Today, we as Catholics remember the souls of the faithful departed who are awaiting entry into heaven. It is critical for us to remember that life after death is not a static or stationary event. We are always moving as Christians. We are always growing. It is what it means to have life. In the eternal glory that is awaiting the blessed, we are called to grow in our relationship always with God. That is a very basic definition of heaven. For that reason, we can look at the idea of what we call Purgatory as the state of being in the place where we begin to put aside the distractions of various sins and imperfections so that our rapt attention may be focused on God. Through our prayers for those who have gone before in faith, we assist them much like we might cheer on our favorite team in a sporting event. We encourage them not to lose focus or to become distracted. Looking ahead, they continue to journey toward heaven.

The Word of God is living and effective and discern between things (cf. Hebrews 4:12). Our Lord's earthly Life then is the embodiment of the Scriptures in the Flesh.

For our part, do we live in accordance with Scriptures? Are we a testament of God in the world? According to legend, Saint Francis of Assisi said that we should preach the Gospel always but only use words when necessary. Many times, as Christians, we are the first and may be the only Gospel that people will see. Do we manifest the Truth of Christ in our lives?

Let us live the Word of God and not merely study it. He wants to live within us and move through us and direct our being. To Christ be all glory and honor always!

Children's Church: 11:15 AM Mass

The Cathedral's Catechesis (commonly called "Children's Church") for children who are 3 years of age through 2nd Grade, or its equivalent, is offered at the 11:15 am Mass (children must be potty trained!). The Catechesis is meant to help children better understand the Mass and the Scriptures. The catechists who are leading the program are Safe-Environment ("Safe and Sacred") Trained and use an approved text for the catechetical sessions.

Although confession will not be available before Mass, one can make a good confession eight days before or after with the intention of offering reparation for the offenses against Our Lady's Immaculate Heart, provided you are in the state of grace upon receiving Holy Communion.

Cathedral Altar Society...making a difference every day!

Our Cathedral Altar Society works to provide and care for all the things associated with our altar and sacristy needed to celebrate Mass. The Altar Society provides for our daily Masses, five weekend Masses, the St. Bernadette Chapel, the Seafarers Center, ICCS, St. Louis Catholic High School and our homebound parishioners.

The core mission of the Altar Society remains as it always has - provide and care for the bread, wine, vessels, linens, vestments, candles, flowers and anything else needed for the altar of worship.

They are the members (women and men) who volunteer to take home the linens and towels used at Mass for cleaning and pressing. They are the Sacristans who set up for Mass and take down after. They polish and clean the vessels, press and mend the vestments, water the plants, and more. Their "behind the scenes" involvement is often unnoticed but vital to our church parish.

Your yearly dues of \$25 per family, or contributions to our Altar Society, will guarantee that our Cathedral Parish will continue to have its needs provided.
