My Dear People of God!

This weekend, the Diocese of Lake Charles acknowledges the 25th, 50th, 55th, 60th, 65th, and 70th Wedding Anniversaries from throughout the Diocese. At the 11:15 am Mass on Sunday, Bishop Provost will impart a special blessing on them. We give thanks to God for their example to us all as a sign of the faithful love of Jesus Christ for His Church. May God grant them many more years!

This Thursday, the Church celebrates the Feast of Saint Rita of Cascia who lived in the late 14th Century and the early 15th Century. She desired to become a nun even though her parents resisted it. She prayed for them anyway. She was married young to man who did not show her kindness. She prayed for him anyway. She had two sons who were ungrateful to her. She prayed for them anyway. After the death of her husband and sons, she attempted to enter a convent but was at first refused. She prayed anyway. She was eventually allowed to enter the religious life and despite of her fidelity was ignored and ridiculed. She prayed anyway. At the end of her life, her holiness and desire for peace was made evident. She was declared a saint and today is known as one of the patrons of impossible causes.

What made her the patron of impossible causes? It was her persistence in prayer. By her recognition that she did not have control over everything (or really anything), she entrusted herself fully to the only one who could do anything: Christ our Lord.

What is it that we are facing that has exhausted us? What are the things that we find impossible to face? Following the example of Saint Rita, let us entrust these things to God. For with God all things are possible (cf. Matthew 19: 26)!



DIOCESAN SHRINE OF OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA

PILGRIMAGE SITE

The Diocesan Shrine of Our Lady Star of the Sea is one of six local pilgrimage sites in the Diocese of Lake Charles for the Jubilee Year 2025. Make a pilgrimage or pious visit to gain a Plenary Indulgence during the Jubilee Year. For more information, visit [Icdiocese.org](http://www.lcdiocese.org) or scan the QR code.



Immediately following the Mass, a vehicle procession will travel to the Historic Shrine of Our Lady Star of the Sea, 135 Our Lady Road, in Cameron, where the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Loreto, blessings, and the Prayer for Protection during Hurricane Season will be recited.

Bishop Glen John Provost will be the celebrant of a votive "Mass to Avert Storms" on Friday, May 30, ahead of the 2025 Hurricane Season that begins on Sunday, June 1. The annual Mass will begin at 4:30 p.m. at Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish Life Center. The church hall is located at 5250 West Creole Highway, Cameron, LA 70631.

May 30 is also to be observed as a "Day of Prayer and Fasting" for safety in the Diocese of Lake Charles, asking the intercession of Our Lady Star of the Sea for protection from storms and destruction.

Immediately following, a vehicle procession will travel a short distance to the Historic Shrine of Our Lady Star of the Sea, 135 Our Lady Road, in Cameron, where the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Loreto, blessings, and the Prayer for Protection during Hurricane Season will be recited. The Shrine has been granted the privilege of inserting the invocation of "Star of the Sea" in the Litany.

The Shrine enjoys, with papal approval, the same spiritual privileges as would a pilgrimage to the Basilica of Saint Mary Major in Rome, one of the four major basilicas in the Eternal City. The pilgrimage provides a plenary indulgence with the fulfillment of certain requirements, including recent confession, reception of Holy Communion, prayers for the Holy Father, and the recitation of the Creed.

The Historic Shrine of Our Lady Star of the Sea is one of six local pilgrimage sites designated in the Diocese of Lake Charles for the Jubilee Year 2025. Even if you cannot attend the Mass to Avert Storms, this is a good opportunity to make a pilgrimage visit to the Shrine to gain a Plenary Indulgence during the Jubilee Year.
