My Dear People of God!

The Church celebrates the coming forth of the Holy Spirit on our Blessed Mother, the Apostles, and the disciples who were gathered in the upper room. Scripture tells us that there were about 120 persons gathered together (cf. Acts 1: 15). With the Descent of our Lord the Holy Spirit, the Apostles and disciples were filled with the courage to proclaim the Truth of Christ risen from the dead and how He is the Messiah who was foretold in the Jewish Testament. In our Cathedral Parish, we also celebrate today with the young men and women who will be confirmed at the 11:15 am Mass. Filled with His grace, may these young people have the courage to boldly proclaim to the world the reason for our hope as Christians: Jesus Christ, our Lord and God who has risen from the grave!

This courage has filled the hearts of each saint throughout the centuries. However, the perfect example of the one who received fully our Lord the Holy Spirit is our Blessed Mother. Tomorrow, June 9th, the Church will celebrate the Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church and of believers. This is a new feast day that was called for by the fathers of the Second Vatican Council. It is to take place on the Monday after Pentecost (the day after Pentecost) each year. It acknowledges that she who was quick to say yes to the Angel demonstrates for you and me the virtue of openness to the Holy Spirit.

Each time we pray the "Hail Mary," we are meditating on the invitation to Mary to become the source of the Gospel in the world. God chose to use human instruments. We are given that chance as well. Calling Mary the "Mother of the Church and all believers," the Second Vatican Council was teaching us that like her we were to be quick to saying yes to God.

This week, let us meditate on the "Hail Mary" and see in it an invitation to us as well. Like a good Mother, our Blessed Mother gives us the example that we are to follow. May our "yes" this week be quick so that like our Blessed Mother, God may use us to proclaim the Gospel to the world.
