My Dear People of God!



Merry Christmas! As with the most important feasts of the year, Christmas is not just one day. Each day for eight full days, the Church celebrates Christmas. On the Sunday that falls within those eight days, the Church celebrates as aspect of Christmas in the Holy Family. Remembering that Christ chose not to be born in isolation, we consider the context of the holy man Joseph and the highest honor of the entire human race, the Blessed Mother. With our Lord, their life in Nazareth can become a model for us to follow in our own lives and families. May the Holy Family pray for our families, especially those who may seem far from us.

Today also marks the end of the Jubilee Year in our Diocese. Pope Francis decreed that the Jubilee Year of 2025 would end in Rome on the Feast of the Epiphany, he also decreed that each diocese would close its own celebration of the Jubilee Year on the Feast of the Holy Family 2025.

This grace has been a unique time for us to consider the working of Christ and the grace that He has extended to us through the ministry of the Church. For that reason, we should be grateful.

This also leads to our further consideration of the Church in the Creed. In that we declare that the Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. These four distinctions or marks as we call them are found in the Church because of her origin and beginning. Since her beginnings were divine, she has these four marks that makes her known in the world.

There is a great mystery though. We know that individuals have not always lived to the fullness of call of the Church. The proof of this can simply be found by looking in the mirror. How often have we failed personally to make the Church known in way that shows the magnitude of God? Moreover, we know from history the faults that have been done especially by the leaders of the Church. This mystery though is more about the salvation that Christ offers to each of us rather than us personally as saviors.

Next week, we will look at the individual marks of the Church more deeply.

Cathedral Altar Society...making a difference every day!

Our Cathedral Altar Society works to provide and care for all the things associated with our altar and sacristy needed to celebrate Mass. The Altar Society provides for our daily Masses, five weekend Masses, the St. Bernadette Chapel, the Seafarers Center, ICCS, St. Louis Catholic High School and our homebound parishioners.

The core mission of the Altar Society remains as it always has - provide and care for the bread, wine, vessels, linens, vestments, candles, flowers and anything else needed for the altar of worship.

They are the members (women and men) who volunteer to take home the linens and towels used at Mass for cleaning and pressing. They are the Sacristans who set up for Mass and take down after. They polish and clean the vessels, press and mend the vestments, water the plants, and more. Their "behind the scenes" involvement is often unnoticed but vital to our church parish.

Your yearly dues of \$25 per family, or contributions to our Altar Society, will guarantee that our Cathedral Parish will continue to have its needs provided.
