Dear Cathedral Parishioners,

I am not yet sure where I will be assigned as an Associate Pastor, but I am reminded of what Bishop Provost said at the beginning of his priestly ministry, "I put it all in the Lord's hands and let him do the rest." What great advice to follow! I too will strive to put it all in the Lord's hands and to let Him do the rest. God gives us the grace to cooperate with His will in all things. I am excited to see what this next chapter in my life will bring. I am ready to become configured to Christ the one true Eternal High Priest and to participate in His ministry and His work of redemption. Please keep me in your prayers as I will continue to pray for you all here at the Cathedral. This is a truly wonderful place with wonderful people. May the Lord continue to bless you all abundantly.
