Pastor's Corner

June 29, 2025
Solemnity of the Apostles
Peter and Paul



My Dear People of God!

Today, the Church celebrates the two chief apostles often called the princes of the apostles, Saints Peter and Paul. We are very familiar with their story, but their dedication to the spread of the Gospel makes them paramount to the history of the Church and the transmission of the Faith. We should be grateful to the Almighty for these two men who ensured that the world would know who Jesus Christ is.

Following their example, we should look at our own lives and ask if we have been faithful to the transmission of the Gospel. Unlike Peter, we may not be called to preach publicly before the peoples as he did on the first Pentecost, but do we boldly speak of Jesus in our own family giving witness to our joy and hope? Unlike Paul, we will not (hopefully) be arrested for our Faith, but are we quick to proclaim Jesus in good times and in bad times, when the crowds accept us or when we are thrown out of the city?

Until the 12th Century, most of the western Church called the period beginning with the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul until Advent began "The Season of the Apostles." Today, we call it Ordinary Time speaking of the numbering of weeks and days between the great Seasons of Easter and Advent. It is a good meditation for us this week to consider why the Church called this time the Season of the Apostles. The simple reason why is because we (you and I) as baptized Christians are called to be Apostolic and to announce Jesus in our families, among our friends, and in our occupation. Are we being Apostolic?

Today, Sunday, June 29, we also have a special celebration in our local Diocese. Bishop Provost celebrates his 50th Anniversary as a priest. Let us give thanks to God for his ministry for these 50 years and especially his time here as Bishop of Lake Charles. May God grant him many more years of service to the Church and the people of God!
