My Dear People of God!

Beginning on May 7, 2025, the College of Cardinals will meet in conclave at the Sistine Chapel in Rome to elect the next Supreme Pontiff. Of course, we have been hearing much of about this in the news and we will hear more. For our own sake, we should pray for the College of Cardinals who are voting. In the meantime, we will continue to pray as a Parish Church for the Cardinals by praying an "Our Father," a "Hail Mary," and a "Glory Be" after each Mass for the Cardinals to listen to Voice of the Holy Spirit.

The Office of the Pope is critical office of the Church. The Office of the Pope finds in origins in the command that Jesus gave to Peter at the Last Supper. As we may recall, Jesus predicts the denial of Peter three times. Saint Peter protests, and then Jesus tells him that Peter will indeed deny him, but that "When [...]he] has turned back, [...]he] must strengthen [...his] brothers." (Luke 22: 32) The Office of the Papacy is to strengthen our faith or in other words to make us surer in saying "yes" to Jesus.

Our daily "yes" to the Lord is the critical choice that we must make each day. The example of the pope helps us in this by his actions and his teachings. Let us therefore pray that the Cardinals will listen to the Voice of the Holy Spirit so that they can elected a man who is able to strengthen our "yes" for Christ.




