My Dear People of God!

Next weekend, we welcome into the parish one of the diocesan seminarians who will be remaining with us for the summer. Cameron Fontenot is a seminarian for the Diocese of Lake Charles and is currently studying at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. We welcome him for his time in the Cathedral Parish!

This week the Church recalls the Saints Augustine of Canterbury and his companions. Leaving Rome in 595, Augustine went to England to begin a mission there. He focused on the King of Kent in Southeast England. Having successfully baptized the king in 597, Augustine was easily supported in the proclamation of the Gospel that led to England being a Christian country thereafter.

The example that Saint Augustine of Canterbury can give to us to begin the Christian journey in stages. We do not need to do everything all at once. Many times we look at a daunting task and it seems insurmountable. We should not despair. What is the one thing that I can focus on well today? That should be enough.

Saint Augustine must have looked at pagan England and seen it as overwhelming. He though did not let it stop him. He took it step by step, and then when the King of Kent converted, he had a platform to begin in the task of proclaiming the Gospel.

Following Saint Augustine's example, let us strive to do the one thing that we can do today well for Christ and through that see the wonders that Christ will then do for us!



ANNUAL MASS TO AVERT STORMS

Bishop Glen John Provost will be the celebrant of a votive "Mass to Avert Storms" on **Friday, May 30**, ahead of the 2025 Hurricane Season that begins on Sunday, June 1. The annual Mass will begin at 4:30 p.m. at Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish Life Center. The church hall is located at 5250 West Creole Highway, Cameron, LA 70631.

May 30 is also to be observed as a "Day of Prayer and Fasting" for safety in the Diocese of Lake Charles, asking the intercession of Our Lady Star of the Sea for protection from storms and destruction.

Immediately following, a vehicle procession will travel a short distance to the Historic Shrine of Our Lady Star of the Sea, 135 Our Lady Road, in Cameron, where the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Loreto, blessings, and the Prayer for Protection during Hurricane Season will be recited. The Shrine has been granted the privilege of inserting the invocation of "Star of the Sea" in the Litany.

The Shrine enjoys, with papal approval, the same spiritual privileges as would a pilgrimage to the Basilica of Saint Mary Major in Rome, one of the four major basilicas in the Eternal City. The pilgrimage provides a plenary indulgence with the fulfillment of certain requirements, including recent confession, reception of Holy Communion, prayers for the Holy Father, and the recitation of the Creed.

The Historic Shrine of Our Lady Star of the Sea is one of six local pilgrimage sites designated in the Diocese of Lake Charles for the Jubilee Year 2025. Even if you cannot attend the Mass to Avert Storms, this is a good opportunity to make a pilgrimage visit to the Shrine to gain a Plenary Indulgence during the Jubilee Year.
