My Dear People of God!

I will be leaving for vacation for the next two weeks returning on October 25<sup>th</sup>. Even though I will be gone, I will take you with me in my prayers and Masses that I will celebrate. Each week, the pastor of a parish must celebrate at least one Mass that is entitled *Pro Populo* (Latin for "for the people"). This is to ensure that your intentions are remembered at the Altar of God. Even on vacation, the pastor is still required to celebrate these Masses. I will be doing so, keeping you in my prayers each day. As the Catechism reminds us in speaking about the Mass intention at the Altar of God during the Eucharistic Sacrifice, the people of God are closer to each other than at any other moment because Christ is able to close the gaps of time and space and the other divisions that we create through sin and selfishness. Therefore, you will be with me at the Altar during those moments when I celebrate Mass for you, the Parishioners of the Cathedral, and in my daily prayers.

Last week, we considered the first reason that Pilate's name is mentioned in the Creed. This week, we will look at the second reason which is a reminder that Faith and politics do not make good bedfellows! Rather, Faith often makes the political atmosphere uncomfortable especially when it speaks of the Truth which is beyond the simple administration of fairness which is usually arbitrated by our laws. Faith and Truth points to eternal justice and everlasting life and desires a law that is based on it. In politics, we often fall short on this. We, as Christians, should never put our faith in politicians or systems. The mere observance of fairness cannot be the force that encapsulates our being. Otherwise, this mere observance of fairness (like the legalization of abortion or euthanasia or the enforcement of laws without consideration of human dignity) will fall short of faith. As a matter of principle, we should only have one label as Christians, and that is Christ and His Way. Beware of those who like to label themselves by political affiliation! Often times (although not always), it leads to the Pilate-effect who washed his hands of the matter. He was only keeping the law and doing what was fair. How often have we heard Christians who have entered the political sphere who say things like "Well, I am a Christian, but..." Everything after that usually gets us in trouble.

We should also keep our politicians in our daily prayers as well. As Saint Paul reminds us, we are to pray for our leaders (I Timothy 2: 1-4). We should not be harsh or trying to overthrow people. Christians are not earthly revolutionaries but like Christ we are called to recognize before Pilate and the world that our home is not of this world (John 18: 36). Our actions, lives, and duties are aimed toward that Kingdom to come where our true home lies.

This week, let us reflect on how we place our priorities. Do we place first the Kingdom of God and then allow all things to flow thereafter, or do we make the kingdom of earth our goal and wash our hands of things that violate our sense of fairness? As Christians, we can be good citizens of both heaven and earth, but this can only be done well if our vision lies on the one who the earth and its powers crucified and rejected. Let us look toward Christ who is our hope, our wisdom, and our love.




