My Dear People of God!

At all the Masses this weekend, we will hear about the Bishop's Services Appeal (BSA) that helps to fund the important ministries of the Diocese. The Bishop has chosen as a theme this year "I say a new heaven and a new earth" (Revelation 21: 1). In his message, the Bishop reminds you and me that we are called to cooperate with Jesus Christ for the building up of His Kingdom on earth. We are grateful for the varied ways this is done in the Diocese of Lake Charles. Two in particular are vital in my opinion: the retreat centers (Saint Charles Center for adults and Camp Karol for youth) and the ministry of the Tribunal that helps people in making their marriages regular. These are only two areas. There are many others.

I am asking that we all be generous again this year especially as we consider that our BSA Quota has increased because of the size of our congregation and the size of our collections. Since we have been generous already, I am sure that we can be again! Let's us do our part to help spread the Gospel and help Christ bring in a new heaven and a new earth!

As we continue to look at the Creed, this week, I would like to consider a unique line that seems strange sometimes: "...Light from Light..." In God there is no darkness, there is only light! But as Saint John wrote in the Prologue of his Gospel, people preferred darkness to light (cf. John 1: 11). Thus, in saying that Christ is Light from Light, we are professing that only through Christ will our lives begin to have any sense or meaning.

We all know the challenges that we face daily. However, to help give us meaning, purpose, and direction, Christ came into the world, the Incarnate Word of God, the Light from true Light, and the Way to the Father. Through Him, we have a new purpose and meaning that helps make sense of our daily trials.

Today, I would like to challenge us to look to Christ for our Light, our meaning, our truth. Looking forward to the Cross, we see the path that leads through the darkness of so much that we have endured. Through the Cross and the invitation of Christ we have the Light to see forward and the hope of the Resurrection that our Lord has shown us!
