Pastor's Corner

December 21, 2025

My Dear People of God!



We are fast approaching the great Feast of Christmas, and as the school breaks begin, many people will be traveling. Let us remember in our prayers those that are travelling this week for Christmas. Please check the bulletin this weekend for the Mass times as Christmas is a Holy Day of Obligation.

As a reminder, we are excited that our school ICCS will be having Lessons and Carols a time of Scriptures and songs that help us to prepare for the Feast of Christmas. This will be taking place here at the Cathedral on Monday, December 22nd beginning at 5 pm.

This week, we move to the last section of the Creed as we begin to consider the Church and the nature of the Church. This part of the Creed is associated with the article of the Creed that is dedicated to the Holy Spirit. This is because the Church is the product of the Holy Spirit. In theology, the great writers of the Church often would speak of the processions of the Persons of the Blessed Trinity that reveals the truth of the one who sent that Person. For example, we know the Person of the Father because Christ the Son was proceeded into the world to proclaim the truth of the identity of the Father. Likewise, Christ told His disciples that the Holy Spirit would tell the world who He was and give the world understanding of Him. So with Pentecost and the procession of the Holy Spirit, the Church had a better understanding of the Son and was willing then to live and die for the truth that Jesus is God and the Second Person of the Trinity. With the arrival of the Holy Spirit in the world on Pentecost, we recognize that the Church has come into being. In fact, we call Pentecost the Birthday of the Church.

In that sense, we could say that the Church proceeds from the Holy Spirit and is meant to reveal to the world the power of the Spirit. From that point of view when the Church fathers composed the Creed as a statement of Faith, the Church was seen in light of the Holy Spirit.

As members of the Church, do we live the boldness of those who have been moved by the Holy Spirit? Do we still have the fire of grace that came to us when we were convinced of the Person of Christ? This Christmas, let us pray that the Holy Spirit might truly enlighten our hearts so that we might joyfully welcome again the Christ into our lives.

Cathedral Altar Society...making a difference every day!

Our Cathedral Altar Society works to provide and care for all the things associated with our altar and sacristy needed to celebrate Mass. The Altar Society provides for our daily Masses, five weekend Masses, the St. Bernadette Chapel, the Seafarers Center, ICCS, St. Louis Catholic High School and our homebound parishioners.

The core mission of the Altar Society remains as it always has - provide and care for the bread, wine, vessels, linens, vestments, candles, flowers and anything else needed for the altar of worship.

They are the members (women and men) who volunteer to take home the linens and towels used at Mass for cleaning and pressing. They are the Sacristans who set up for Mass and take down after. They polish and clean the vessels, press and mend the vestments, water the plants, and more. Their "behind the scenes" involvement is often unnoticed but vital to our church parish.

Your yearly dues of \$25 per family, or contributions to our Altar Society, will guarantee that our Cathedral Parish will continue to have its needs provided.
