integrity is tested. Into homes where patience runs thin. Into break rooms, hospital rooms, and classrooms. Into moments of joy and tears, hope and heartbreak.

And yes, even into traffic jams, grocery lines, and backyard barbecues. You, dear friend, are His living monstrance. If the gold and glass monstrance holds the Eucharist for the world to adore, then your life, your words, your compassion, your courage. holds Christ for the world to encounter. Not perfectly, not always gracefully, but faithfully. Let Him walk boldly.

Let Him be seen in you, not just in Church on Sunday, but in the street on Monday. Let Him be present in your hands when you serve, in your eyes when you look with mercy, and in your voice when you speak with love. The world doesn't just need to hear about Jesus. It needs to see Him, in you. Let the procession never end.
